# Oaths Revisited

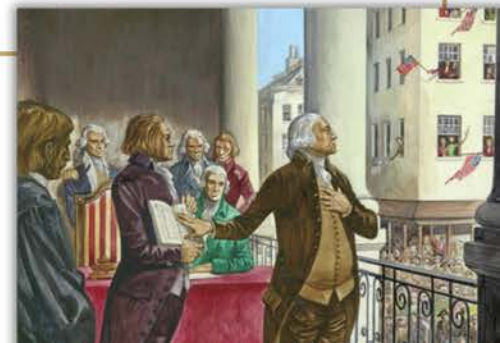
As early as 1738, objection was taken to an oath of secrecy taken on the Holy Bible. What is an oath or obligation?

The word “obligation” comes from the Latin word obligatio – a binding to, a tie. The same root “lig” is to be found in the words, ligament and religion. An obligation is more than an oath, it is more than a vow, it combines both. An obligation is a promise made solemnly and under the penalty or sanction of one’s religious belief.

Freemasons require oaths of secrecy.

An oath cannot be objectionable or open to criticism unless immoral; nor simply because it imposes secrecy, or the performance of a good action, or requires the person who takes it to refrain from something objectionable or obliges one to do something which is not forbidden by Divine or human law. Where the time, place and circumstances do not involve levity or profanity or crime, an oath of secrecy; or of obedience, or to be truthful, and calling on God to be a witness or to punish one for its violation is incapable by any perversion of Scripture or of reasoning to be regarded as criminal or immoral. Calling on God to witness is a recognized part of all oaths, and calling down God’s wrath for its violation is implied even if not expressed.

Oaths are as old as mankind and were used by pagans and barbarians to secure certainty in evidence or the performance of a pledge. Oaths were common in Old Testament times. In early England, from King Alfred to King Edward I, an oath of allegiance to the King was administered to every freeman every year. The King himself was sworn into office and afterwards all officers of the Crown and all judges and jurors. The world is held together today by oaths and obligations. All rulers and administrators, legislators, and executive officers of high and low degree in State and municipalities, and in every phase of human society are bound by their oaths of office. Without oaths the world would lapse into disorder, confusion, and anarchy.





## Oaths Revisited

In civil society we find that ties and obligations bind all men together. We speak of marriage bond or tie; all fraternal orders, good, bad, and indifferent are built on formal obligations as are all religious orders and societies. Baptism is a form of obligation and so are many Church ceremonies. If we ceased to administer oaths of obligations, society itself would be dissolved and, of course, all justice and right dealing.

The obligation in the Old Charge was very brief; there are several words and signs of a Freemason to be revealed to you which you will answer before God at the great and terrible Day of Judgement, you are to keep secret and not to reveal the same to any in the hearing of any person whatsoever but to the Masters and fellows of the said Society of Freemasons. So help me God. A Masonic obligation was originally taken "By the holy contents of this Book and Holy Church," or "So help me God and the holy contents of this Book."

**Word of the month: Vow.**

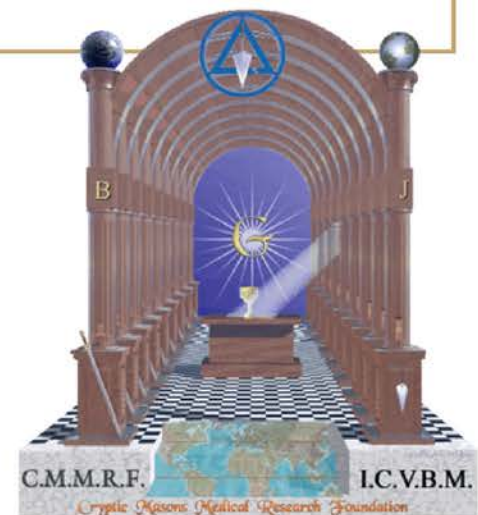

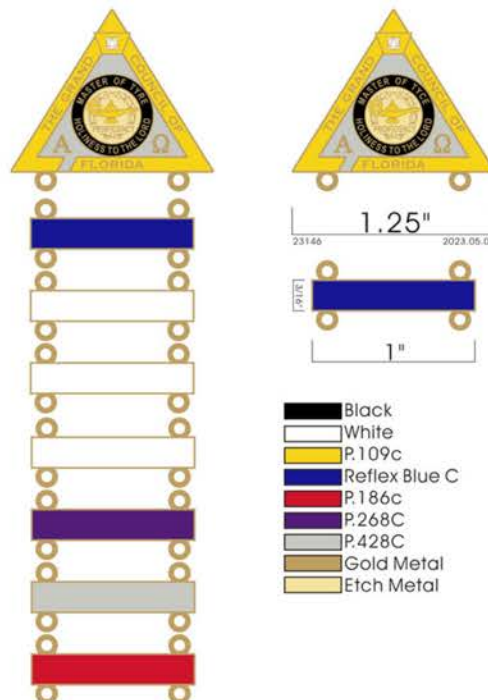


# Proficiency Cards

# Grand Council Awards



## *CRYPTIC MASON OF THE YEAR*

A nomination form should be completed and sent to the Grand Master by January 15th. The Grand Master will then select one of the nominations and forward it to the General Grand Council. This is awarded to one outstanding Cryptic Mason of the Year.

## *GENERAL GRAND COUNCIL YOUTH AWARD*

There is no form for this award. Nominations should be written to the Grand Master by January 15th. The Grand Master will select one and forward his selection to the General Grand Council. This award is intended for a member who has devoted time and energy in helping Masonic Youth Groups.

## *BROKEN TRIANGLE PLAQUE*

This award is decided by the Grand Recorder. The Council with the largest percentage of net gain in the past calendar year will win. There may be more than one winner if there is a tie.

## *GIBLIMITE PLAQUE:*

The District Deputy Grand Masters have a form for grading the Councils as to their proficiency and other factors in qualifying for this award. They will inspect the Councils and send their reports to the Grand Master for selection according to the points and recommendations. The first year of winning a plaques is given; then a plate for the plaque.

## *TEN PERCENT CERTIFICATES*

This award is decided by the General Grand Council to the Council or Councils with a ten percent or more net membership gain in the past calendar year. The Grand Recorder will provide this information to the General Grand Council.

## *ISH-SODI AWARD*

The Grand Master may present up to six awards per year. The Deputy Grand Master, the Grand Principal Conductor of Work, and/or Constituent Council Illustrious Masters may submit recommendations; but the Grand Master will make the selections. This award is for Companions who have exhibited a continuing willingness to devote their time and ability for the good of Cryptic Masonry. A draft recommendation form is provided.

## *WALTER I STEVENSON GRAND MASTER'S MEDAL*

This will be presented annually to the Companion selected by the Grand Master who has best demonstrated dedication to Cryptic Masonry.

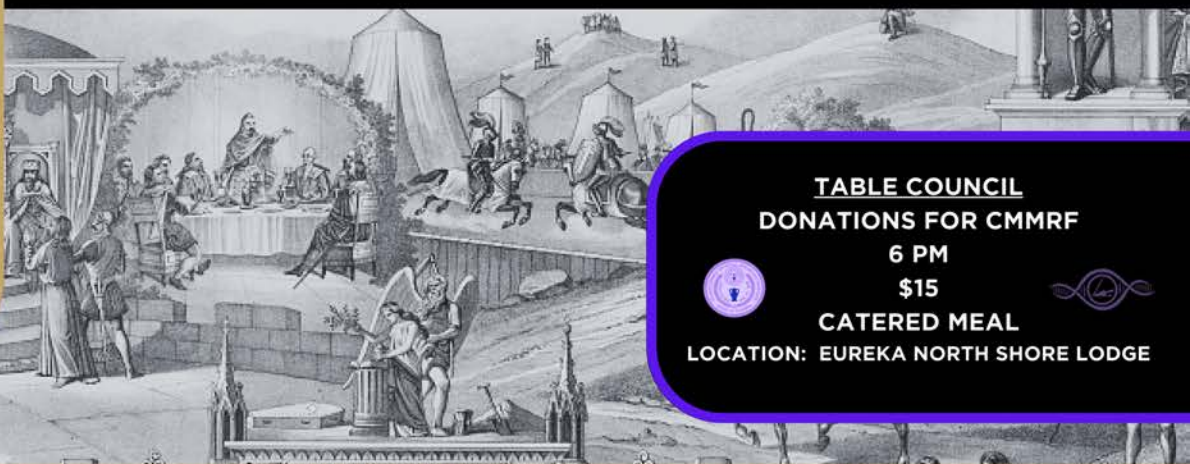
