

Final Report of the Grand High Priest for 2011-2012

#### **Opening Remarks**

To the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida, Grand Chapter Officers, District Deputy Grand High Priests, District Instructors, Past Grand High Priests, General Grand Chapter Officers, Distinguished Guests and Visitors, welcome to the 164th Annual Grand Convocation of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida being held on this 15<sup>th</sup> day of April 2010 in Lake Mary, Florida. I hope that each of you is having a very enjoyable time. It is my most ardent desire that today's Grand Convocation will be most informative, productive and that peace and harmony will prevail.

For those of our distinguished guests who have travelled to be here today we are honored to have you with us and trust that you will find your accommodations most satisfactory.

#### The Grand High Priest's Report

First, I would like to thank the companions for having the confidence to elect me as Grand High Priest, a servant of the Craft. I say a servant of the Craft, because ultimately it is you the Companions that are the reason for the success or failure of our Institution. You decide the legislation that passes or does not pass. You decide whether to use the programs available or to take another course. My duty as Grand High Priest is simply to steer the boat which each of you rows. I have endeavored to do this with integrity and honor.

One year ago at my installation I spoke of a five year plan, which each of your Grand line officers has participated in developing. One year later I am still speaking of this five year plan and hope that we will be speaking of it in future years. This plan was multi-facetted, but focused on some key points of improving our current situation. Ironically while following the plan laid down, each of these focal points can be seen as interconnected, and overlap with one another in many aspects. I will try to communicate the highlights of this plan and what we have done to accomplish our goals, but first I would like to talk about the administrative side of our Fraternity.

It was obvious with a new Grand Secretary and the logistics of moving the Grand York Rite Office that we would get off to a slow start with things that needed to be addressed administratively for our Grand Chapter. Now, with a full year under his belt I am sure that the Grand Secretary has become accustomed with the internal workings of our business side and will continue to improve our operations as he goes along. This can only improve the performance of future Grand High Priest's in the discharge of their duties. I would like to thank R.E. Dencel Smith for his persistence and perseverance, especially in the light of the loss of his Lady Ann, who also assisted him in the Grand York Rite Office. Her absence will be greatly felt by all, but I know particularly by our Grand Secretary.

Our Grand Treasurer with his years of experience and knowledge of the workings of our Grand Bodies was of considerable help in assisting the Grand Secretary and I know this knowledge and experience will continue to be a valuable asset as we strive to institute and develop office operation and procedural guide-lines as we move forward.

In the beginning of my term I issued three directives and two executive orders. One of those executive orders established a corporate board for the Grand Chapter. The intent of this executive order was to assist the Grand High Priest in making proper decisions with the movement of line item expenses. These line item changes were to be inevitable due to the initiation of new programs and no proper line items established to fill during the formation of the budget for this year. I am happy to say that in my opinion the corporate board, which consisted of R.E. Robert Kirkpatrick, R.E. Richard Foreman, M.E. Steven Q. Steel, R.E. David Aponte and myself as chairman, along with R.E. Dencel Smith as a non-voting member, performed this duty admirably. During the course of the year I have signed and seal twenty-seven warrants.

I have also signed and approved four by-law changes while two others were returned to the Chapters for clarification or to be placed into proper form, one of which has been returned and approved. Six dispensations where also approved by me, ranging from approving a table Chapter to relocating a Chapter, until the bylaws could be approved.

Unfortunately the Grand line was plagued by some unfortunate circumstances, which ultimately slowed us down. I received and accepted one resignation; several health issues and personal items essentially decimated the Grand line, District Deputies and Grand Chapter committees. I am proud to say even with all of these we still moved forward in a positive direction and accomplished many of the items within our plan. I would like at this time to publicly thank R.E. Robert Kirkpatrick for his steadfast dedication and help throughout the year. He was most appropriately the cornerstone of our endeavors this year and should he be elected I know that he will lead this Grand Chapter to another level of excellence. It is good to be King!

Returning to the objectives of our plan, it was unanimous among all the Grand Line Officers that we needed to improve our relationship with the Allied and Appendant bodies, but more especially with the Symbolic Lodges. Keeping this in mind I or my representative attended the Grand Lodge, White Shrine of Jerusalem, the Amaranth, the DeMolay, the Rainbow Girls and the Jobs Daughters, State-wide or Grand sessions during my term.

Due to an inherent history, commonality of ritual and administrative similarities, along with the consummate fact that our membership is derived from the Symbolic Lodges, the main focus of our endeavors culminated about the Master Mason and building a relationship with the afore mentioned. I am pleased to inform you that your Grand Chapter has been instrumental in helping to build and establish these relations. Our elected Dais Officers along with the elected Dais Officers of the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of Florida, the elected Officers of the Grand Council and Grand Commandery have held to date five meetings with only one agenda in mind, and that being, how can we improve our relationships and work together to improve Masonry as a whole throughout the State of Florida. These efforts have succeeded in welding a bond between the various Bodies and in no small part were due to the efforts of the Grand Lodge of Florida's Leadership and for that I extend a warm heartfelt thank you to M.W. J. Dick Martinez, R.W. Jim Harris, R.W. George Aladro, and R.W. Danny Griffith.

Continuing our own efforts we have established some new or revamped programs that we feel will continue to build this relationship on the local levels of our Fraternity. We have asked each Chapter to select Lodge representatives to act as a liaison between each of the Lodges, within their domain, and the Chapter. This year your Grand Chapter purchased a pin representing the year term of 2011 for every Worshipful Master in the State of Florida. The pin consists of the Masters Jewel and the year 2011. Each representative of the Chapter to the Lodge was asked to present these pins to that particular Worshipful Master. We have had great positive feedback on those that have been distributed; however we still have many of these pins still in our possession. Please see that this does not go undone, as is it just one more way for us to build that relationship.

We, your Grand Chapter have, also purchased Square and Compass pins, for the purpose of presenting these pins in open Lodge to newly Raised Master Masons. Once again where this has been actively pursued the feedback has been outstanding and by doing so we have just introduced a new Master Mason to the York Rite with a simple gesture.

The Pamphlet "A History of York Rite Masonry, A History and Handbook" by Frederick G. Speidel has recently been acquired by the Grand Chapter in large numbers to accompany the presentation of the before mentioned pins. These pamphlets, which sell for \$2.80 at Macoy's, \$1.50 from the Grand Encampment, are now available for the Craft through your Grand Chapter, at the cost of \$1.00. Presented to a new Master Mason it becomes a very

inexpensive marketing tool. Imagine the possibility of creating a Royal Arch Mason for a dollar, what type of return on your investment would that be?

While these are nice and help to gain recognition in the Lodges, let us remember that the Lodge Representative is first and foremost a liaison between the Chapter and the Lodge. He is to communicate back to the Chapter any assistance which the Chapter may render to the Lodges. I have stated at every District Meeting, "If we are there to help make them Masons, we have more potential members to choose from and if were are there to help when they become Master Masons, they will already know who we are and it will then be easier to make them Royal Arch Masons". I believe this to be true and if we do it the right way we will prosper greater than if we simply chase after our Brothers with petitions. We need to show them the quality of the Companions within our walls and do it by helping, aiding and assisting our local Symbolic Lodges.

A second and equally important aspect of the five year plan is a positive public awareness of Masonry. Once again the same statement as above applies here as well. This is the reason that I added another charity to our basket of fraternal benevolence and selected the Masonic Medical Research Laboratory as my special charity. Looking at MMRL it serves us two fold; first it places us in the public eye and secondly, it being the Grand Lodge Flagship charity once again helps us to cement that bond between the Lodge and the Chapter.

Let me make it perfectly clear that by no means was I attempting to replace our own Flagship Charity, Royal Arch Research Assistance. I have clearly stated on many occasions that MMRL was to be used with fundraising activities with the public and that the Companions should continue to support RARA in their usual manner. We were not looking to place a burden on our Chapters or Companions by requesting them to give to both. MMRL also due to specific State laws simply better lends itself to the solicitation of the public and what a shining example it is of showing the world "What Masons Do". I would wager that here in Florida everyone has either had Heart problems or knows somebody that has been affected by Heart Disease, so what more common ground can we then communicate with the public than MMRL.

As I wrap up my report I would like to offer some advice to the Grand Chapter Officers, be prepared and focus. You have simply to look and R.E. Kirkpatrick and myself or Ex. Companions John Alan and John Wermann to see how fast things can move. It takes more than one or two years to truly be prepared to fill this station, trust me. I realize that most of us are active throughout the Fraternity not only in several Masonic organizations, but also at many different levels. This is a good thing, but you must learn to focus your attention on the Grand Chapter, no matter what else you may be involved with, you are Grand Chapter Officers. The time for social advancement has long past, each and every one of us must carry a portion of the load, but it is particularly important or rather imperative that the Grand Chapter Officers, District Deputy Grand High Priests and District Instructors do more than a fair share, if we are going

to excel as an organization. Remember we are all servants of the Craft and our theme appropriately this year was to STEP-UP.

In closing there are many people to whom I owe thanks, but not enough paper or time to cover them all. I would be remiss however if I did not cover a special few: my wife of 25 years, Susan, who allowed me the opportunity to be with you all this year, my Masonic mother number three, Marge Wolf, who of her own accord and fondness for the fraternity filled in for my wife this year as my Lady, Most Worshipful And Most Excellent Michael A. Padron who appointed me to the bottom of the line and has helped me not only as my Chairman of Jurisprudence and mentor, but also as my friend, and R.E. Robert Kirkpatrick who has been there and toiled diligently in the quarries and who has a specially designated cell phone just for me. I know we have lost some esteemed Companions this year, but one was a very close personal friend and with your indulgence I would like to pay remembrance to M.E. James P. Rudman, my Brother, my Companion, but most of all, my friend. You will find him barking out orders in the long columns above, trust me. I would also like to thank M.I Howard Gardner and Right Eminent Chic Cicero. You would be hard pressed to find three more different men that have walked entirely different paths, but continued to all go in the same direction, all with one aim in view, and that being the pursuit of the betterment of the Fraternity. Gentlemen, thank you. Finally I would like to thank each and every one of you for without you there would be no Fraternity, which I love so dearly. Thank you and God Bless.

#### GRAND TREASURER'S PRELIMINARY REPORT YEAR 2010-2011

With this past year almost completed, and a new Grand Secretary/Recorder in place along with the transfer of the Grand York Rite office functions to Tallahassee, the financial status and reporting has continued to be refined and edited. The financial information going to the elected and appointed Grand line officers has been further tailored thus providing them with a more updated and accurate financial picture of the status of the craft.

This year with the relocation of the Grand York Rite office, the procedures for the receipt, safe keeping and reporting of the finances has been further defined in keeping with present accepted accounting practices for non-profit organizations. Also, a number of things that have been on the back burner where completed with this new move. Along with the M.I. Denny Smith and "Miss" Ann, we were able to finally get all constituent bodies fully and accurately on file with the Department of State, Division of Corporations and with the Internal Revenue Service. This was most critical with the IRS to prevent any of the constituent bodies from facing very stiff fines and penalties due to a lack of proper reporting.

The financial markets continued to improve this past year so that the Administrative and Life/Perpetual Investment accounts showed improvements in the bottom line; slowly regaining their positions prior to the collapse of the fall of 2008. We still are experiencing some difficulty in the accuracy of the Life/Perpetual accounts of the constituent bodies. One problem that existed is the lack of coordination between the Grand Secretary/Recorder and the Grand Treasurer. Since my election, the data that had been maintained by the Grand Treasurer is now shared with the Grand York Rite office. There still remains the lack of compatibility with these records and the general data base. Thus, when a companion dies, it is not being captured in the Life accounts data base and therefore the Life accounts remained skewed with deceased companions. This will be a priority for the upcoming fiscal year to bring these two bases on line to refine the payouts.

There were very few additions to the perpetual accounts this year. Constituent bodies need to vigorously pursue getting additional members to apply for perpetual membership. It is an untapped source of income to the constituent bodies. If we look at the total payouts for this year and exclude the Miami bodies, the average payout was \$198.77. While this figure is small to some of our constituent bodies, it would add a healthy bump in income for others.

Another priority for this coming year is in trying to get the Investment Committee to research and recommend to the craft an allocation formula for the Administrative account. Since its inception, the Investment Committee has been troubled with no continuity of membership, as per the regulations, and no clearly defined allocation formula for the Registered Investment Broker to follow to be able to make timely recommendations for our investments. We have suffered for this inaction several times when very good opportunities have been available, due to a cumbersome method of communication and authorization presently in place.

There needs to be a more clearly defined relationship between the Budget, Finance and Investment Committees. There remain doubts as to the real roll and function of these committees and their interactions.

Finally, I have already started he plan, along with M. I. Denny Smith, to develop a detailed Policy and Procedures manual for the day to day operations of the Grand York Rite office. My portion will, of course be on financial accounting.

I would like to thank the Craft for again electing me as your Grand Treasurer for the past year and will continue to serve in whatever capacity that I can to further the Grand York Rite of Florida.

The final report will be completed for the Proceedings inclusion after the close of the fiscal yhear to include the final balance sheet, income & expense statement, Administrative investment account statement and Life/Perpetual investment statement.

#### **GRAND SECRETARY'S REPORT**

Companions, I wish to thank each and everyone of you for electing me to serve our Grand York Rite as the Grand Secretary/Recorder. This is, and has been, an honor and obligation that I have not taken lightly. I was elected to serve as Grand Secretary/Recorder at the Grand Convention in April 2010. Anticipating that I might be elected, I had coordinated for space for the Grand Office in Tallahassee. After the Grand Convention and upon arrival back in Tallahassee, I immediately began to set up the office, coordinating for utilities, telephone, internet service and the transfer of data from Lake Placid to Tallahassee. ME Companion Steve Steele made two trips from Lake Placid to Tallahassee bringing equipment and files and assisted in getting the computers set up and operating. We owe him a big thank you for that effort. We still have some files and equipment in Lake Placid which we hope to get moved early in the coming year.

Fortunately, I was able to get my wife Ann C. Smith to assist me on a part time basis. She had a background in bookkeeping, budgets, office management, taxes, etc. She became an invaluable person as one of the first problems encountered was ensuring that all bodies throughout the state were in compliance with the IRS and State of Florida as far as the registering and filing of forms. Many of you got to be on a first name basis with Ms. Ann. She did outstanding job of getting most of you in good graces with the US Gov and the State of Florida

We set some priorities for the year and have been working within those goals. We were able to get a directory out to the craft. It had some mistakes, but at least we had a starting point. We planned to get the 2009-2010 proceedings out and on time, however, we missed the boat on that one. We are still working on them. Another priority was o bring the records of the various bodies in agreement with the Grand Sec/Rec's data base. Some of the bodies are very close at this time, some we are still working on.

We have worked very hard to do what you hired us to do and stay within the budget approved by you. I am happy to report that overall we are under budget. I have spoken with our Landlord and do not anticipate any outstanding increases in either rent or utilities.

As most of you know, Ms. Ann became ill in November and became progressively worse through December and January. The Supreme Architect of us all called her home on February 9, 2011. I, as well as the rest of my family and many of you, have suffered a great loss. I thank you for your kind thoughts, cards and prayers during this time of grief.

I like to express my heartfelt thanks and appreciation to the Grand York Rite Ladies for their actions in recognizing and paying tribute to Ms Ann C. Smith by donating their proceeds from the various activities at the convention to the three charities in the name of Ms. Ann C. Smith, thank you Sister Ellen Wylie and all the other Ladies.

I would publicly like to thank my sister-in-law, Ms Maybelle Montford, who has been helping me in the office. She is very capable and has done an outstanding job organizing things and keeping me on track.

#### **GRAND HISTORIAN'S LECTURE**

Grand Historians Lecture for 2009/2010
"1812 and the Hero"

For the want of a nail, the shoe was lost, For the want of a shoe the horse was lost, For the want of a horse the general was lost, For the want of a general the battle was lost.

At one time in the history of the United States, General Andrew Jackson of Tennessee was honored above all other living men. There was also a time when the date of January 08th was of great importance. For about fifty years it was celebrated with the same zeal as the 4th of July. But, for some reason by the end of the American Civil War in 1865, the magnitude of the date had diminished. The event that took place in 1815 during the War of 1812 left one man with the perpetual title of "the Hero of New Orleans." The victory was directly responsible for placing a once-poor, wretchedly educated orphan boy into the White House. Jackson had none of the qualifications of his presidential predecessors. It was said that the only thing he excelled at was killing. He killed Indians, Spanish, and of course the British. As one woman in Salisbury, North Carolina, exclaimed on hearing of Jackson's nomination, "What! Jackson up for the President? Jackson? Andrew Jackson? The Jackson that used to live in Salisbury? Well if Andrew Jackson can be President, anybody can!"

The Battle of New Orleans possessed all the ingredients of a grand Hollywood epic film. It had a home-grown, popular military hero nicknamed "Old Hickory;" a ragtag militia of regular and citizen soldiers that included frontiersmen, Creoles, Indian sharpshooters, free blacks, the people of New Orleans, and the notorious pirate Jean Lafitte and his renegade banditti. Arrayed against them were the mighty British Navy and the most elite regiments of the Duke of Wellington's victorious army, fresh from their defeat of Napoleon at Waterloo.

It should have been a rout, this unequal battle between some 8,000 British regulars supremely confident of crushing all opposition in their path and Andrew Jackson's bizarre group of defenders, whose numbers were barely half that of their enemy. Fought in the most unlikely of places, the Battle of New Orleans actually took place on the Plains of Chalmette, approximately ten miles south of New Orleans on the east bank of the Mississippi River. The British expected to punch their way straight north to New Orleans, collect the "Beauty and Booty" that awaited them, and then head up the Mississippi Valley to join with British troops coming from Canada, effectively slicing the United States in two.

The attacking force consisted of disciplined regulars of the British army including the Royal Fusiliers, Highlanders, Light Infantry, Light Dragoons, a West Indian regiment, and sailors from the fleet anchored in the Gulf of Mexico. It should be noted that when the War of 1812 began, the U.S. Navy consisted of seventeen oceangoing ships while the British fleet numbered seven hundred.

The U.S. acquired New Orleans as part of the Louisiana Purchase from France in 1803. The population was largely composed of Creoles and Blacks. When Andrew Jackson learned of the British intention to seize New Orleans, he responded by thundering, "I will smash them, so help me God!" The Louisiana ladies did not share in Jackson's confidence and decided to take no chances. They armed themselves with daggers instead of scissors. They had recently seen Jackson's vaunted "Dirty Shirt" Tennesseans under General John Coffee's command, and they had serious doubts about the ability of these men to stand up to British regulars. There was absolutely nothing military-looking about them. They wore woolen hunting shirts of "dark or dingy color" and "copperas-dyed pantaloons," both made at home by wives, mothers, and sisters; with slouching wool hats made of raccoon and fox skins and belts of untanned deer skin, into which they stuck hunting knives and tomahawks. Their long, unkempt hair and bewhiskered faces might scare a Creole lady but hardly the troops of His Majesty's army. But what the ladies did not know was that most of these men could bring down a squirrel from the highest tree with a single rifle shot. Their many years living in the Tennessee wilderness had made them expert marksmen, and their many months of military service, in fighting Indians under the command of Generals Coffee and Jackson, had converted them into disciplined soldiers.

On December 24, 1814, Jackson set up his army behind an old millrace called the Rodriguez Canal between the Macarty and Chalmette plantations. It was a ditch four feet deep and ten feet wide that ran at a right angle from the east bank of the Mississippi into a thick and almost impenetrable cypress swamp. Jackson chose this position because it provided the narrowest front between the river and the swamp, and made an excellent barrier to defend against an advancing enemy. Immediately work began on widening and deepening the canal, and building a rampart from the mud and debris dredged out of the bottom of the ditch. Over the next several days, the soldiers erected an earthen rampart, and installed twenty-four artillery pieces at regular intervals. The men competed to see which group could build the highest mound in front of their position. Jackson rode his horse among the troops as the work was being done, and assured them by saying, "Here we shall plant our stakes, and not abandon them until we drive these red-coat rascals into the river, or the swamp." Overall the Jackson line ran about three-quarters of a mile.

In the early morning of January 8th, British Lieutenant General Edward Pakenham ordered a twopronged assault against Jackson's position: a small force on the west bank of the Mississippi and the main attack in three columns directly against the earthworks manned by the vast majority of the American troops.

Preparations for the attack had foundered early, as a canal being dug by Admiral Cochrane's sailors collapsed, and the dam made to divert the flow of the river into the canal failed leaving the sailors to drag the boats of Col. William Thornton's west bank assault force through deep mud, and left the force starting off just before daybreak, 12 hours late.

Lt-Col. Thomas Mullins, the British commander of the 44th Regiment of Foot, was a particularly incompetent officer. The Forty-fourth was ordered out in advance of the main column commanded by Major General Samuel Gibbs. They were instructed to carry fascines and ladders with them. The fascines were bundles of sugar cane to be thrown into the ditch in front of Jackson's line to fill it up. The sixteen ladders assigned for the operation were needed to scale the rampart. The fascines and ladders had to be in place in order for the advance to move forward smoothly once the attack began. The Forty-fourth Regiment moved rapidly but quietly. They were almost in position when they realized their blunder. They had forgotten the fascines and ladders! A quicktime to the rear was ordered to retrieve them. Then a frantic race to get back into position before the signal to attack. But it was too late. The battle had commenced.

The attack began under darkness and a heavy fog, but as the British neared the center of the Jackson line, the fog lifted exposing them to horrific artillery fire. Most of the senior officers were killed or wounded, including General Gibbs, killed leading the main attack column on the right, and Colonel Robert Rennie leading a detachment of light companies on the left by the river. Possibly, because of Thornton's delay in crossing the river and the withering fire that might hit them from the artillery across the river, the 93rd Highlanders were ordered to leave General John Keane's assault column advancing along the river, and move across the open field to join the main force on the right of the field. Keane fell wounded as he crossed the field with the 93rd. Rennie's men managed to attack and overrun an American advance redoubt next to the river, but without reinforcements they could neither hold the position, nor successfully storm the main American line behind. Within minutes, the American 7th Infantry arrived, moved forward, and fired upon the British in the captured redoubt. Within half an hour, Rennie and most of his men were dead. In the main attack on the right, the British infantrymen either flung themselves to the ground, huddled in the canal, or were moved down by a combination of musket fire and grapeshot from the Americans. A handful made it to the top of the parapet on the right, but were either killed or captured. The 95th Rifles had advanced in open skirmish order ahead of the main assault force, and were concealed in the ditch below the parapet, unable to advance further without support.

The two large main assaults on the American position were repulsed. Pakenham was fatally wounded by grapeshot fired from the earthworks. With most of the senior officers dead or wounded, the British soldiers, with no orders to advance further or retreat, stood out in the open and were shot apart with grapeshot from the Jackson artillery. After about 20 more minutes of bloodletting, Major General John Lambert assumed command and eventually ordered a withdrawal. Several Americans rushed onto the field to take captives. One Tennessean came upon a slightly wounded British officer and demanded his surrender. The officer looked at his dirty, unkempt, wild-eyed captor with contempt. Surrender to such a person? Never. He disregarded the call and kept walking toward his own lines. "Halt, Mr. Red Coat," the dirty shirt cried out, as he drew a bead on the officer. "One more step and I'll drill a hole through your leather." The officer froze in his tracks, turned around, and with a look of profound resignation said, "What a disgrace for a British officer to have to surrender to a chimney-sweep!"

The bodies of several of the slain British officers, including Generals Pakenham, Gibbs, and Colonel Rennie, were reportedly disemboweled and the cadavers encased in casks of rum to be shipped back to England for interment.

The Battle of New Orleans was one of the great turning points in American history. It was America's first great military victory and a defining moment for the nation. National pride hadn't been this high since Washington destroyed the British at Yorktown. In a single stroke, Old Hickory had established himself as one of America's greatest generals and the savior of the nation. One newspaper proclaimed: "Who would not be an American? Long live the Republic!" Companions, thank you for your attention.

# AUDIT COMMITTEE REPORT 2009-2010

After the resignation of the Grand scribe as the Audit Committees Chair, the Grand Captain of the Host was to assume the chairmanship. However, due to severe illness he was not able to assume the function.

On September 27, 2010 Most Excellent Grand High Priest Anthony Marotta appointed Companion John F. Wermann as the Committee Chairman. The Audit Committee was composed of John F. Wermann, Chairman, Companion Casey A. Fletcher and William F. Wylie, MEPGHP. The Audit Committee's report should have been completed by September 1, 2010 (See Audit Committee Report dated March 10. 2007).

The Committee reviewed the Grand Chapters financial reports. Various information and copies of warrants were requested from and queries made to the Grand Treasurer. A few responses were received. The Committee was assured that all bank accounts were reconciled and that all tax filings were submitted timely. Otherwise, the Audit Committee cannot come to a conclusion due to insufficient information received. The Audit is incomplete and the Committee has ceased inquiry.

The Committee's recommendations are as follows:

- A.) Audit should begin as soon as York Rite Financial Year is closed, including all convention costs.
- B.) Audit to be completed by September1st each year.
- C.) The Grand Treasurer to be directed to compile the financial records in electronic format to facilitate timely communication.
- D.) The amount of permanently and temporarily restricted assets and fund balances be presented on the face of the financial reports.

It is the opinion of the Audit Committee that the Grand Chapter's working capital position to be adequate and sufficient for the 2010-2011 fiscal year's operations. The Committee also notes that no audit report has been submitted for the year 2008-09, that this year 2009-10 is incomplete. (This statement was amended however and should be stricken).

The Committee extends its appreciation and thanks to M.E. Darryl D'Angina, MEPGHP for his efforts, information and records he provided the Audit Committee.

## Charters, Dispensations and By Laws Committee

#### COMMITTEE ON WORK

The Committee on Work had a somewhat turbulent year. The Chairman resigned around the end of 2010, and most of the rest of the original committee dissolved. The new committee came on line at the start of 2011. Thus the continuity suffered.

There are, however, good and important things to report. Progress was made in the Chapter Ritual Competition and in the creation of proficiency cards. Other Committee on Work business was about as usual.

The Ritual Competition is a great initiative of MEGHP Marotta. It is designed to stimulate interest and improvement in the opening and closing of Chapters, and it did create a lot of interest around the state. However, given the discontinuity of the Committee of Work and the timing of the various levels of competition, only a few Chapters pursued it to the point of actually being examined. Nevertheless, a champion was identified and a plaque presented to the most proficient cadre of Chapter officers in the Grand Jurisdiction.

The Committee would at this time like to express its profound and grateful thanks to Companion Gerald E. Goacher, Sarasota Chapter No. 35 for the gigantic job he did in propounding the rules and instructions about how the completion should be conducted. He also promulgated the scoring sheets, one for the ritual and one for the floor work. It was a formidable task that Companion Goacher undertook, and he did a most praiseworthy job of dealing with it.

Although the Grand Chapter authorized and ordered the creation of a series of cards that would be awarded for various levels or kinds of proficiency in Chapter ritual work, there were no guidelines for the design of or the wording for the cards, except that they would be white and have red stripes. The chairman of the Committee on Work for the past two years asked for suggestions and ideas from the Committee members and others, but to no avail.

This year the Committee on Work expresses its heartfelt thanks to Jeff A. Baxter, REDDGHP of District 9, for the design he came up with at the request if the chairman. So far, only the card for proficiency in opening and closing a Chapter exists. When the Committee on Work gets some feedback on any alteration on wording and design, the other proficiency cards will be forthcoming.

The Committee is pleased to report that there were ten Royal Arch Masons who stood for the exam, and did an excellent job. They are John L. Horne, Jr., Manatee River Chapter No. 18; Robert C. St. John and Scott McAlister, Tampa-Cushing Chapter No. 3; J. Michael Hartman, Mon roe Chapter No. 15; William P. Goldwire, Charles E. Middleton, and Allen E Yarborough, Nassau Chapter No. 49; David E. Bailey, Jr. Freddie C. Briggs, Jr. and Edward E. Bush, Mt. Horeb Chapter No. 6. This is a great start to our proficiency card program, and we think it will only get bigger and better.

We are most pleased that the proficiency card program has at last been instituted. We thank all who participated in the learning of the ritual work and all those who judged their proficiency.

The schools of instruction went about as usual. Some District instructors reported good response, good attendance and good results. Others reported varying degrees of woe, from having trouble scheduling because of other Masonic meetings to poor attendance, to attendance by older and experienced Royal Arch Masons instead of the younger and less experienced ones the schools are for, to no attendance at all. Despite differing approaches and innovations to solving such problems, the results were pretty much as they have been in recent years.

The Committee of Work strongly recommends the following:

 The schedule for the various levels of the competition in opening and closing a chapter should be moved back so that the final level of competition would occur in late November or early December. This would give the officers a full year to polish their performance. The March deadline puts the onus on newly installed officers, some of whom belong to chapters that meet only every three months. This recommendation was unanimously supported by the District Instructors and Committee members.

- 2. The Committee also recommends that the final competition not be held at the Grand Convention, but at a site or sites agreed upon by the judges and the competitors. As it is now, the finalists have to be at the Grand Convention; there may be many who cannot afford such a trip, in terms of time or money. Also, it is even now extremely difficult to schedule anything at our Grand York Rite, and this would take a lot of time.
- The Committee recommends that District Instructors mail a letter explaining the time table of this competition as soon as they are installed, then pursue it to the utmost.
- 4. The Committee recommends that the proficiency card program continue and be expanded. There is also a need for a procedure manual, such as the one Companion Goacher produced for the Chapter Ritual Competition.

This report will conclude by thanking the Grand High Priest for his determination in instituting the Ritual Competition and for getting the proficiency card program started. Both are important, and will surely help in improving our ritual work.

The Committee members also thank the Grand High priest for the privilege of serving on this interesting and important committee. Despite a difficult and late beginning, good work has been done and progress made.

#### CUSTODIAN OF RITUALISTIC MATERIAL

As custodian of Ritualistic Materials it is my responsibility to account for the Ritualistic Materials held by each Chapter. Sadly I must report, as my predecessor had last year, that very few are in possession of the required materials.

In our Ceremony of Installation, as the High Priest, King and Scribe receive their individual charges of duties of their office one of these import charges is to be presented with their own copy of Appendix "D" of the Constitution and Regulations on the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida. They are instructed to study and inform their Companions of the information contained their-in. They are also presented with the "Book of Essentials" and a copy of the "Key Lecture". The secretary of each Chapter is to keep control of these books receiving a signed receipt for same when distributed to the elected officers.

This Committee contacted all Chapters in Florida on more than one occasion, requesting the inventory of "Ritualistic Materials' including numbers assigned to each book. By the lack of response, I can only assume that: A.) these materials have either not been distributed, or B.) They have been distributed but with no signed receipts retained thus over the years these books have been lost. I have been informed that new books have been requested and received by several Chapters. However, these books did not have the have inventory numbers assigned to them thus have not been tracked as required.

Only 27% of all the Chapters throughout the State of Florida have responded to the requested information. Of the respondents there were only 18 numbered books accounted for out of 111 that should be in circulation and being tracked. One Chapter did respond that they did have the books, however, they are kept by the Secretary.

Last years Committee recommended that the Grand Secretary be instructed to obtain a sufficient number of these important materials and have them distributed to each Chapter. It is further recommended that each Chapter be required to give an accounting of these materials as part of their year end reports. The chairman of this committee at this point could with the assistance of the Grand Secretary compile the needed reports. As this has not happened it is the recommendation to this Committee to eliminate the Committee of "Ritualistic Materials" altogether as there is not enough Ritualistic Materials remaining in the State of Florida to justify this Committee.

#### **FIVE YEAR PLAN**

A meeting of the Grand Chapter Officers was called by R.E. Anthony Marotta, with the permission of M.E. D'Angina, on August 22, 2009, for the purpose of reviewing the 5 year plan. The meeting was held at Citrus Masonic Lodge in Inverness FL at 12 noon and was opened with prayer. The officers present were M.E. Darryl D'Angina, R.E. Anthony Marotta, R.E. Robert G. Kirkpatrick, Ex. Cal Bonnett, Ex. John Wermann, Ex. William Jacobs and Ex. Wayne Thigpen.

M.E. D'Angina started by reviewing his year of the 5 year plan, although it was still early in his year. Most Excellent expressed his thoughts of Increasing membership by ten percent and all Chapters exalting at least one and also new Companions be given a copy of "York Rite of Freemasonry." The importance of reporting was stressed and the need for recruiting events. Companions being able to Open and Close, a Chapter meeting from memory was emphasized. Each District should hold an Ancient Craft Table Chapter and the possibility of using a modified ritual to allow open Table Chapters. Discussion ensued on using part of the Mark Masters Degree as a tool to use in the Blue Lodge to help increase exaltations. Use of the Florida Grand York Rite website was also stressed. #### JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE REPORT

The Committee on Jurisprudence for the Capitular year of 2010-2011, having carefully examined the report of Most Excellent Grand High Priest Anthony J. Marotta, Jr., commend him for having executed his duties in the most professional manner becoming to the Office. We find all actions regarding rulings, dispensations, edicts and amendments to by-laws to be in accordance with the Constitution, Laws and Regulations of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida and within the prerogatives of his office.

This Committee examined 27 Warrants, 8 Requests for Dispensations, 2 Grand High Priest's Executive Orders, 3 Grand High Priest's Directives and 5 Requests for By-Laws Amendments. All of the Dispensations, By-Law amendments approved or disapproved, Directives and Executive Ordered were executed in a proper manner and within the prerogative of the Office of Grand High Priest. Two By-Law amendment requests were returned as not being in proper form.

There were four resolutions submitted, which would change or amend the Constitution, Laws and Regulations of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida. One resolution was withdrawn by the proposers and will not be presented at this session. The Jurisprudence Committee examined the remaining resolutions for conformity to Article XXI of the said Constitution. We found the three remaining Resolutions proposed, meet all requirements and appropriate to come to the floor at this session for your decision.

In our review of the Proposed Resolutions to amend the Constitution, Laws or Regulations of the Grand Chapter we find that most of the proposers merely type in their names. After some discussion in committee, we highly recommend that a Resolution be proposed, amending our Constitution to require all Resolutions presented to this Grand Jurisdiction for consideration shall contain the signatures of all Proposers.

We commend the Grand High Priest for having faithfully performed his duties this Capitular year and applaud him on his many visitations. Each member of the Jurisprudence Committee expresses his personal gratitude for the privilege and honor of serving this Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons.

- Fees
- 3. Sale of Merchandise and Publications
- Miscellaneous which shall include receipts related to Administrative Fund Purposes and not otherwise designated herein.
- 5. Seventy-five percent (75%) of all interest dividends or capital gains from the previous year of the Administrative Endowment Fund if so allocated.
- Other funds allocated to the Administrative Fund by Grand Chapter regulations or actions

Upon receipt thereof, these funds shall be credited to and deposited in an income producing account to be designated The Administrative Current Reserve Account.

Effective date of adoption April 15, 2010


