



GRAND HIGH PRIEST'S ADDRESS

Companions Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Florida:

The Masonic year is drawing to a close and it is with pleasure that I greet you to this, the Sixty-eighth Annual Grand Convocation. CHAPTERS CONSTITUTED

At my request, and as my special deputy, Companion W. R. O'Neal, Grand Scribe, constituted Kissimmee Chapter, No. 10, on Monday, June 23, and installed the officers. Six brethren were given the Mark Master and Most Excellent Master's Degrees. Companion O'Neal writes that in his opinion this Chapter will be one of the most progressive and capable Chapters in the State.

RESTORATION OF CHARTER

On October 21, 1913, I restored the Charter of St. Johns Chapter, No. 4, of DeLand, to eighteen of the old members who signed a regular petition therefor, and appointed Companion Silas B. Wright my special deputy to institute the Chapter and install officers. Companion Wright reports having performed the duty and that the Chapter is at work with an enthusiastic membership.

CHAPTERS U. D.

On October 24, 1913, I granted a dispensation to form a new Chapter at Eustis, Florida, and appointed Companion O'Neal, of Orlando, my special deputy to assemble the Companions and deliver the dispensation, which he reports having done, and that the new Chapter U. D. is regularly at work.

On November 25, 1913, I granted a dispensation for a new Chapter at Leesburg, Florida, and appointed Companion O'Neal my special deputy to assemble the Companions and deliver the dispensation, which he reports having done, and that the Chapter is now regularly at work, with excellent prospects of success. Companion O'Neal reports having conferred all of the degrees upon thirteen candidates.

DECISIONS

Ques.—Keystone Chapter, U. D., asks if, when they receive charter members by dimit, they shall elect them by ballot as if they were applicants for affiliation, or have they the same right to come in without ballot, just as we did when we agreed among ourselves and applied for the dispensation?

Ans.—All who wish to join your Charter by dimit must take the usual course, which is by reference of the petition to a committee and the ballot spread. These petitions for membership by dimit may be acted upon at the same meeting at which they are presented.

Ques.—Indian River Chapter, No. 27, reports having the misfortune to lose by death, both the High Priest and Treasurer, and the King writes to ask, if it is necessary to elect a new Treasurer or can I appoint one for the unexpired term?

Ans.—You can elect a new Treasurer at any regular meeting. If you desire to elect a High Priest to fill the vacancy, application must be made for a dispensation, members present at any regular Convocation. You may of course act as High Priest for the balance of the term.

Ques.—Manatee River asks, is a notice of a special masonically legal when not signed by either the High Companion in good standing to be legal?

Ans.—All members of a Chapter should be notified the Secretary or High Priest.

Ques.—A' telegram asking authority to organize a Chapter at Fort Myers was received, to which I answered, by nine regular Royal Arch Masons, in good standing

and recommended by the nearest Chapter. If the Companions will comply with the law, I will be pleased to consider application.

DISPENSATIONS

On July 29th, 1913, upon petition signed by the King, Scribe, and Secretary of Indian River Chapter, No. 27, over the seal of the Chapter, I granted a dispensation for the Chapter to hold an election for a High Priest and Treasurer, vice M. S. Sams, and R. B. Wilson, deceased.

On December 24, 1913, dispensation was granted to Munroe Chapter to hold a public installation of officers

on January 2, 1914.

On January 9, 1914, I granted a dispensation to St. Johns Chapter, No. 4, at DeLand, to do regular business at a special meeting to be held on Wednesday, January 14, 1914, the Chapter having failed to have a quorum on the date of the other annual meeting, December 27, notice to be given to all members.

On December 12, I granted permission to Leesburg Chapter, U. D., to add the names of J. M. Mosely, B. Webb, and J. J. Tillis to the dispensation granted for the

Chapter U. D. at that place.

On January 26, 1914, I granted a dispensation to St. Augustine Chapter to move into their new rooms, in accordance with the request of the High Priest and Secretary.

On January 28, 1914, I granted dispensation to Ocala Chapter, to move into their new hall or place of meeting.

I was honored with a special invitation to attend the One Hundred and Third Annual Convocation of the Grand Chapter of South Carolina, at Sumpter, S. C., April 14. I was compelled to send regrets at not being able to be present.

Special invitations were received from Florida Royal Arch Chapter No. 1; Jackson Chapter No. 32; Gadsden Chapter, No. 30, to be with them on various dates. These invitations were accepted and visitations made.

Your Committee on Masonic Jurisprudence respectfully report that they have carefully examined the portions of the M:E:.Grand High Priest's address which were referred to them and find that his decisions are in accordance with the laws of Capitular Masonry except the ruling in the case of Keystone Chapter U. D., to the effect that members could be admitted to that chapter on dimit

by vote of the chapter. The law in this Grand Jurisdiction is that such members can be added to the roll of a Chapter U. D. only by order of the M.: E. : Grand High Priest upon unanimous request of the chapter. Such a chapter may, of course, express its unanimous request by ballot, but it is wholly within the power of the M:.E: Grand High Priest to give or to withhold his consent.

The dispensations granted appear to have been in accord with the discretion vested in the M: E: Grand High Priest and conse-

quently are not subject to review by this Grand Chapter. The following proposed new regulation was referred to your

"Regulation No. - The Most Excellent Grand High Priest has the authority to grant dispensations to subordinate chapters to nas the authority to grant dispensations to supprent the confer the degrees at any place within their respective jurisdictions whenever in his judgment it will be for the benefit of the craft." Your committee find that the power to issue such dispensations

as are usual and proper and according to the landmarks of the craft is vested in the M.E. Grand High Priest by the constitution, and are, therefore, of opinion that the subject matter of the proposed are, mererore, or opinion that the subject matter of the proposed regulation is covered by existing law, and there is no necessity for

Ther legislation upon it.

Likewise your committee find that there exists no necessity for the other proposed new regulation which was referred to them, as

"Regulation - At each regular Grand Convocation the M: E: Grand High Priest shall appoint some subordinate chapter as the Committee on Work to exemplify the degrees at the next as the Committee on work to exemplify the degrees at the next annual Grand Convocation, and such members of said committee annual Grand Convocation, and such members of said committee who are here in no other capacity shall be paid per diem and Regulation 21 provides that the Committee on Work shall ex-

Regulations

ADOPTED SINCE THE PUBLICATION OF THE DIGEST

RETURNS

Reg. No. 52, amended to read as follows:

Reg. No. 52. Annual returns of chapters are required to be prepared immediately after the close of each Masonic year, and forwarded to the Grand Secretary. Annual dues should also be forwarded at the same time. Chapters failing to have their returns and dues in the hands of the Grand Secretary on or before April 1st, may be allowed representation in the Grand Chapter, and their representatives placed on the pay-roll by special action of the Grand Chapter, but a fine of five (\$5.) delinquency and collected by the Grand Secretary, who shall notify the High Priest and the Secretary of the delinquent chapter of the assessment of the fine. 1913.

RESTORATION OF CHAPTERS

If a chapter has surrendered its charter and Grand Chapter certificates have been issued to any who were members at the time of its surrender, a petition for restoration of the charter must be accompanied by the Grand Chapter certificates of the petitioners. If no Grand Chapter certificate has been issued to a companion who is shown by the Grand Chapter records to have been a

member of the Chapter at the time of the surrender and who signs the petition for restoration, no such certificate is necessary to be filed with the petition. 1913.

QUORUM

51. Nine members of the Chapter are necessary to constitute a quorum to transact any business whatever, but for the purposes of opening and conferring degrees the quorum of nine may include Royal Arch Masons in good standing not members of the Chapter. Provided, That the High Priest may call meetings of the Lodges respectively to confer the Lodge degrees upon duly elected candidates, and do the work with the working quorums; Mark Master's Lodge 5, Past Master's Lodge 3, and Most Excellent Master's Lodge 2, all of whom are not required to be Royal Arch Masons: and for such purpose the Chapter need not be opened in the Royal Arch Degree. 1914.
