Motion made and carried that all Royal Arch Masons in good standing be admitted to seats in this Grand Convocation as visitors.

At this conclusion of my year as your Grand High Priest. I wish to express to you, my deep sense of appreciation for the high honor conferred upon me by you. I have ever been mindful of the trust left in my keeping and have to the best of my ability, endeavored to live up to your expectations.

I recommended the appointment of Companion James Booth, Grand Representative for Massachusetts near the Grand Chapter of Florida.

I recommended the appointment of Companion Dave Scroggs, Grand Representative for North Carolina near the Grand Chapter of Florida.

I recommended the appointment of Companion Russell W. Houston, Grand Representative near the Grand Chapter of Florida for Texas.

BY-LAWS

Approved complete set of By-laws for Tampa Chapter No. 3, which were to replace old By-laws.

Approved complete set of By-laws for Lake Worth Chapter No. 24.

Approved change of By-laws for Jericho Chapter No. 11 for changing date of meeting from second and fourth Fridays to second and fourth Thursdays.

DISPENSATIONS GRANTED

Granted Jericho Chapter No. 11 dispensation to install officers at a joint meeting of Chapter, Council and Commandery.

FINANCES

Have signed warrants on the Grand Treasurer numbering from No. 1 to No. 17 inclusive.

VISITATIONS

On Friday, May 27th, 1938, I visited Jericho Chapter No. 11, saw the Royal Arch Degree conferred in accordance with the new Ritual. The work was fine. This being my home Chapter, have visited often.

On June 8th, 1938, Visited the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Michigan, where I was received as the Grand High Priest of Florida. While there, I was royally entertained and accorded many honors.

On June 20th, Visited Lake Worth Chapter No. 24, witnessed the Past Master's degree conferred in new ritual in a splendid manner. Was accorded Grand Honors.

On July 11th and 12th attended special Summer Assembly of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masons in North Carolina at Waynesville, where we were royally entertained.

On August 22nd, together with Harry R. Thompson, Grand Master of the First Veil, I visited Key West, hoping to create interest in the Chapter there once more; talked to several interested Masons but they did not feel that much could be accomplished at this time.

Visited Poinciana Chapter No. 50 at Ft. Myers and had a most enjoyable time. The work was splendid and the Companions deeply interested.

On November 9th, Went to Live Oak and at four o'clock in the afternoon, met with officers and members of Live Oak Chapter No. 25, regarding the indebtedness of that Chapter to the Grand Chapter.

On November 10th, accompanied by Richard Ervin, D. D. G. H. P.; W. L. Marshall, Grand Scribe, and Cleveland R. Horne, P. G. H. P., went to Marianna, where Jesse C. Clark, D. G. H. P., joined us. We were entertained at a fine

dinner after which we went to the Chapter Hall where the officers and members of Jackson Chapter No. 32 gave us hearty welcome.

Due to the fact that Armistice Day was on November 11th, we were unable to have a meeting of Florida Chapter No. 1, however many of its fine members were at Marianna to help Jackson Chapter members give us a welcome.

On January 6th, Went to Ft. Pierce to visit with the officers and members of Joppa Chapter No. 28. There I installed the officers for the 1939. I found the officers and members embued with a spirit to do things and I predict a renewed interest in the affairs of that Chapter.

On January 7th, I installed the officers of Jericho Chapter No. 11, which had been chosen to serve for the year, 1939.

In February, I visited the Indian River Chapter No. 27 Titusville, where the officers and members entertained me at a dinner, after which we attended a meeting of that Chapter, being received with Grand Honors. Interest in the Chapter seems to be much improved there.

In February, I visited Lake Worth Chapter No. 24 at a joint meeting of Jericho Chapter No. 11, Keystone Chapter No. 20, Lake Worth Chapter No. 24 and Joppa Chapter No. 28. This meeting was the result of a discussion that came up when I visited Joppa Chapter. At that time a meeting of all Southeast Florida Chapters was proposed so I appointed a Committee to work out the details. This was indeed a fine meeting. The Companions of West Palm Beach are surely a fine lot and know how to make us enjoy ourselves.

On April 26th, I visited St. Petersburg Chapter No. 31, where I saw the exemplification of the Royal Arch degree in accordance with the new ritual and I wish to say again to Companion Booth, officers and members of this Chapter, your degree was the finest I have ever seen. It thoroughly demonstrates a wide awake, deeply interested group of officers and Companions. I visited here with Cary B. Fish, Grand Secretary and Archie Aitchison, and W. C. Sessions, attend. For these kind invitations, I wish to thank the D. D. G. H. P.

I had other invitations but to my regret, was unable to attend. For these kind invitations, I wish to thank the officers and members of each of these Chapters.

RECOMMENDATIONS

After having witnessed the work done this year by the several chapters, using the new Ritual, I recommend that the new ritual be the only ritual permitted in the future.

REFERENCES

Having had referred to me for my recommendations the matter of indebtedness to the Grand Chapter of several subordinate Chapters, I have visited several of the Chapters that are indebted to the Grand Chapter. It is exceedingly difficult to determine the best policy, so I have discussed this matter with several officers of the Grand Chapter as well as past officers and members and have come to the conclusion that to cancel the indebtedness would be wrong, however, I recommend that they be granted 10 years within which the Chapters are to pay and that they be required to pay not less than 10 per cent per year. With one exception, this is my recommendation. That exception is Joppa Chapter of Ft. Pierce. There the officers and members were made to believe that by delaying these payments, eventually the indebtedness would be cancelled. The District Deputy Grand High Priest was the one to cause this condition. So due to the action of this Grand Officer, I feel that the Grand Chapter is responsible for his actions, therefore, I recommend that the indebtedness of Joppa Chapter be cancelled.

CONCLUSION

My year as your Grand High Priest is about over, but I assure you I will always labor for the good of the Order. Though I have not accomplished as much as I would have liked to do, yet I have done my best. I cannot conclude this report without thanking my deputies for their fine service, also M. E. Companion Cary B. Fish, P. G. H. P. and Grand Secretary. Cary is a wonderful Secretary and a true help to a Grand High Priest.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON MEMORIALS

To the M. E. Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Florida:

Your Committee on Memorials submit the following report:

Each passing year takes its toll of those with whom we have been associated and who were bound to us by the tender ties of brotherhood and companionship: we have long ago learned that death, the grand leveler, is no respecter of individuals or of classes.

During the past year, as in all the years preceded it, the Angel of Death has taken toll of those who had been our Companions. There are vacant places in the Chapter and vacant chairs in the homes of those to whom we were bound by the tenderest ties of brotherhood. Their day's work is finished and they have gone to receive their wages, having wrought well in the quarries of life; their wages are life eternal. They have been inducted into the secrets hidden from our eyes: they have followed the Ark of the Covenant and have placed the keystone high in the temple not made by hand eternal in the heavens.

We truly and sincerely sympathize with those who are most deeply affected by the loss which we have all sustained and would affectionately remind them that "The Great Architect of the Universe will fold his arms of love and protection around those who put their trust in Him".

What the earthly future has in store for any of us we can not tell. We hope the way will be smooth and easy to tread. But for some there will almost surely be bereavements and losses: some of us may be led along the pathway of sickness, loneliness and weary waiting. To some may be thrown wide open portal of eternity, the way to which is through the valley of the shadow. Yet for each one of us, there maybe songs for the night and the morning's waking ing, but always trusting in the Great I Am.

During the year, death has invaded this General Grand Chapter has robbed other Sister Grand Jurisdictions with whom we deeply sympathize and our own subordinate Chapters have seen many of their Companions pass with the veil and enter the Supreme Grand Chapter on high.

In the following is the list of those who have departed from us. A special memorial should be made to our own departed Companions.

MEMORIAL

To the M. E. Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Florida:

As the sun was setting in the western sky, there was summoned from our midst one of the noblest Companions it has ever been our lot to meet. Rev. Albert Earl Calkins, E. Grand Principal Sojourner of this Grand Chapter, just as the sun had set on the evening of February 7, 1939, was called into the heavenly veil to be greeted by the Grand High Priest of the Universe. Companion Calkins was born in Beliot, Kansas, July 7, 1883, and when very young, came with his parents to Florida. He was educated in the schools of Brooksville and Jacksonville. He took his theological training in the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary at Louisville, Kentucky. He served Ashler Lodge No. 98, in St. Augustine, Florida as its Master during 1930. Companion Calkins was a Member of Jefferson Chapter No. 26, Royal Arch Masons in Monticello, Florida and served as its High Priest. He was knighted in St. Augustine Commandery, Knights Templar, No. 10, and was elected Commander, 1928. He served St. Augustine Chapter, O. E. S. No. 12, as the Patron during the year 1936. At the time of his death, he was Grand Chaplain of the Grand Lodge, F. & A. M., of Florida, and was the Grand Junior Warden of the Grand Commandery of Florida. On January 14, 1904, he was united in marriage to Miss Nellie Rosalie Stoddard of Louisville, Ky. In addition to the widow, there survive him two daughters, Mrs. Clarence Kercheval of Elkton, and Mrs. C. I. Gleason of Lakeland, Florida. E. Companion Calkins was ordained November 1, 1909 and served churches in Perry, Jasper, Callahan, Jacksonville and St. Augustine. For eighteen years, he served the Church in St. Augustine under his pastorate, two other churches were organized. Dr. Calkins was a preacher from Divine compulsion. His preaching broke out of his sympathetic soul. He was a preacher at heart. He had a message from God and a divine passion to win men to the way of righteous living. This is the reason he loved Masonry and devoted himself to it. He saw here an appeal to the noblest instincts of men: call men to build a life and to be real Companions to their fellow men. He exemplified in his daily life what it really means to be a Companion in the highest conception of that great term. He had entered the veil and had communed with the High Priest of all mankind and then went out to reveal to man God's plan of life.

Funeral services were conducted in the Church in which he had labored so long. The sermon was preached by his close friend, Dr. Thomas Hanson of Jacksonville. At the grave, Grand Master, George Fish, conducted the Masonic rites and Companion Calkins' body was buried in Evergreen Cemetery at St. Augustine.

Regulations

Adopted Since Publication of Digest

Regulation No.

Subordinate Chapters may hold regular or special convocations in any Lodge room within their territorial jurisdiction for the purpose of creating interest in Capitular Masonry, and at such convocations may transact such business as is prescribed by its by-laws. All such convocations shall be reported to the Grand High Priest.

1937

Regulation No. 43. Amended to read as follows:

Chapters may provide for life membership in their by-laws, but no life membership shall be granted for less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), Provided nevertheless that in the event of the death of said member, any sum paid for said membership shall revert to the Chapter.

Chapters must pay annual dues to the Grand Chapter for all life members.

1937

Regulation No. —.

All members in good standing in chapters whose charters have been surrendered or suspended, shall be furnished with a certificate of good standing by the Grand Secretary for a fee of one dollar. Members of such chapters who have been suspended for non-payment of dues may obtain a certificate of good standing upon application to the Grand Secretary of the Grand Chapter, such application to be accompanied by a fee of three dollars. (1938).

Regulation No.

Section 1. Two or more chapters having concurrent jurisdiction or stationed in adjoining jurisdiction may be consolidated into one chapter provided that the proposition for such consolidation shall be presented at a regular convocation of each chapter, which proposition shall be acted

upon at a subsequent regular convocation. Notice thereof shall be mailed to all members at least ten days prior to such convocation. Such consolidation can not be effected if nine (9) or more members of either chapter vote against the proposition. A majority vote of those present shall be necessary to adopt the resolution for consolidation.

Two or more chapters having thus decided to consolidate may unite under the charter of one of said chapters, retaining the officers thereof, or they may elect new officers by a proper dispensation. The charter surrendered must be deposited with the Grand Secretary.

Section 2, The title to all the property and effects of the consolidating chapters shall, upon consolidation, vest in the new chapter, and the new chapter shall be liable for all indebtedness of the several chapters consolidating. All members of the chapters consolidating shall, immediately after consolidation, become members of the new chapter. (1938)
