The Grand High Priest delivered the following address:

ADDRESS OF THE GRAND HIGH PRIEST

To the Most Excellent Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Florida:
 I welcome you to the opening of this 96th Convocation of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of

Florida. We give thanks to Almighty God for His blessings. We are privileged to live in a land where individual rights are preserved, where we can meet as Masons and express our thoughts, and where we are free to think, to speak, and to worship in accord with our own convictions.

As we remember the liberties we enjoy, and the preservation of them as a vital part of Masonry, may we all use every force we possess to keep this precious liberty for future generations, that the blessings of Masonry may be continued through the years.

To the distinguished guests who honor us this morning, we greet you with the most generous hospitality. We also welcome the Companions from the Subordinate Chapters, especially those who are here for their first time. We want you to feel free to enter into the deliberations of this Grand Chapter.

I deeply regret the fact that since we last met, M. E. Companion Cary B. Fish, who was our Grand Secretary, passed away on August 13, 1941. It is also my sad duty to report the passing of our beloved M. E. Companion Joseph R. Keller, who served our Grand Chapter as Chaplain, on August 2, 1941.

FINANCES

I have signed Vouchers from 1 to 37, inclusive, aggregating \$3,300.41.

Companions, we have just been through another trying year, with nations falling and cities crumbling all around us, and we should thank Almighty God for giving us the privilege of meeting unmolested in the only country in the world that is governed by Democracy, which was brought to the new world by our forefathers.

I claim no great achievement, Companions, during my administration, with the serious tension that we are all living under. It has been a pleasure for me to visit as many of the Chapters as I have.

As I pass the gavel to my successor, I do so with a full appreciation of the Honor you have confided in me. I would not feel that I had fully and completely finished my year without thanking the Past Grand High Priests for the help and kindly advice they have given me; also the Grand Officers for the assistance they have been to me when I called upon them. The work I have performed during the year has been for the love of the Craft, for my Companions, and the ennobling principles of Freemasonry.

PROVIDED, That the fees and dues of ministers of the Gospel who are actively engaged in ministerial work may be remitted by the Chapters.

In this, the most eventful year in the World's history, Royal Arch Masons are gathering not only to plan for the work that lies ahead, but to remember all who have so valiantly and unselfishly taught the principles of a Royal Arch Mason.

For ninety-six years, the Royal Arch Masons of Florida have been recording the passing of our Companions. Our records are full of the names of men who were prominent in every activity of the State.

It is with sorrow that we must add to the list that of our beloved Companion and Secretary, Cary Brown Fish; born at Lansing, New York, July 28, 1867; died in Providence, Rhode Island, August 13, 1941.

Companion Fish had devoted much of his life to Masonry. He was Past Grand Master of Florida, Free and Accepted Masons; Past Grand Master of Royal and Select Masters; Past Grand High Priest of Royal Arch Masons; Past Grand Commander, Knights Templar; M. E. Grand Secretary, Royal Arch Masons; M. E. Grand Recorder, Royal and Select Masters, and R. E. Grand Recorder Knights Templar. He had been honored in many ways by the National Bodies of the York Rite.

The highest tribute that can be paid to him is that he lived the Masonry which was the guiding principle of his life.

On August 2, 1941, there was suddenly called to the larger life, Joseph Robins Keller, the Senior living Past Grand High Priest of Florida. He was born at Mullican Hill, New Jersey, April 12, 1866.

In his home city, in his Church, in his mission work, Joe Keller ever had before him the teachings of his Lord and Master.

It is with great sadness and bowed heads that we record the passing of these, our Companions.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That each subordinate Chapter be ordered to set apart all fees for the degrees for the use and benefit of such widows, orphans and indigent members of their Chapters, and the same be applied as there may be need.

ARTICLE V

ANNUAL RETURNS AND DUES TO THE GRAND CHAPTER

Sec. 1. Every Chapter in this Grand Jurisdiction shall make annual returns to the Grand Chapter of all its work, to the twenty-seventh day of December, with a list of its officers and members, and pay into the Treasury of the Grand Chapter such sums as the Grand Chapter shall from time to time prescribe. Such returns shall be forwarded to the Grand Secretary on or before the first day of April in each year. PROVIDED, That when a Chapter shall, in its Annual Return, report an aged or infirm Companion as an emeritus member thereof, and exempts him from the payment of Chapter dues, such Chapter shall have credit therefor in the payment of its dues, and the Chapters shall not be required to pay Grand Chapter fees or dues for ministers of the Gospel, who are exempt from Chapter fees or dues by the by-laws thereof.

Amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE V

ANNUAL RETURNS AND DUES TO THE GRAND CHAPTER

Sec. 1. Every Chapter in this Grand Jurisdiction shall make annual returns to the Grand Chapter of all its work, to the twenty-fourth day of June, with a list of its officers and members, and pay into the Treasury of the Grand Chapter such sums as the Grand Chapter shall from time to time prescribe. Such returns shall be forwarded to the Grand Secretary on or before the first day of August in each year. PROVIDED, That when a Chapter shall, in its Annual Return, report an aged or infirm Companion as an Emeritus member thereof, and exempts him from the payment of Chapter dues, such Chapter shall have credit thereof in the payment of its dues, and the Chapters shall not be required to pay Grand Chapter fees or dues for ministers of the Gospel, who are exempt from Chapter fees or dues by the by-laws thereof.

ANNUAL CONVOCATIONS

Sec. 4. The Annual Grand Convocations of this Grand Chapter shall be held in such place as shall be designated by the Grand Chapter, on the third Tuesday of May in each year at 10 o'clock A. M., and the representatives of three chartered Chapters shall constitute a quorum. PROVIDED, That the Grand High Priest may, for good cause, designate some other time and place within this Grand Jurisdiction for holding the Annual Grand Convocation. And, PROVIDED, ALSO, That the Grand High Priest may call a special Grand Convocation of the Grand Chapter when, in his discretion, it may be necessary or important so to do.

Amended to read as follows:

Sec. 4. The Annual Grand Convocation of this Grand Chapter shall be held in such place as shall be designated by the Grand Chapter, on the second Monday in September of each year at 2:00 o'clock P. M., and the representatives of three chartered Chapters shall con-

stitute a quorum. PROVIDED, That the Grand High Priest may, for good cause, designate some other time and place within this Grand Jurisdiction for holding the Annual Grand Convocation. And, PROVIDED, ALSO, That the Grand High Priest may call a special Grand Convocation of the Grand Chapter when, in his discretion, it may be necessary or important to do so.

The Fiscal year of the Grand Chapter and each subordinate Chapter shall end on the 24th day of June of each year.

APPENDIX To Resolution amending Section 4 and Article V of the Constitution.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Section 8 of Article IV, of the Constitution to be amended to read as follows:

Section 8. The first five officers named in the last of the preceding section shall be elected annually by ballot, by a majority of the votes cast at the first regular Convocation of the Chapter following after the fourteenth day of May and not later than the fifteenth day of June.

A motion was made and adopted due to the unsettled conditions, that the Time and Place of the next session of the Grand Chapter be left to the Grand High Priest and he is requested to consult the three Council Officers of the Grand Chapter.

A motion was made by Companion Archie Aitchison and adopted that instead of granting \$50.00 for a marker for the grave of Companion R. J. Kishpaugh, M. E. Past Grand High Priest, that the \$50.00 be sent to Harmonia Lodge No. 138 F. & A. M. to be credited on a mortgage against the property of Mrs. R. J. Kishpaugh. However, in the case of Mrs. Cary B. Fish the money is to be given to her.

A motion was made and adopted electing F. Wm. Schultz to the honorable position of Honorary Past Grand High Priest, and that a Jewel and Apron be secured for presentation.

The Grand Chapter instructed the Grand Secretary to have all Aprons and Jewels repaired and placed in good condition, and that the jewels be gold plated in addition.

The M. E. Grand High Priest appointed Tellers and the Grand Chapter proceeded with the Annual Election of Officers with the following result:

GRAND OFFICERS ELECTED

Companion Wm. L. Marshall was unanimously elected M. E. Grand High Priest. Upon being asked if he would accept, he requested a few minutes of the Grand Chapter's time, and he made an interesting address and requested the Companions to make him four (4) promises; namely:

1st.—That they would support him in all his laudable undertakings.

2nd—That they would answer all letters promptly.

3rd—That they would accede to any righteous request he made.

4th—That they would all attend Chapter meetings every regular Chapter meeting night, and that they would write him a postal card every meeting night saying that they were there, or explain why they were not there.

He asked for a rising vote of confidence, which was responded to unanimously.

Regulations

Adopted Since Publication of Digest

Regulation No.

Subordinate Chapters may hold regular or special convocations in any Lodge room within their territorial jurisdiction for the purpose of creating interest in Capitular Masonry, and at such convocations may transact such business as is prescribed by its by-laws. All such convocations shall be reported to the Grand High Priest.

1937

Regulation No. 43. Amended to read as follows:

Chapters may provide for life membership in their by-laws, but no life membership shall be granted for less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), provided nevertheless that in the event of the death of said member, any sum paid for said membership shall revert to the Chapter.

Chapters must pay annual dues to the Grand Chapter for all life members.

1937

Regulation No.

All members in good standing in chapters whose charters have been surrendered or suspended, shall be furnished with a certificate of good standing by the Grand Secretary for a fee of one dollar. Members of such chapters who have been suspended for non-payment of dues may obtain a certificate of good standing upon application to the Grand Secretary of the Grand Chapter, such application to be accompanied by a fee of three dollars. (1938).

Regulation No.

Section 1. Two or more chapters having concurrent jurisdiction or stationed in adjoining jurisdictions may be consolidated into one chapter provided that the proposition for such consolidation shall be presented at a regular convocation of each chapter, which proposition shall be acted upon at a subsequent regular convocation. Notice thereof shall be mailed to all members at least ten days

prior to such convocation. Such consolidation cannot be effected if nine (9) or more members of either chapter vote against the proposition. A majority vote of those present shall be necessary to adopt the resolution for consolidation.

Two or more chapters having thus decided to consolidate may unite under the charter of one of said chapters, retaining the officers thereof, or they may elect new officers by a proper dispensation. The charter surrendered must be deposited with the Grand Secretary.

Section 2. The title to all the property and effects of the consolidating chapters shall, upon consolidation, vest in the new chapter, and the new chapter shall be liable for all indebtedness of the several chapters consolidating. All members of the chapters consolidating shall, immediately after consolidation, become members of the new chapter. (1938)

Regulation No.

It shall be the duty of the incoming Grand High Priest to appoint a committee to be styled "Committee on Ritual" whose duty it shall be to revise the present ritual, to receive suggestions from those interested, as to those portions that could be shortened or omitted, to the end that greater interest would be taken in conferring the various chapter degrees. Such suggestions to be sent the Grand Secretary at least thirty (30) days before our annual convocation.

Adopted 1940.

Regulation 60 Amended 1941

Nine members of a chapter are necessary to constitute a quorum to transact any business, but such quorum may be made up of Five members of any subordinate chapter of which a council officer or Past High Priest, must be one, together with four companions of any other chapter, in good standing, may open a chapter of Royal Arch Masons for the transaction of any business and/or for conferring degrees, provided that the High Priest may call meetings of the lodges respectively to confer the lodge degrees upon duly elected candidates and do the work with the working quorums; Mark Masters Lodge 5, Past Masters Lodge 3, Most Excellent Masters Lodge 2, all of whom are not required to be Royal Arch Masons; and for such purpose the chapter need not be opened in the Royal Arch Degree.

1942

Article V.

Section 3. The degrees of the Chapter shall not be conferred for a less sum than fifteen dollars, and then only upon Master Masons, who are members of Lodges in good standing, whose petitions have been duly presented in writing at a regular Convocation, reported upon by a Committee of Investigation, and unanimously accepted by the Chapter.

PROVIDED, That the fees and dues of ministers of the Gospel who are actively engaged in ministerial work may be remitted by the Chapters.
