Royal Arch Masons date from the year the second temple was commenced by Zerubbabel, ANNO INVENTIONIS (A.I.) "in the year of the discovery."

Royal and Select Masters date from the year in which the temple of Solomon was completed, ANNO DEPOSITIONIS (A. Dep.) "in the year of the deposit."

Knights Templar commence their era with the organization of their order, ANNO ORDINIS (A. O.) "in the year of the order."

Order of High Priesthood date from the year of the blessing of Abraham by the High Priest Melchizedek, ANNO BONNEFACIO (A. B.) "in the year of the blessing."

### RULES FOR MASONIC DATES

Ancient Craft Masons-

Add 4000 years to the common era. Thus: 1973 and 4000—5973.

Scottish Rite-

Add 3760 years to the common era. Thus: 1973 and 3760—5733. After September add another year.

Royal Arch-

Add 530 years to the vulgar year. Thus 1973 and 530—2503.

Royal and Select Masters-


Add 1000 years to the common era. Thus: 1973 and 1000—2973.

Knights Templar-

From the Christian era take 1118. Thus: 1118 from 1973—855.

Order of High Priesthood-

To the Christian era add 1913, the year of Blessing: Thus: 1973

- 4. I recommend that each District have schools of instruction several times a year, assisted by the Grand Chapter Committee of Work, giving M.E. Companion James W. MacDonald advance notice of schedule date of these schools.
- 5. I recommend continuance of the observation of Religious Affirmation Day.

### CONCLUSION

I would be remiss if I did not express my thanks and deep, abiding gratitude to all of the Companions throughout the State of Florida for the warm hospitality shown to us on our visits, and for their close cooperation. We are most appreciative of this, and will be eternally grateful.

To Sanford Lodge No. 62, of which I am Secretary, a heartfelt thanks for your understanding that the duties of Grand High Priest would cause some absence at the regular meetings, and a special thanks for those who "filled in" for me.

### REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON MASONIC RELATIONS

(which was adopted)

To the Most Excellent Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons of Florida:

The Committee on Masonic Relations submits the following report. This report is divided into four parts: Its Function, Activities and Participation, Observations-Cause and Affects and Recommendations.

Function: (1) to provide fraternal liaison primarily between the York Rite Bodies and the Grand Lodge of Florida and our Particular Lodges. (2) To explore, provide and promote ways and means of Educational communication pertaining to the York Rite of Free Masonry to the Master Masons of this Grand Jurisdiction. (3) Maintain a Fraternal fellowship with our Allied and Appendant Orders. (4) Ascertain and make report of breakdown in these avenues of Masonic relations and recommend corrective action, to the end that our Particular Lodges, our Mother Lodges, all Master Masons are awakened and brought to the awareness of the Light, Rights and Privileges available to them in York Rite Freemasonry.

This Committee has traveled almost the entire length and breadth of this State in fraternal Masonic fellowship. Attended 46 meetings held by Grand Lodge with Grand Lodge Officers present such as District Meetings, Ground Breaking for Masonic Edifices, Cornerstone Laying Ceremonies, Board of Trustees Meetings at our Masonic Home in St. Petersburg, Masonic Educational Workshops; Over 100 visits were made to Stated and Called Communications of Particular Lodges to assist with Degree Conferrals, delivered 45 Lectures of the Symbolic Degrees in the northeast and central area of the state, visited or participated in Past Masters Celebrations, Birthday Celebrations, Centennia's; delivered seven addresses to Masonic Associations, Annual Past Masters Nights, Family Nights and presentations of 50 and 25 year Certificates.

As a result of these participations, this Committee has made the following observations: (1) In many lodges, the reply to the mention of York Rite, is "What is York Rite?" Another statement "I would like to become a Shr ner. What do I do?" Another: "No one has told me about the York Rite." This clearly tells this committee that there is a break-down in Communication to the Master Mason. (4) This committee happily reports that while some Lodges list in their Trestleboards under Calendar of Events, the meetings, dates, time and place of Allied and Appendant Orders, this includes the meetings of York Rite, others are completely silent on this type of notice, even though some Allied and Appendant Orders meet in the same Temple Building.

It is quite evident that York Rite meetings and information appearing only in York Rite Publications and Trestleboards and made available to York Rite Members only cannot reach the Master Mason to whom we should reach with

The Grand Lodge System of Masonic Education suggests to all Particular Lodges, the use of varied and interesting programs to add interest to an otherwise dull business meeting.
