Royal Arch Masons date from the year the second temple was commenced by Zerubbabel, ANNO INVENTIONIS (A.I.) "in the year of the discovery."

Royal and Select Masters date from the year in which the temple of Solomon was completed, ANNO DEPOSITIONIS (A. Dep.) "in the year of the deposit."

Knights Templar commence their era with the organization of their order, ANNO ORDINIS (A. O.) "in the year of the order."

Order of High Priesthood date from the year of the blessing of Abraham by the High Priest Melchizedek, ANNO BONNEFACIO (A. B.) "in the year of the blessing."

RULES FOR MASONIC DATES

Ancient Craft Masons-

Add 4000 years to the common era. Thus: 1975 and 4000-5975.

Scottish Rite—

Add 3760 years to the common era. Thus: 1975 and 3760—5735, After September add another year.

Royal Arch-

Add 530 years to the vulgar year. Thus: 1975 and 530-2505.

Royal and Select Masters-


Add 1000 years to the common era. Thus: 1975 and 1000-2975.

Knights Templar-

From the Christian era take 1118. Thus: 1118 from 1975-857.

Order of High Priesthood-

- 2. May 27, 1974, for the installation of R. E. Companion Myron E. Goodrich, as District Deputy Grand High Priest, District No. 1, by R. E. Companion Thomas E. McGowan, Grand Master of the 1st Veil, M. E. Grand Chapter, R.A.M. of Florida.
- 3. August 5, 1974, to Crestview Chapter No. 40, to hold its 9th Annual Open Air Initiation in the Royal Arch degree on October 5, 1974, provided due and timely notice was given the membership of said chapter and the area used could be tiled.
- 4. April 5, 1975, for Brother Anthony Windell Branham, elected to membership in Putnam Chapter No. 9 R.A.M. to receive his Chapter degrees in the State of La.

DISPENSATION DENIED

November 8, 1974, a request for dispensation from Ocala Chapter No. 13, for November 2, 1975, in that said request was received by the Grand High Priest on November 6, 1974.

PROCLAMATIONS AND EDICTS

June 20, 1974, issued a Proclamation setting forth, Sunday, October 20, 1974 as RELIGIOUS AFFIRMATION DAY and calling upon all Companion Royal Arch Masons in the Grand Jurisdiction of Florida to observe the same.

November 2, 1974, in joint resolution and unity with the M.I.G.M. D. A. McClellan, Jr. and Grand Commander, Robert G. Weisenbarger, issued an EDICT that each constituent Chapter may, one time only, each calendar year, utilize the brief ritualistic procedure, authorized by the General Grand Chapter, R.A.M. International, General Grand Council, R. & S. M. International and Grand Encampment Knights Templar, U.S.A., as authorized for distribution August 16, 1974, by the International York Rite Council.

DECISIONS RENDERED

In most instances, harmony and peace have prevailed over the Companions of this Grand Jurisdiction, except for one specific instance, when it became necessary that I suspend, Companion George L .Crawford, High Priest, Lakeland Chapter No. 29, on November 15, 1974, as the result of a petition by seven Companions of Lakeland Chapter No. 29, R.A.M., in which he was charged with culpable negligence or dereliction of his official duties as High Prest. Pursuant to Rule No. 29, of the Constitution, Laws, Rules and Regulations of the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida. I appointed M. E. Companion Roy R. Wright, Jr., Excellent Companion J. Russ Hammond, High Priest and Excellent Companion L. Kent Leonard, High Priest, as an investigating committee of three, to hear, try and determine the matter and submit their report, conclusions and decision. The committee, on April 2, 1975, in their report recommended that the suspension of Companion George L. Crawford be sustained. After receiving the report of the investigating committee, I concurred in their findings and recommendations and on April 4, 1975. RULED and ORDERED that Companion George L. Crawford although not guilty of any unmasonic conduct, was guilty of Culpable negligence or dereliction of his duties as High Priest of Lakeland Chapter No. 29 R.A.M. and is not entitled to the right, title, priviledges and prerogatives of a High Priest or Past High Priest in Lakeland Chapter No. 29, R.A.M. or in this M.E. Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida, this however in no way affects Companion George L. Crawford's membership, rights and privileges as a member and Companion of Lakeland Chapter No. 29, R.A.M.

STATE OF THE CRAFT

This year has seen increased activity in all the Chapters throughout this Grand Jurisdiction, and I am pleased to report that this has resulted in an increase in membership for another year. Four Hundred Eighty One brothers were exhaulted, Fifty seven reinstated, Ninety affiliated, for a gain of Six Hundred Twenty Eight. The grim reaper removed Two Hundred Forty Five through death, Fifty nine demitted and One Hundred Thirty seven were suspended for non-payment of dues, leaving a net gain for the year of One Hundred Eighty seven. As always, my companions, suspensions for non-payment of dues continues to plague us each year in every Chapter through out this Grand Jurisdiction. Only through a real concerted effort of every companion can this problem be resolved.

CONCLUSION

My Companions another year has swiftly past by and much remains to be done. To my successor I would say, trust in the guidance of the OMNIPOTENT RULER in your every undertaking. To my select, faithful and worthy Grand Line Officers, District Deputy Grand High Priests, Committemen and

Companions all, I deeply appreciate every kindness and courtesy each of you have extended to me and on my behalf to make this a never to be forgotten experience in my masonic life. To me, life holds many surprises in my every day travels, but I can always find strength and rejoice in the many blessings and comforts that accompany me on this journey. Each day, I am afforded the opportunity to refresh my Spirit in the Light of the Supreme Architect of the Universe to whom all things are possible. I sincerely hope that each of you companions will find new friendships and companionships through our meetings, degree work and social gatherings and truely experience a never to be forgotten pathway of pleasant memories, so, that in your twilight years, when friendships grow dearer and your memories linger longer, in the lengthening shadows of life, you too may find how good it is to dwell together in unity of purpose. Remember, my Companions the fewer the regrets for our past actions, the more pleasant the memories when our task shall have been completed.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. That the beautiful Chalice given to the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida, by an anonymous donor, be designated as the Grand High Priest Award. That the presiding Grand High Priest award the Chalice into the keeping for one year, to the Chapter, who over the previous year has demonstrated the most improved attendance of its elected and appointed officers in attendance at its regular meetings, together with the opening and closing of the Chapter without the use of any ritual by any of its officers. This would require the Secretary of each Chapter to keep an accurate record of the attendance of its officers and report to the Grand Secretary at the end of the year on his particular Chapter. The Chalice would be returned to the Grand Convocation of the Grand Chapter by the Chapter in possession of the same.
- That the Committee on Work designate in each area a well informed Chapter Companion as area instructor whose duty it would be in the future to visit the Chapters during degree work and set up the schools of instruction for the Committee on Work.
- That my successor appoint a committee to study the need of instituting an educational program in each Chapter under the direction of a Chapter Instructor.
- 4. That the Grand Chapter of Florida endorse the Research Assistance Foundation sponsored by General Grand Chapter, R.A.M. International by contributing the sum of \$100.00 to said foundation and encourage individual companions to contribute \$1.00 each year in support of this foundation.
- 5. That the Grand High Priest's allowance and per diem be increased from the sum of \$1,500,00 to the realistic sum of \$1,800.00, due to the increased cost of gasoline, meals and lodging.
- That the District Deputy Grand High Priest and Grand Line Officers on official visits be allowed per diem of \$20,00 per day and .20¢ per mile one way.
- 7. That the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida initiate a program of educational assistance to a deserving De Molay member of Florida Chapters by setting aside sufficient funds held in reserve to assure the due budgeting of an annual sum of \$1,000.00 for this expenditure.
- 8. That the elected Grand King, by virtue of his office be appointed chairman of the budget committee of Grand Chapter.

- That the elected Grand Scribe, by virtue of his office be appointed chairman of the Audit committee of Grand Chapter.
- That this Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons by its
 presiding Grand High Priest appoint a committee to recommend a
 philanthropy worthy of this Grand Jurisdictions support through
 voluntary contributions.

This Royal Arch Foundation will be funded by voluntary contributions.

To the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida:

We are most happy to inform you that several schools of instruction were held, both on a district and individual chapter basis, but regret that in many instances conflicting dates made it impossible to have them in some areas, and also regret that more requests for assistance from this committee were not made.

We are indeed grateful to the many companions who gave of their time and effort to be with us on these various occasions, and trust that answers they were seeking were obtained, and that they imparted this to the companions of their Chapters who were unable to attend.

We fully realize that many times the officers of chapters are unable to attend these meetings, but sincerely urge all officers and companions to possibly put forth a little additional effort to attend the meetings that will be set up by the committee selected by our incoming Grand H.P. so that the information from them may reach more companions.

We would also hope that all Chapters consider having a member of this committee visit them on a regular meeting night and work with them at that time, always remembering that the companions on this committee will be willing to do so at any time, providing it is cleared with the chairman.

After attending many of these schools and installations, and after much study and discussion we therefore submit the following recommendations:

- 1. That the committee be permitted to index the Red Book and correspondingly rearrange existing contents in order to provide easier access to the contents presently provided therein.
- 2. Be authorized to provide added information in response to questions and interpretations that the Red Book is presently silent on.
- 3. Be authorized to clarify certain phrasings such as to remove ambiquity without altering the intent of the existing contents of the Red Book.
- 4. Be authorized to formulate and include in the Red Book the specifics of a Constituent Royal Arch Chapter Installation Ceremony, in the interest of standardization of such ceremony among the various Chapters, such installation to be recited from memory when given.
- 5. That the finance-budget committee provide an additional \$500.00 to support travel and Per Diem for requested instructional meetings, at least two meetings annually of the committee on work, and such monies as may be required to implement the above recommendations.

We further suggest that open installation with other York Rite Bodies constitute an excellent opportunity for exemplifying the nature of York Rite work and urge those not so doing to give it much thought and consideration.



REPORT OF THE MASONIC RELATIONS COMMITTEE

(which was adopted)

To the Most Excellent Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons of Florida:

M: W:. George L. Myers, Grand Master of mason in Florida, called a meeting of all the Allied Orders in the State together with the Grand Lodge Officers and Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Jurisprudence Committee, in the Sheraton-Towers Hotel in Orlando on February 23, 1975.

Among those in attendance, were the Potentates of all the Shrine Temples, Imperial Marshall of The Shrine of North America, Monarchs of the Grottoes, Grand Marshall of the Grottoes of North America, The Grand Royal Patron of Amaranth, the Grand Patron of Order of Eastern Star, State Master Councilor, State Executive Officer and The Grand Master of DeMolay, Grand Commander, Grand Master, Grand High Priest of the York Rite, and Grand Recorder, representatives of the Red Cross of Constantine, Knights York Cross of Honour, National Soujourners, York Rite College, Sovereign Inspector General of the Scottish Rite of Florida and Jobs Daughters.

Grand Master Myers stated that the meeting was assembled for the purpose of promoting more cooperation and harmony with all the Lodges, The Grand Lodge, and all the Allied Orders of Freemasonry. After much constructive discussion, the ground work was laid for the formation of a mediatory organization for this purpose.

Unity between these various orders will bring peace and understanding so that they all together join in a perfect union for living the great life.

Master masons and others who were not members of the York Rite have been invited and attended York Rite District meeting as well as Subordinate functions. If your Lodge is not now offering this avenue of masonic relation we believe that by friendly suggestion it would be most happy to cooperate in furthering the objectives of Freemasonry through the York Rite.

Many Lodge Trestleboard and News Letters carry items concerning other Orders including the York Rite. York Rite Trestleboards carry items of news concerning activities of all orders within the immediate area and items of special interest within the District and/or State. This Chairman receives the Temple News, Dade City, published monthly and edited by Companion Doc McNally, and also The York Rite Trestleboard, Cocoa, Sanford, and others and items of interest concerning orders other than York Rite have appeared. This Committee would like to encourage more of this Unity of dissimination of news concerning all masonic activities planned for your local area. This Committee also would recommend that the Chairman of this Committee be placed on the mailing list to receive your news letters and Trestleboards. Also place on your mailing list all Masters and Wardens of Particular Lodges in your area. Enlist the cooperation of your Particular Lodges to enter York Rite news items and planned conferrals of degrees in the Lodge Trestleboard. This is being done in many lodges and we would like to see this expanded. The masonic relationship on the local level is excellent.

The York Rite was in the forefront in participating in the Masons for America Day held this year on September 21, 1974 at Melbourne. This great annual patriotic masonic day in a festival of pageantry and parade is the one of the finest endeavors of Masonic Relations in Action. This past September 4000 members of all facets of our great Fraternity along wth representatives of masonic sponsored orders came together in a unity of Masonic Americanism and fraternal fellowship proclaiming and renewing the rededication of their faith and love for our great Nation. This is an excellent masonic relation program.

The York Rite Light has carried the Itinerary of the Grand Master and other activities of the Grand Lodge. In mutual accord, The Florida Mason has carried articles written by R.E. Robert G. Weisenbarger Grand Commander, M.I. D. A. McClellan, Grand Master of the Grand Council and M.E. Earl G. Nicholson, Grand High Priest. This Committee approves this mutual exchange of articles as excellent Masonic Relations.

On September 8, 1974, the three head Officers of the York Rite along with other representatives of the York Rite attended and were accorded all the proper courtesies at the annual York Rite Day at Our Masonic Home in St. Petersburg for the monthly Board of Trustees meeting.

The York Rite College of Freemasonry were pleased to receive into membership during the Masonic year many members of the Grand Lodge family

including the Grand Master, Deputy Grand Master, Junior Grand Warden and Secretary, who have each promised to further the cause of York Rite Free-masonry.

In summation, Masonic Relations is simply the due respect and consideration extended to all our brethren, in any locale, individually or in groups, titled or not, as the warm hand of fellowship and brotherly love conveys the thinking of the heart and the spirit of the heart is the spirit of the soul.
