# REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON JURISPRUDENCE (Adopted)

To the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida:

Your Jurisprudence Committee has reviewed the two resolutions which have been circulated to the Constituent Chapters prior to this Grand Convocation. And find them to be in order and proper to be acted upon at this Grand Convocation.

The dispensations granted or denied by the Grand High Priest were found to be in good order.

The By-Law changes that were approved by the Grand High Priest were reviewed and found to be in order.

The three Executive Orders were found to be in order with one exception. Your committee recommends that in Executive Order #3 the line that reads "This ruling to be effective until nullified by appropriate legislation" be changed to read "This ruling to be effective until the next Grand Convocation at which time it will be nullified unless extended or adopted by the Grand Assembly."

The Grand High Priest's Recommendations were endorsed by your committee with the exception of Recommendation #5. We question the advisability of the Grand Secretary being the second signer on the checking account in the event of the incapacity of the Grand Treasurer. We would recommend that it be another officer, possibly the Junior Past Grand High Priest who shall be bonded. We believe that a resolution reflecting this opinion may be forthcoming this year.

Your committee further reports that Article XXIV of Grand Chapter provides that the newly elected and installed Grand High Priest be given a check for one-half of the amount which Grand Chapter allocates as expenses for his term of office, then when he has spent this amount to cover some, that he shall be given the other half of this amount allocated as expenses for the Grand High Priest for the year. Rule 55, Section 3 of Grand Chapter provides "The Grand Chapter shall advance an amount equal to one-half the annual allowance to the Grand High Priest upon his installation, and the remainder upon his request after December 1st. He shall not be required to account for these funds to Grand Chapter. For as much as Rule 55, Section 3 is in conflict with Article XXIV of the Grand Chapter, the Constitutional Article XXIV shall control and the Grand High

Priest shall comply with the said Article XXIV and the advances of remainder of one-half of his expense shall be when he has spent the one-half advanced upon installation and Rule 55, Section 3 shall be construed to provide this requirement.

The content of the Grand High Priests basic and supplementary report including the recommendations were reviewed. Your Jurisprudence Committee finds no legal concern for any of the content of this fine report.

We commend the Grand High Priest for a job well done. We find that he has complied with the Grand Chapter laws and regulations and is to be congratulated for a very successful year for Grand Chapter Masonty.

The District Deputy Grand High Priests were recognized by the M.E. Grand High Priest who expressed his thanks for the outstanding job they had done for the Craft in 1980-81.

#### REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON WORK

#### (Adopted)

To the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida:

We are pleased that through the efforts of the M.E. Grand High Priest, following activities were accomplished, primarily under the direction of the committee on work:

A - The host District/Area conferred portions of selected degrees at each of the area meetings. At the completion of each conferrel a question and answer period was provided with members of the committee on work presiding and providing information. We feel that considerable Masonic Education was imparted in this manner.

 $\,\mathrm{B}-\,\mathrm{The}$  committee is pleased that many chapters in the following area requested members of the committee to assist them in standardizing and perfecting their conferral

Although several of these schools were for the purpose of preparation for the area meeting cited above, many were not.

C - The committee is particularly pleased that in several districts, the District Deputies provided leadership toward the conducting of at least two schools of instruction during the year, under direction of this committee. In addition the District Deputies conducted educational sessions followed by a proficiency test covering general chapter information. Although this aspect was not under the auspices of the committee on work, the District Deputies are to be congratulated for their ferverency and zeal.

Companions, we again recommend that much more attention be given the RED BOOK and its contents. Although these RED BOOKS are issued only to the dias officers of the constituent chapters, the contents are for the benefit of the entire craft. We urge these officers to make known to their members the contents of this book.

Perhaps the highlight of the year regarding conferral of degrees was the conferral of the Royal Arch Degree by the Grand Officers and Past Grand Officers. This event in honor of the General Grand High Priest, Junior Wamsley Vandall was an example of outstanding ritual work. # REPORT OF THE YORK RITE PERMANENT HOME COMMITTEE To the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida:

This committee has been in existence for approximately four years and in past years outlined its goals in the following areas:

A - Securing property-which has been accomplished.

B - Achieving a manner in which the three Grand York Rite Bodies may function together as entity regarding this and subsequent property.

C - Assessing the view of the craft as to what facilities should be provided.

D - Defining and implementation of a plan of financing exclusive of Grand Bodies support.

Effort toward searching the laws, the regulations ETC in order to achieve the best possible manner by which the Grand Chapter, Grand Council and Grand Commandery can legally share in this activity are not yet complete. Without the legality of establishing such participation other activities have slowed.

We are pleased to report however that we have received an initial financial contribution of \$500.00 from the West Palm Beach Bodies. In addition the same bodies have contributed several Grand Officers jewels for display at such time as suitable facilities can be provided. Obviously other voluntary contributions would be appreciated. These may be forwarded to the chairman of this committee.

During the year the Grand Chapter of Florida was provided with an outstanding opportunity to achieve an excellent Masonic Library. With the intent of housing this library at the York Rite Permanent Home in the future, this committee was authorized by the Grand Commander, Grand Master and Grand High Priest to act on behalf of the Grand Bodies of Florida.

This outstanding Masonic Library is in excess of twenty five thousand (25,000) items of Masonic Lore. The library is owned by the General Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons International, but we in Florida have been intrusted with its care. It is presently housed in the York Rite Temple in Clearwater by virtue of their generous offer to provide space and tender loving care. A great deal of the work, sweet and tender loving care has already been put forth by the Clearwater members.

It has come to our attention that many volumes of proceedings of the Grand York Rite Bodies of Florida, which are presently retained at the Grand Secretary-Recorders of-fice might be better shown among the Masonic Brethern by becoming a part of this library, the committee therefor recommends that this be accomplished.

The committee has been offered the erection of a sign with lighting which will allow us to publicly display our ownership of the present property. It will be the goal of this committee to achieve early erection of such a sign. It is anticipated that the expenses associated with lighting the sign will be defrayed by voluntary contributions.

The committee recommends that the Grand Bodies take advantage of the availability of the York Rite Permanent property by having one or more open air functions at that location each year, until such time appropriate structures can be erected.

# BY-LAWS DISAPPROVED Tampa Cushing #13—Not in proper form

#### **EXECUTIVE ORDERS**

No. 1: I, Henry C. Bengel, Grand High Priest of The Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Florida do hereby issue the following Executive Order:

Where-as, Article XX, Section 8 of the Constitutions, Laws and Regulations; and Regulation No. 64 of the Laws, Rules and Regulations of The Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Florida were amended at the 133rd Annual Grand Convocation of The Grand Chapter held May 21-22, 1980.

And Where as, the Amendments, as adopted, deletes those portions referring to a 'Dispensation from the Grand High Priest'.

Now Therefore, in conformity there-to I order it unnecessary to obtain a Dispensation from the Grand High Priest to hold a Special Convocation to ballot on Petitions; providing that due and timely notice be given the members, that no business other than conferring the Degrees be transacted at said Convocation and that the Called Convocation be held in the Chapter Room of the Chapter holding jurisdiction over the petitioner.

This Executive Order is dated and issued this 9th day of June, A.D. 1980, A.I. 2510.

No. 2: Where-as, 'Suspensation For Non-Payment Of Dues' indicates a failure or neglect which could be ours.

And Where-as, reports reveal a statewide membership gain for the first nine months of 1980 of only one hundred and eighty (180). A gain that could be entirely wiped out if a concerted and conscientious effort is not made to reduce the number suspended in previous years.

And Where-as, Section 70 of the Laws, Rules and Regulations of The Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Florida directs each High Priest to appoint a Delinquency Committee with a specific duty to inquire into, consider and report to the Chapter its' recommendation concerning all delinquent members.

Therefore, with the highest regard for all members, I here-by Order that strict adherence be given the procedures as stated in Section 70 of the Laws, Rules and Regulations of The Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Florida and that every effort be made to reduce suspensions.

I further recommend that a Committee be appointed in each Chapter to personally contact each former member who has been suspended for non-payment of dues and ascertain, in the most tactful manner, the reason and endeavor to rectify any misunderstanding connected there-with.

Witness my hand and Seal this 17th day of October A.D. 1980, A.I. 2510.

No. 3: Where-as, The Laws, Rules and Regulations of Constituent Chapters, as stated in Section 8, require a ¼ majority vote to secure the adoption of a proposed amendment.

And Where-as, Article XXIII, Uniform Code of By-Laws, requires a 33 majority vote to secure adoption of a proposed amendment.

And Where-as, Article XXI, Sections 4 and 5 of the Constitution, Laws and Regulations of The Grand Chapter requires a 34 majority vote to secure adoption of a proposed amendment.

Therefore be it resolved, to correct this contradiction: It is my order that all Constituent Chapters require a % majority vote to secure adoption of a proposed amendment.

This ruling to be effective until nullified by appropriate legislation.

Although we sustained a loss of 50 in total membership during 1980, still, it is good to look back. For, as we rejoice in the successes and examine the failures we find the criteria by which we are enabled to formulate progressive plans for the future. Each fleeting moment, like the dawn of a new day, gives us fresh opportunity to extend the successes and by avoiding the failures perpetuate our heritage and promote the great interests of our Institution.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

- That the Exemplification of assigned portions of the Degrees at Area Meetings be continued.
- 2. That the Grand Chapter Masonic Education Program be continued.
- 3. That the District Deputies be authorized and encouraged to formulate and hold 'One Day York Rite Classes' in the several areas of the State. That all Chapters within the area be encouraged to participate in the Conferrals and that Grand Chapter contribute \$100.00 to assist in defraying the expense of each such Class with a limit of one Class in each area per year.
- 4. That the Grand Treasurer be required to furnish 'Quarterly Reports' to the Grand High Priest, Grand Secretary and Members of the Finance Committee, all of whom, after due study submit recommendations to assure that our finances earn a maximum return of interest and-or dividends.
- That all accounts of the Grand Chapter be changed to authorize withdrawals by the Grand Secretary in case of the protracted absence or incapacity of the Grand Treasurer.
- That a Committee be appointed to plan and promote a Masonic Family Week-End
  Festival to be held on the Grand Chapter property in Cleremont to which all of the
  Masonic Family would be invited.
- 7. That each Grand Officer and District Deputy submit a Capitular Year End Report covering observations and recommendations together with an evaluation of personal contributions and activities. That copies of this report be sent to the Dais Officers and to the Grand Secretary for a continuing file.
- That the Resolutions Committee, composed of a legal advisor as Chairman and the Grand High Priest be continued.

Purpose: To clarify the intent, eliminate duplication and assure the legality of all Proposed Resolutions, Procedure as follows:

- (1) All Proposed Resolutions must be received by the Grand Secretary prior to February 1st of each year.
- (2) The Grand Secretary, immediately upon receipt of a Proposed Resolution, will mail copies to the Grand High Priest and the Chairman of the Resolutions Committee.
- (3) The Grand High Priest, within ten days, studies the Proposal and reports his findings to the Chairman of the Resolutions Committee.
- (4) If the Proposed Resolution is in proper form the Grand Secretary is so notified and the Resolution takes its normal course.
- (5) If the Resolution is not in proper form the Chairman of the Resolutions Committee notifies the Proposer, setting forth the necessary changes. Copies to be mailed to the Grand High Priest and the Grand Secretary.
- (6) The Proposer, after making the necessary corrections, mails the 'Revised Resolution' to the Grand Secretary for processing.

# REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON ROYAL ARCH RESEARCH ASSISTANCE (Adopted)

To the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida:

As Chairman of the Royal Arch Research Assistance Philantrophy program of the Grand Chapter of Florida, I submit the following report of progress and activities for this year, 1980-81 which climaxes our fourth year of participation of the Grand Chapter of Fla. Our M.E.G.H.P. Bengel saw fit to continue my chairmanship for which I sincerely appreciate. With Royal Arch Masonry becoming identified with such a worthwhile human endeavor, we can realize that the joy of helping others is a natural commitment of our teachings and our organization will be stronger in the eyes of our membership and in the eyes of the public.

Service is the watchword of Royal Arch Masonry and embraces not only service to its constituent bodies, but also in the broader area of human needs.

During this past capitular year 23 Royal Arch Chapters have participated in the R.A.R.A. program by making donations in the form of regular contributions, memorial gifts or Life Sponsorships. Exactly the same as the year before and are likely the chapters that are viable and active in all other areas. These 23 Chapters donated a grand total of \$5,349.16 with \$3,724.16 in general donations, \$365.00 in memorial contributions and \$1,260.00 in the purchase of Life Sponsorships. There were (42) life sponsorships purchased this year giving a grand total of 92 since the sponsorship resolution was passed two years ago. A year ago at Grand Chapter our Gen. Grand High Priest indicated a Life sponsorship certificate design would be forthcoming through Gen. Grand Chapter. As of this writing I have received nothing in this direction, however, in talking recently to our Gen. Grand Secretary, he suggested that I proceed with a design, submitting it to him at which time he would send it to press for reproduction. Therefore, I recommend that our new chairman, our incoming Grand High Priest and M.E. Walter Winchester proceed to this end. It is not encouraging to the members toward the further purchase of sponsorships when no certificates are forth coming. Our Gen. Gr. Sec. McGaughey has a list of the 92 who have purchased them and will be mailed directly to each one when available. Tampa Cushing #3 should be commended in that 68 of the 92 life sponsorships purchased have been to their credit!

The new 16 MM Movie "Lonley World" produced by Gen. Gr. Chapter depicting the Auditory perception deficit or R.A.R.A. story has been shown in different areas and is excellent in educating our membership about our philantropy and is available for showing by chapter chairman. There have been no inquiries for the use of the slide presentations and equipment that is also good as an education medium.

# REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON AD-HOC ROTATION (Adopted)

To the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida: To: The Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Florida

The Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Florida

The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida

This committee was appointed to study the feasibility and to present recommendations for reducing the length of the Grand Sessions in the interest of conserving money and placing the Grand Bodies of the York Rite on an annual rotating basis for opening, conducting business and closing of the Grand Session, so that the same Grand Body would not open or close two years in a row.

In order to institute such a change it will be necessary that all three of the Grand Bodies be on the same operating procedure. As of now, the Grand Chapter and Grand Commandery meet for two days while the Grand Council meets for one day.

A concentus of opinions gathered from knowledgeable York Rite Masons while we traveled about the state, was that if properly planned, each Grand Body could conduct its business to a successful conclusion in one day. Further, it was the opinion of many that the Grand Sessions be held on Thursday, Friday and Saturday because this would result in less time being taken from their employment or vacation time by the delegates to attend the Sessions. This is a worthy recommendation to be taken into consideration in instituting any changes. It is a fact that many others States conduct their annual Sessions in this manner. Several of our committee have attended out of state Grand Session for the purpose of studying the manner in which they conduct simular Sessions as indicated above. During these visits we have talked to representatives from other Grand Jurisdictions who have informed us that they also planning on reducing the length of their Session in the face of the rising inflation rate.

This year the M.W. Grand Lodge, F. & A. M. of Florida has reduced its Annual Grand Communication to two days because of the spiraling increases in the rate of inflation that has placed the cost of travel, lodging and food almost beyond the reach of the individual delegates, and the costs to Grand Lodge is so prohibitive to attempt to continue the Grand Communication as in the past.

We, as well as Grand Lodge must recognize that our sole income is derived from the fees and per-capita taxes that we assess against our Chapters, Councils and Commandery's. To continue as we have in the past, would in the face of the continuing inflationary rate, burden them with an undue hard-ship of increased fees and per-capita tax to meet the increased cost of an extended Session. It behooves us to take this situation under advisement as soon as possible.

A review of the laws of the three Grand Bodies indicate that the Constitutions of the Grand Chapter and Grand Council permits the above changes in our Grand Session without further amendments thereto. However, Chapter II, Section 49, titled "Time and Place". of the Constitution, Laws and Regulations of the Grand Commandery of Florida as now written, prohibits such changes as it requires the Grand Commandery to meet beginning on a Monday. An amendment to this section would be necessary to implement these changes. (Amendment has been submitted.).

A further review of the financial report of the cost for travel and per-diem for the Grand Session held in West Palm Beach, Florida in May, 1980 reflects the following costs:

Under the proposed change as outlined in this report, the expenses of the Grand Council would not change in this item as it already operates on a one day basis. However, it is estimated that a savings of at least 40% of the per-Diam could be realized by the Grand Chapter and Grand Commandery for an approximately \$7,669.08; Grand Chapter \$3,844.03; Grand Commandery \$3,825.04. While this is just a rough estimate because we do not have a break down between mileage, per-dien and Guests expenses the savings is a step in the right direction toward easing the financial burden.

This committee submits the following recommendations:

- A. That the Grand Bodies adopt this report.
- B. That the incoming Grand Heads of these Grand York Rite Bodies for 1982-1983 consider:
  - 1. Reducing the Grand Session to one day for each of the Grand Bodies.
  - Consider meeting on either Monday-Tuesday-Wednesday or Thursday-Fríday-Saturday.
  - 3. That the Grand Bodies be placed on an annual rotating basis for the opening and closing of the Grand Session.
  - 4. That a registration fee of one dollar (\$1.00) be charged each delegate for each body in which he registers. A maximum fee not to exceed three dollars (\$3.00). These monies to be used to help defray the costs of the Grand Session.
- C. That an Ad-Hoc Committee be appointed at the 1981 session for the continuing study of this situation.

The committee would like to take this opportunity to thank the Grand Commander, M.I. Grand Master and the M.E. Grand High Priest for giving us the priviledge of serving on this committee.

#### PUBLIC INSTALLATIONS

"65. In case of Public Installation of Officers of a Chartered Chapter, the oath of office shall be given and at the proper time the High Priest shall be presented to his Companions, but the Grand Honots and the eight questions shall be omitted." be amended to read

#### **PUBLIC INSTALLATIONS**

65. "In case of Public Installation the Officers shall collectively assume the vow of office. The High Priest Elect, shall answer the eight questions. At the proper time he shall be presented to his Companions, but will not be entitled to Grand Honors in public."
