GRAND HIGH PRIEST'S REPORT TO THE 1987 ANNUAL GRAND CONVOCATION

This past year it has been my privilege and responsibility to serve this Grand Chapter and this has been a year of great pleasure and personal satisfaction. As my year comes to a close and I prepare to pass on the reins of leadership to my successor, I reflect with much joy on the events past. As of this time, I have traveled over 26,500 miles making official visits and attending Masonic meetings and functions, in state, out of state, and out of country. Even so, I regret that I was unable to visit the Companions in six of our Chapters, due to unavoidable circumstances. Each visit was an individual experience and the extension of personal warmth and Brotherhood from all of the Companions was indeed special, almost something tangible.

To our out-of-state visitors and Distinguished Guests, I extend warm Fraternal greetings and wish for you a most pleasant visit. It is my most sincere wish that your stay with us be a special occasion, and that you will return home with happy memories of your visit here. You do us honor by your presence.

It was my goal this year to continue the fine programs of my predecessors and to promote especially Masonic Unity and Masonic Education. I personally feel that knowledgable Masons working together can accomplish almost anything.

This past year we increased the number of Area/District meetings from five to eight, with the addition of three Friday night meetings. This seems to have been a move in the right direction, lessening the distance many Companions have had to travel. We held lively and informative discussion group meetings giving all of the Companions opportunity to air questions, comments, problems, and concerns. Valuable insights to our needs have been identified and I hope these areas of concern can adequately be addressed by our succeeding leadership.

THANKS

In contemplating Thanks and counting my blessings for this past year, I find it an almost impossible task. Perhaps "COOPERATION" has been the key word. Working with our Right Eminent Grand Commander, John Fletcher, and with our Most Illustrious Grand Master, George Swartz has been a rewarding experience. Their dedication has been an inspiration. Our Grand Secretary, Howard Bennett has offered invaluable counsel and assistance during this past year and he and the office staff are certainly to be commended. I owe a special "Thank You" to Most Excellent Companion Duane Young for my appointment as Grand Sentinel and my start in the Grand Chapter Line. To the Grand Chapter Officers, Thank you for your active participation this past year and your promotion of my programs. For my wife, Carole-Sue, this has been a new experience, and her understanding and enthusiastic support has been a key ingredient of what success I may claim. My District Deputies are a very special group, one any of our Past Grand High Priests would have been proud of. They have been dedicated and have promoted all of my goals and endeavors. In many cases they have gone out of their way to accommodate me and make my visits memorable. We were all saddened at the untimely loss of Right Excellent Companion John Harris of District 3, but Right Excellent Companion Dickerhoof stepped in admirably and continued his work. They all deserve an extra measure of appreciation. It is no secret why I wish to thank and congratulate the convention Committee; "An excellent job guys." Finally a sincere appreciation is extended to all of the Companions of this Grand Jurisdiction for their cooperation and support, and for their warm reception at each and every visit.

STATE OF THE CRAFT

Throughout the state the degree of proficiency and activity varies considerably. Some Chapters are virtual showcases of Royal Arch Masonry and some Chapters show need of assistance. On the whole, Royal Arch Masonry is alive and well in Florida. For the year 1986, we suffered a net loss of 123 Companions with 15 Chapters showing gains and 23 Chapters showing a loss. Three Chapters held their own. With almost 500 Exaltations one would expect growth, however deaths and suspensions for NPD exacted heavy tolls. We obviously must turn this around or face serious problems in the future. Grand Chapter finances are barely holding their own and it is a sad fact that we must consider an increase in the Per Capita tax very soon or cut back in some of the programs we sponsor.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. That serious thought be given to changing the method we use to observe Religious Affirmation Day. This program is not being carried out as was hoped.
- 2. That the Finance Committee prepare a report on the needs of the Grand Chapter for the next five years and present recommendations for increase of Per Capita tax to properly fund our programs and activities over this period.
- 3. That a joint Masonic Education Committee be appointed with the Grand Council and Grand Commandery for preparation of short educational programs to be presented at regular convocations and also to prepare a York Rite Mentor's Manual for the benefit of our members. That a system of Masonic Education be presented to Companions and Sir Knights during the conferring of degrees in One Day Classes.
- 4. That the method of determining Gold Key award recipients be modified so that each District might qualify for one. That a maximum of one recipient per District be allowed, and then only if justified by a proper nomination, approved by the District Deputy. That the Grand High Priest be allowed a separate five "at large" awards if he so desires, (TOTAL OF 16).

Companions, this past year has been an experience which I will treasure. I thank the Supreme Grand High Priest for allowing me this great privilege. It is my hope that each of you extend to my successor the cooperation and Brotherhood that has been given me. It will now be my privilege to return to the "Level" and with each of you, continue to serve Masonry in such capacity as I may be able.

ACTIVITIES AND VISITS

REPORT OF JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE

(Adopted)

To the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida:

The Committee, having examined the Most Excellent Grand High Priest's report, commends him in general for his actions while in office.

In two cases, dispensations were granted allowing the movement of a Charter without sufficient time to allow for ten day notification of constituent members per Article XII Section 1. Paragraph G. In both cases, the dispensations were requested at a late hour, thus placing the Grand High Priest in a position such that his only other choice would have been to deny a worthwhile action.

In a third case, a dispensation to allow election of a new High Priest was granted in error because the High Priest had tendered his resignation based on impaired health. Per Article XVIII of the Grand Chapter Regulations, "the first three offices cannot be vacated by resignation." The Jurisprudence Committee recognizes that there may be occasions where a person may have become impaired physically or mentally to the point that he cannot preside. In such case, resignation (if acceptable to the Grand Chapter or the Grand High Priest when Grand Chapter is not in session) would be a logical result. In turn the Regulation may need amendment to include such a situation.

The Grand High Priest approved several changes in by-laws in a proper manner.

The Grand High Priest made positive use of his right to proclaim the recognition of a day in honor of long time York Rite Contributors.

The Grand High Priest made Charitable Contributions to Non-Masonic causes across the state from the Grand Chapter Charity Fund. The Jurisprudence Committee is not aware of the origination of this fund, or of the last previous time it was put to positive use. Until such time as the intent of establishment of this fund can be researched, Jurisprudence suggests that the Grand High Priest limit charitable expenditures from this fund to approximately ten percent (10%) of the fund value per year.

In summary, while the three dispensations were granted in error, the intent of the Grand High Priest was for the good of the Craft. In turn these errors point up the need for improvement of the Constituent Chapters timing in requesting dispensations and also the need for some amendment to expand our Regulations to cover the rare conditions of human frailty.

In addition, Jurisprudence reviewed two Resolutions regarding Constitution Laws and Regulations by Wm. A. Bessent III and a Resolution emanating from Clearwater Chapter No. 45 regarding the requiring of each Chapter to prepare an annual budget. Jurisprudence finds all three of these resolutions to be in legal order.

1987 BUDGET & FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT (Adopted)

To The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida:

This Committee met at the Holiday Inn on Saturday, 23 May 1987, at 9:00 a.m. The conclusions and recommendations of the Committee are set forth and explained in the following paragraphs.

- 1. The general custodianship of the FY 1986-87 Budget Year was approved which included disbursement of funds from the General Fund under a Computer Cost Code identified as "700." This represents authorized, unbudgeted funds which is not included in the printout totals.
- 2. Funded the Budget & Finance Committee for a called meeting in conjunction with the Dais Meeting usually held in February of each year to the following extent.
- (a) An average of \$100.00 each for the second ranking officer in each Grand York Rite Body, one Budget & Finance Committee Member from each Grand York Rite Body, one Auditor and the Convention Chairman. With the three Grand Presiding Officers, the Treasurer and the Secretary Recorder, a total of thirteen persons will be summoned to that meeting. The three Grand Presiding Officers, the Treasurer and the Secretary Recorder are not funded in this appropriation.

The funding is based upon an average distance traveled of 200 miles at .21 per mile one way, an average per diem of one night lodging at \$38.00 and an average of \$20.00 for meals.

- 3. Authorized payment of \$250.00 each from the three Grand York Rite Bodies to Companion Alfred R. Peebles for the special audit accompanying the change of Grand Treasurers. The same to be disbursed from the General Funds (700) as the audit was completed during FY 1986-87 but bills were not available until FY 1987-88.
- 4. Recommend approval of the present accounting system.
- 5. Commended Russell W. Houston for Thirty-Five Years of faithful service as Grand Treasurer. Recommend Grand Treasurer, Emeritus, in all three Grand Bodies. Welcomed Roy R. Wright, Jr. as his replacement.
- 6. Recommend that the old Grand Chapter Collars and Aprons, and the Grand Council Collars and Aprons, be donated to the Grand Chapter and the Grand Council of Alaska at a cost to them of \$1.00 cmb.

By proclamation dated 22nd day of May 1986, the Most Excellent Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florial designated Religious Affirmation Day be observed by each Constituent Chapter at a religious required to the Constituent Chapter at the Constit Constituent Chapter at a religious service during the Month of October 1986.

In the past years your committee on Masonic Relations has reported on activities within the Craft. This year we should like to broaden the scope of the report and bring to your attention certain facts of actions in the profain world which may have great bearing upon the Craft.

Several years ago the Courts ruled that the Jaycees must allow women into full membership. It was decided that many important business contacts were made within their meetings and to deny women access to these contacts was unfair.

In February of this year, the highest court of Neww York ruled that it was illegal for the Century, Union League and University clubs of Manhattan to ban women. The unanimous decision of the state Court of Appeals ruled that the clubs were too large and are too entangled in business transactions to be allowed to restrict their membership.

Later this year we saw that the Supreme Court ruled that California could force Rotary, an international service organization, to accept women as members. This did not abridge freedom of association.

Right here in Orlando for the past year we have seen a continuing attack on the Shrine and its charitable activities. The Shrine is the most recognized organization within the Masonic Fraternity.

To the Most Excellent Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Florida:

The following is a report of the progress and activities of the Royal Arch Research Assistance. The Companions of the Most Excellent Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Florida continue to support the philanthropy of the General Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons, International. This is the tenth year that this Grand Jurisdiction has participated in this charitable effort. I am sincerely grateful that the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Most Excellent Companion Gary Brent Cull appointed me Chairman of our great charity.

During the past Capitular year twenty-six Royal Arch Chapters and four honorary bodies of this Grand Jurisdiction supported the Royal Arch Research Assistance by making donations in the form of regular and memorial contributions. This effort compares favorably with that of last year. During this reporting period a grand total of \$7236.99 was contributed of which \$6586.99 was made as regular contributions and \$650.00 was made as memorial contributions. The added participation of several Chapters that had not contributed before was offset by the lack of participation this year of several Chapters that had been very active in the program in previous years. An inquiry is being made concerning this change. There were a number of showings of the film "The Lonely World", however, a greater effort can be made in this area to ensure that our new members have an opportunity to see the film and learn of some of the work being done on behalf of the General Grand Chapter by Dr. Jack Willeford and his associates.

This year we have issued 38 "Life Sponsor" Certificates which brings the overall total to 281 certificates issued to date. The steady participation in purchase of Life Sponsor Certificates has contributed greatly to the success of the entire program. Again, I am pleased to report that in National ratings with other Grand Jurisdictions, the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Florida ranks fourth in regular contributions and ninth in memorial contributions. In order to maintain these notable ratings we must make every effort to insure this charitable program continues to receive the proper emphasis and attention. There is much room for improvement. Participation by the nineteen Chapters that did not participate this year would have a notable impact and make a definite difference. The added participation would help us maintain the position we have attained and possible could help us improve that position. The true and legal name of such is "The Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of Florida" (note, however, that Art. 1, Sec. 1, Digest of Masonic Law, recites "The Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of the State of Florida," but the State Act that gives it a corporate existence does not contain "the State of"). The Rulings and Decisions of the Grand High Priests of this Grand Chapter, when approved by the Grand Chapter in Grand Convocation convened, and as printed in its Chapter, when approved to be in full force and effect, and binding unless contrary to later-enacted Proceedings, are declared to be in full force and effect, and binding unless contrary to later-enacted Laws of this Grand Chapter or further Rulings and Decisions of a Grand High Priest. 1.06 Non-Profit Policy. The declared policy of this Grand Chapter is that it is not a profit-making business nor profit-making organization, and should not - and will not - engage in a profit-making activity for itself nor for its membership. No solicitations of a non-Masonic nor non-charitable character shall be made, except upon authority of this Grand Chapter and by specific vote of the members thereof in Grand Convocation convened. Provided, however, that nothing herein shall prevent support of programs of a generally charitable and benevolent nature, such as the Royal Arch Research Assistance. [1987]

2.01 Name and Style. The name and style of this Grand Chapter shall be as set forth in Article I of its Constitution, and as set forth in Chapter 28326, Laws of Florida, Acts of 1953. [1987]

3.01 Grand Chapter Membership. Membership in this Grand Chapter shall be as set forth in Article III, Sec. 2, of its Constitution; Honorary Membership or Rank conferred pursuant to Regulation or Bylaw shall not confer the right to vote on matters before the Grand Chapter. [1987]

4.01 Jurisdiction and Powers. This Grand Chapter shall have such jurisdiction and powers as are set forth in its Constitution and these Regulations. [1987]

4.02 Jurisdiction over Degrees. This Grand Chapter holds exclusive control and jurisdiction over the Masonic Degrees of Mark Master, (Virtual) Past Master, Most Excellent Master, Royal Arch Mason, and Order of High Priesthood within the borders of the State of Florida; it has other jurisdiction and powers as set forth in Article II of its Constitution. 5.01 Grand Chapter Officers. The Officers of this Grand Chapter shall be as set forth in its Constitution. [1987]

6.01 Chief Executive Officer. The Grand High Priest shall be the Chief Executive Officer of this Grand Chapter, with such powers, duties, and prerogatives as set forth in its Constitution and these Regulations. [1987]

7.01 Grand Council Officers. The Grand King and Grand Scribe, together with the Grand High Priest, shall constitute the Grand Council of this Grand Chapter; they shall have such other powers and duties as its Constitution and these Regulations provide. [1987]

8.01 Chief Financial Officer. The Grand Treasurer shall be the Chief Financial Officer of this Grand Chapter, and shall have such powers and duties as its Constitution and these Regulations provide. [1987]

9.01 Chief Clerical Officer. The Grand Secretary shall be the Chief Clerical Officers of this Grand Chapter, and shall have direct supervision of all clerical staff; he shall have such other powers and duties as its Constitution and these Regulations provide. [1987]

11.01 Subordinate Grand Officers. The Subordinate Grand Officers of this Grand Chapter shall be as provided in its Constitution and these Regulations, together with the powers and duties therein-provided. [1987]

CHAPTER TWELVE - GRAND CHAPTER CONVOCATIONS AND PROCEEDINGS

12.01 Convocation and Proceedings. The Grand Convocations of this Grand Chapter shall be holden as provided in its Constitution and these Regulations, and its Proceedings recorded and published in accord therewith. [1987]

12.02 Mileage and Per diem. Mileage and Per diem shall be governed by the following: (Note: this includes former Regs. 55 and 56) [1987]

a. General Provisions.

(I) Each Grand Officer and one Representative of each Chartered Chapter attending the Grand Convocation of this Grand Chapter, all members of Committees, Past Grand High Priests, and District Deputies, who are in attendance in no other capacity, shall be entitled to receive from the funds of Grand Chapter such funds for mileage and per diem as may be recommended by the Budget and Finance Committee and approved by the delegates. Such Mileage to be calculated one way for the distance from the site of their Chapter or their place of residence, whichever is nearer, to the place of the Grand Convocation. Those who reside outside the limits of the state will be paid from the site of their Chapter or their place of entry into the state, whichever is nearer to the place of the Grand Convocation. [1984]

- (2) Grand Line Officers, District Deputies, and other companions, when on Grand Chapter business and authorized by the Grand High Priest or Grand Chapter, shall receive from the funds of Grand Chapter the same mileage for the use of their car as is recommended by the Finance and Budget Committee for attending an Annual Grand Convocation.
- (3) The Grand Chapter shall advance an amount equal to one-half the annual allowance to the Grand High Priest upon his installation, and after spending same he shall receive the balance. He shall not be required to account for these funds to Grand Chapter.
- b. Calculation of Mileage. The representatives of Chartered Chapters in attendance at Grand Chapter who are entitled to mileage shall be paid for actual mileage from the location of their respective Chapters. Past Grand Officers now residing or sojourning outside the State of Florida shall be paid mileage from the point where entry is made into the State of Florida and per diem only for the days actually in attendance at Grand Chapter. [1987]
- 13.01 Committees. The Grand High Priest shall appoint such Committees as are required by the Constitution of this Grand Chapter and such other Committees as may be required for the orderly transactions of Grand Chapter. [1987]
- 14.01 General Provisions. The administration of revenues and finances shall be as provided in the Constitution of this Grand Chapter, and as more specifically provided in these Regulations. [1987]
- 15.01 Statement of Policy. Consistent with the Constitution, Laws, and Regulations of this Grand Chapter, it is the policy of this Grand Chapter to maintain fraternal accord with all regular Grand Jurisdictions of Royal Arch Masons, agreeable to requirements of the General Grand Chapter and the Ancient Usages of Capitular Masonry. [1987]
- 19.01 Chapter Officers. Each subordinate Chapter shall have such elected and appointed Officers as provided by the Constitution of this Grand Chapter; the powers and duties of such Officers being as provided by said Constitution and these Regulations. [1987]
- 20.01 Committees. The High Priest of a Chapter shall appoint such committees as may be required by the laws of this Grand Chapter, the Bylaws of his Chapter, or as he may otherwise deem necessary to the business of his Chapter. [1987]
- 21.01 Powers and Duties. The King and Scribe of a constituent Chapter shall, together with the High Priest, constitute the Council of that Chapter; they shall have such other powers and duties as provided by the Constitution, Laws, and Regulations of this Grand Chapter, the Bylaws of the Chapter, and Ancient Usuage. [1987]
- 23.01 High Priest To Appoint. The High Priest of each Constituent Chapter shall appoint such appointed Officers as are provided for in the Constitution of this Grand Chapter, which Officers shall serve their appointed terms at the will and pleasure of the High Priest. Vacancies in such offices shall be filled by further appointment of the High Priest, who shall Install such appointees; vacancies so filled shall be reported to the Grand Secretary by the Secretary of the Chapter, and under its Seal. [1987]
- 24.05 Uniform Code. Except as otherwise provided in these Regulations, all Chapters shall adopt and conform to the Uniform Code of Bylaws for Subordinate Chapters set forth in Appendix A of these Regulations; upon amendment or revision or same by this Grand Chapter, subordinate Chapters will amend existing Bylaws in conformity to such Grand Chapter action. Amendment pursuant to this Regulation shall require only notice to the members of the Chapter of the change in the Uniform Code, entry on the Minutes of the Chapter prior to inclusion in the Bylaws of the Chapter, and notice to the Grand Secretary that such amendment has been made; no vote of the Chapter is required.
- 29.01 Chapter Representatives. The representatives of each Constituent Chapter to the Annual Grand Convocation and Special Convocations of the Grand Chapter shall be the High Priest, King, and Scribe of such Chapter, or their lawfully authorized proxies; the High Priest shall receive mileage and per diem as provided herein. [1987]
- 31.01 Eligibility. Candidates for the Capitular Degrees shall be chosen from Petitioners who are members, in good standing, of a Regular Lodge of Master Masons and who shall satisfy the jurisdictional requirements of the Constitution and Regulations of this Grand Chapter. While membership in a Regular Lodge is persuasive proof of good character, due inquiry into the fitness of all Candidates will be made. [1987]
- 32.01 Fees and Refunds. No work may be conferred upon, nor communicated to, a candidate unless he shall have first paid the fee prescribed in Article XIX, Sec. 1, of the Constitution of this Grand Chapter, or such greater fee as may be prescribed by the Bylaws of the Chapter petitioned. All fees submitted with a rejected Petition will be forthwith refunded to the petitioner. [1987]

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35.01 Refund of Fees. Rejection of a Petition shall be followed by notification to the Petitioner of such action, and the refund of any and all the second of the petitioner of such action. action, and the refund of any and all fees accompanying such Petition. [1987]

35.02 Jurisdiction Retained. A Chapter retains jurisdiction over rejected material. A Petitioner rejected by a Chapter may not Petition another Chapter absent Waiver of Jurisdiction. A rejected Petition may not be re-submitted within twelve months of the date of its rejection [1987]

38.01 Courtesy Work. A Chapter may confer any and all of the Capitular Degrees upon a Candidate elected by another Regular Chapter result. REPORT OF THE CONSTITUTION, INDEX, AND UPDATE COMMITTEE (Adopted)

To the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida:

Your Committee initially began the implementation of the revisions and updates set forth in its report Your Committee initially began the implementation of the revisions and updates set forth in its report to the last Grand Convocation. However, a review of the existing Constitution and Regulations of the Grand Chapter revealed substantial variations in indexing and usage as has, over the years, caused confusion. Your Committee concluded, after consultation, that it was advisable to initiate an update and revision of the existing Constitution and Regulations of this Grand Chapter, the goal being to arrive at a form which will facilitate reference and revision how and in the future. Further, it was felt advisable that ease of reference between the Digest of Masonic Law of the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge, F.&A.M. of Florida, and this Grand Chapter's Constitution and Regulations should be effected where possible by implementing the same indexing and outlining system - thus perpetuating the intimate relationship between Ancient Craft and Capitular Masonry.

It was agreed that Excellent Companion William Bessent would undertake the revision and submit his

It was agreed that Excellent Companion William Bessent would undertake the revision and submit his recommendations and proposals to Most Excellent Brent Cull, Most Excellent Henry Bengel, the Excellent Howard Bennett for review and further evaluation.

Excellent Companion Bessent placed the entire Constitution, Laws, and Regulations in computer excellent Companion Bessent placed the entire Constitution, Laws, and Regulations in computer data storage, which task was accomplished through the typing skills of his secretary, (Mrs.) Melissa Kelly. He then prepared and documented a revision of the materials, together with a Resolution proposing the adoption thereof. 
