

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON ROYAL ARCH RESEARCH ASSISTANCE 1987-1988

Adopted

To the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida:

Following is the report of the progress of the Royal Arch Research Assistance charity. The companions of the Most Excellent Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Florida continue to support the philanthropy of the General Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons International. This is the eleventh year that this grand jurisdiction has participated in this charitable effort.

During this reporting period thirty Royal Arch Chapters and two honorary bodies along with the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Florida have supported the Royal Arch Research Assistance by making donations in the form of regular and memorial contributions. The results this year compare favorably with the results of last year. During this Capitular a grand total of \$6943.34 was contributed, of which \$6143.34 was for regular contributions and \$800.00 was made as memorial contributions. Contributions made this year were \$393.65 less than that collected last year. The increase in the number of Chapters participating did not increase the amount collected but it may have been the reason that we came so close to last year's total.

Reports received indicate that there were several showings of the film "The Lonely World". The opportunity exists for many more showings of the film. It is a vehicle by which you can get the word out to the public of what our charity is and does. The first copy of the film that has not been available for several years, has now turned up and provides us with a greater capability for scheduled showings of the film. If it has not been shown in your area in the past several years, then it is time to schedule a showing whereby you may bring some of our new companions up to date.

This year we have issued twenty Life Sponsor certificates which brings the overall total to 301 certificates issued to date. This slow but steady participation in our Life Sponsor Certificate purchase program has had a direct effect on the overall program and has led to these totals.

I am pleased to report that in national ratings with other grand juristictions, the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Florida ranks fourth in regular contributions and tenth in memorial contributions. Only through the participation of the other eleven chapters can we hope to make a better showing. There is no reason that each chapter in this grand jurisdiction cannot join with the rest of the companions in supporting our great charity. Participation by those chapters that did not send in a contribution during this year would have put us well over the top. Our members also have the opportunity of having fund raising projects that are within the guidelines that we have to maintain as required by the M.W. Grand Lodge of F & A.M. of Florida, and help can also be solicited from all of our Blue Lodges and other Appendant Orders.





RESOLUTION (Adopted)

To the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida:

The following Resolution zealously proposed:

WHEREAS, it is deemed advisable to clarify the intent and purpose of the framers of the following Regulation in regard to eligibility for the Gold Key Award;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it Resolved that the following Amendment be made to Regulation 43.04, Constitution and Regulations:

(Changes, Additions, or re-numbered sections are underlined)

43.04 Gold Key Award.

The Grand High Priest shall, at the Annual Grand Convocation, or at such other times and places as he may select, present Gold Key Awards to Capitular Masons of the several Chapters of this Grand Jurisdiction, which Awards shall be regulated as follows:

- a. Criteria. Criteria for choosing recipients of the Award shall be:
- The nominee's regular attendance at the undertakings of the York Rite Bodies (including the Symbolic Lodge);
- 2. His activities in the work of the several committees of this Chapter or Grand Chapter;
- 3. His general support of the fundamentals of the Masonic Fraternity and Capitular Masonry in particular;
- 4. His leadership in matters Masonic, particularly Capitular;
- 5. His efforts toward membership recruitment to the benefit of his, or other, Chapters; and
- 6. His participation in ritualistic matters, whether performance, organization, or support.
- b. Number of Awards. The maximum number of Awards presented during the term of each Grand High Priest shall be one for each twenty-five Exaltations in the Grand Jurisdiction. Such maximum number shall be apportioned to the Capitular Districts on the basis of one per each twenty-five Exaltations in each such District, based upon returns submitted to the office of the Grand Secretary no later than 1 April of each year (for this purpose, the computation of Exaltations shall be from 1 April to 1 April).
- c. Apportionment to Chapters. Within each Capitular District, Awards shall be apportioned to Chapters consistent with the Exaltations in each; Chapters shall be entitled to Nominate one recipient for each twenty-five exaltations by that Chapter; Exaltations of less than twenty-five may be carried forward from year-to-year until the minimum is attained. (1988)
- d. Nomination. Any Chapter or any Capitular Mason may make nominations for the Award by forwarding same to the office of the Grand Secretary before 1 April of each year. The Grand Secretary shall promulgate a nomination form which, upon approval thereof by the Grand High Priest, shall be timely provided to the Chapters in suitable quantity each year.
- e. Eligibility. Present or past Grand Officers, whether elected or appointed, of the Grand York Rite Bodies of this or other jurisdictions (whether Capitular Cryptic, or Chivalric) shall not be eligible for this Award. (1988)
- f. Selection. All nominations shall be presented by the Grand Secretary to the Grand High Priest, who shall select recipients of the Award in conformity to the numerical limitations and criteria herein provided
- g. Grand High Priest's Prerogative. Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, the Grand High Priest shall have the prerogative of presenting three additional such awards each year, on his own nomination, and of his own choosing.
- h. Form and Design. The form and design of the Award shall not hereafter be altered without vote of the Grand Chapter at its Annual Grand Convocation.

BIOGRAPHY — VERNON H. MILLER GRAND HIGH PRIEST, ROYAL ARCH MASONS, FLORIDA 1988 - 1989

Vernon Howard Miller was elected and installed as the Grand High Priest for the Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons of Florida on May 17, 1989.

Most Excellent Companion Miller was born at Nevada, OH on November 16, 1919. He was reared in rural Wyandotte County of North Central Ohio by his paternal grandparents.

Upon graduation from Eden Township High School in 1937, Companion Miller left farm life for employment with the North Electric Mfg. Co., Galion, OH. In 1938, he entered Tiffin University, Tiffin, OH where he studied Business Administration and Commerce until 1940.

From July 1940 to October 1941, Vernon was employed as a Junior Engineering Clerk (Civil Service) at the Engineering Branch, U.S. Army Air Corps, Wright Field, Dayton, OH. In this position he researched technical and engineering data for some of the most famous flight test pilots and engineers of the Pre-World War II era.

In October 1941, he enlisted in the U.S. Army. While attending technical school at Camp Lee, VA, Pearl Harbor occurred and was was declared. Following several months at Fort Jackson, SC, Vernon was accepted and attended the Officer Candidate School, Aberdeen Proving Ground, MD, graduating as a Second Lieutenant, Ordnance Department, U.S. Army on September 5, 1942. Due to his civilian experience with the Army Air Corps, he was detailed as an aviation Ordnance Officer with the Army Air Forces. When the Air Force became a separate Armed Service in 1947, he transferred from the Army to the Air Force.

His service in the continental U.S. was at bases in Washington, Nebraska, Florida, Alabama, California and Alaska, From 1951 to 1954 he was assigned duty with the U.S. Air Force Inspector General traveling world-wide inspecting bases and commands.

During World War II he served in the Southwest Pacific Area (Australia, New Guinea, Phillipines, Okinawa & Japan); Also served in Korea 1946-47; France 1954-55; Thailand (Diplomatic Tour) 1960-62; Viet Nam 1965-66; Germany and Europe 1967-71.

Colonel Miller's long distinguished military career in Command, Logistics, Maintenance and Resource Management culminated in retirement on November 1, 1971 as a regular Air Force Colonel. His awards include the Legion of Merit, Bronze Star Medal, Air Force Commendation Medal, Presidential Unit Citation, Air Force Outstanding Unit Award with two devices for Valor, plus numerous other service ribbons and devices.

Companion Vernon is married to the former Frances Rotondo, a native Floridian from Panama City. They have three wonderful children and three beautiful grandchildren.

In addition to his education already mentioned, Companion Miller is a graduate of: The Air Command & Staff College, 1954; Advanced Management Course, George Washington University, 1957; Air War College, 1960; and Blackstone School of Law (Juris Doctor Degree).

Companion Miller continues a very active participation in business and military affairs. He is President and Co-owner of a Real Estate Development Co. He serves on two advisory councils representing military retirees before the Commander, Tyndall AFB, FL. Also, he is an active member of Bay County Chamber of Commerce, Air War College Foundation, Air Force Academy Athletic Association, The Retired Officer Association and AARP.
