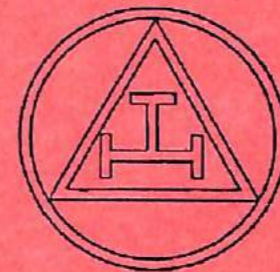
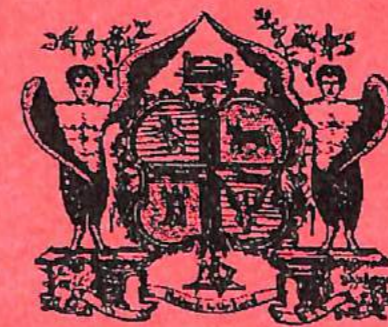

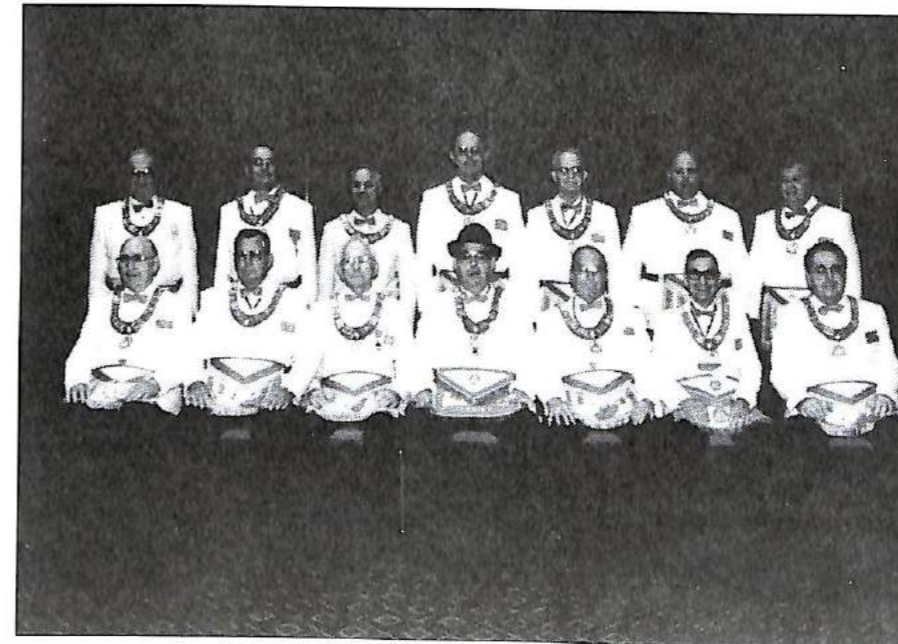

AUDIT COMMITTEE REPORT FOR FY ENDING 30 APRIL 1997

On May 3, 1997 the Audit Committee, consisting of Leslie H. Scott, R. Ex. Grand Scribe, Chairman (Ex-Officio); Charles R. Denman, Chief Auditor, Columbus Webb; and Wallace C. Stich, was scheduled to meet with Duane B. Young, R. Ex. Grand Treasurer, and Wm. Robert Young, R. Ex. Grand Secretary, at the office of the Grand Secretary/Recorder in Titusville, Florida. Due to conflicts only Charles Denman, Duane Young and Robert Young were present.

To close out open items from last year's report, it is noted that:

1. The IRS forgave the penalties for the late filing of the Form 990. This saved the Grand Chapter about \$2,000.00.
2. Good progress has been made on computerization of the membership records. It is estimated that our records are now in agreement between the Grand Chapter and subordinate chapters with about a 95% confidence level. Since these are constantly changing with new members, deaths and changes of address, this level is appropriate.

The R. Ex Grand Secretary's books were reviewed, as well as computer generated spread sheets maintained for the office account. The R. Ex. Grand Treasurer's records were reviewed and used for the bulk of the Audit effort. All financial records were found to be in order. Unfortunately the R. Ex. Grand Treasurer became ill immediately following this meeting and his summary report was not available for audit prior to the writing of this report. A supplementary report will be prepared and published in the proceedings. Items marked with "*" are the missing data lines. A summary report follows:

The committee held it's final meeting on May 17, 1997 at he Ramada Oceanfront Resort in Daytona Beach. At that time another item by item review of the budget was made resulting in the following recommended changes in the 1997-98 budget:

- 10002-Grand Secretary Asst. This account is increased from \$2,800.00 to \$4,000.00. GSA will be employed full time.
- 10002A-GSA payroll tax. This account is increased from \$200.00 to \$350.00.
- 10003-Office Assistant. This account is deleted as it is no longer required.
- 10003A-Office Assistant payroll tax. This account is deleted.
- 10045 -Membership Development. This account is funded for \$1,000.00 as requested by the Grand King.
- 10070-Library Committee. This account is increased, one time only, from \$500.00 to \$1,000.00 to help fund the General Grand Chapter expansion of the Royal Arch Mason Library. This funding will return

to \$ 500.00 next year.

- 10075-Area Meetings. This account is being increased from \$600.00 to \$800.00 as Area Meetings are being replaced by district meetings.
- 10105-Postage. This account is increased from \$700.00 to \$800.00.
- 10110-Rent. This account is reduced from \$1,100.00 to \$1,000.00.
- 10120-Telephone. This account is being increased from \$400.00 to \$800.00. An 800 number and FAX service is being added.
- 10130-Electric. This account is being increased from \$200.00 to \$400.
- 10999-Out of Budget Acct. for 150th Anniv. This account is closed out and deleted from the budget.

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CHARTERS, DISPENSATIONS & BY-LAWS

On 9 September, 1996, the Grand High Priest received a Petition for Dispensation to form a Royal Arch Chapter at Avon Park, Florida. All necessary forms and documentation accompanied the petition and were in proper order.

On 5 October, 1996, the Degrees of the Royal Arch Chapter were conferred upon several candidates at Poinciana Lodge No. 227, in Avon Park, FL, by degree teams assembled for that purpose. Immediately afterwards, HIGHLANDS CHAPTER UD was set to work by M. Ex. Grand High Priest Harvey Ward.

Since 5 October, several members of this Committee have dropped-in to visit and observe the Chapter at work. In addition, members of the Committee on Work have visited and provided schools of instruction for the Chapter.

On 14 March 1997, Highlands Chapter U. D. Opened the Royal Arch Chapter in full form and formally received the Grand High Priest and his party. Work was then suspended in the Chapter and a Mark Master Lodge was opened in full form, and the Mark Master Degree was conferred. After the MM Degree was completed, the Lodge was closed and work resumed in the Royal Arch Degree, which was then closed after the completion of business. The Grand Secretary was present and examined the books of the Chapter which were found to be in proper order.

The Committee on Work, the Grand Secretary, and this Committee, have concurred that the Chapter was ready to be granted a Charter. Highlands Chapter U. D. has submitted a Petition for Charter.

In view of the above, this Committee recommends that Highlands Chapter U. D. be

granted a Charter, hereafter to be known as HIGHLANDS Chapter NO. 64, ROYAL ARCH MASONS OF FLORIDA.

In March, 1997, approximately 30 Royal Arch Masons in Marathon, FL requested a dispensation to form a Royal Arch Chapter at Marathon.

On 25 April, 1997, Island Chapter U. D. was set to work by the M. Ex Grand High Priest Harvey Ward. On that same evening, Island Chapter U. D. Demonstrated their proficiency by opening the Chapter in full form, properly received Distinguished Guests, conferred the Past Masters Degree in full form, and, closed the Chapter, all being done with great proficiency. The secretary of Island Chapter U. D. demonstrated his ability to properly perform his duties to the Grand Secretary.

Island Chapter U. D. has since submitted a Petition for Charter, and has submitted all forms and documents necessary to be granted a Charter. The committee on Work, The Grand Secretary and this Committee have concurred that Island Chapter U. D. is ready to be granted a Charter.

In view of the above, this committee recommends that Island Chapter U. D. be granted a Charter, hereafter to be known as ISLAND Chapter NO. 65, ROYAL ARCH MASONS OF FLORIDA.

**REPORT OF AD HOC COMMITTEE FOR
THE REVISION & UP-DATE OF THE CONSTITUTION**

Approximately three years ago this Ad Hoc Committee was charged to revise and up-date the Constitution, laws, Rules & Regulations for this Grand Chapter, R.A.M. of Florida.

At the beginning of our task it was discovered the existing Constitution adopted in 1987, with additions and revisions through 1989, was printed from a draft copy versus an edited corrected copy. Also, the disk containing the edited copy was not to be located by this Committee. Therefore, the Constitution as printed and distributed to the Craft has been suspect.

The members of this Ad Hoc Committee reviewed old documentation, the Constitution adopted in 1981 and Proceedings from 1981 through 1996. Corrections, omissions, spellings and additions of adopted resolutions or amendments have now

been made on two printed master copies of the entire Constitution, Laws, Rules & Regulations through the Grand Convocation of 1996.

This Ad Hoc Committee hereby proposes sixteen (16) amendments for consideration and adoption as shown on the Attachment to this report.

It is recommended that at the conclusion of this 1997 Grand Convocation this Committee be authorized to edit and finalize the revised, corrected and up-dated Constitution, to include all legislation adopted at this Grand Convocation. It will then be read for printing and distribution.

Upon finalization the work of this Committee will be concluded. With the adoption of Amendment # 3 a standing Committee will review & up-date the Constitution, Laws, Rules & Regulations annually following each Grand Convocation.

The Members of this Committee are grateful for the opportunity to serve Grand Chapter.

PURPOSED GRAND CHAPTER AMENDMENTS - 1996 - 1997

The hereon listed Amendments to the Constitution, laws, Rules and Regulations of the Grand Chapter, RAM, of Florida were proposed for consideration and adoption at the Grand Convocation on May 20, 1997.

AMENDMENT # 1. ARTICLE XII, Section 4 - Convocation Committees.

" Add 4 f. Thanks " (1997 - Effective May 20, 1997)

AMENDMENT # 2. ARTICLE XII, Section 5 - Standing Committees.

Amend Section 5 m to read: "m Finance (3) A chairman, 1 member and the Grand Treasurer. This Finance Committee is charged with study and oversight of the long-range financial matters of this Grand Chapter and proposing appropriate legislation in a timely manner (1997 - Effective May 20)

AMENDMENT # 3. ARTICLE XII, Section 5 - Standing Committees.

Add Section 5 n. "Constitution Revision (3). 1 PGHP, Chairman plus 2 members. The Grand Secretary and a Legal Advisor shall be Ex Officio Members." (1997 - Effective May 20, 1997)

AMENDMENT # 4. ARTICLE XII, Section 8 - Manual of Procedures

Amend last sentence to read: "Such Manual of Procedures to be published by the Grand Secretary's Office for the Grand High Priest and distributed to all Grand Officers with revisions and up-dates as appropriate." (1997 Effective May 20, 1997)

AMENDMENT # 5. ARTICLE XII, Section 11 - Grand Secretary.

Amend Section 11 a: Delete " as soon after the close of each Grand Convocation as possible". Add "within 180 days after the close of each Grand Convocation." (1997 - Effective May 20, 1997)

AMENDMENT # 6. ARTICLE XII, Section 11 - Grand Secretary.

Add 11 k: "To perform the duties of Registered Agent for the Corporations of the Grand Chapter, R.A.M., of Florida and the constituent Chapters thereof, and, to receive, monitor and forward to the Secretary of State for Florida the Annual Corporate Reports with amount of fees due for Constituent Chapters." (1997 - Effective May 20, 1997)

AMENDMENT # 7. ARTICLE XII, Section 11 - Grand Secretary.

Add 11 l: "To furnish Constituent Chapters with all necessary blank forms as may be prescribed, or may from time to time, be developed and prescribed by the Grand Chapter, and, to provide all necessary blank forms of Charters, dispensations, diplomas, etc., and to cause the same to be properly executed under the seal of the Grand Chapter when required. (1997 - Effective May 20, 1997)

AMENDMENT # 8. ARTICLE XII, Section 11 - Grand Secretary

Add :11 m: "To notify, by the most expedient means, the Grand High Priest, all living Past Grand High Priests, Elective and Appointed Officers of the Grand Chapter, R.A.M., and the several Constituent Chapters of the death of a Past Grand High Priest, Elective Grand Chapter Officer, or other prominent York Rite Masonic Person, with the time and place appointed for the funeral. Such notice shall state if an Emergent Grand Convocation of the Grand Chapter is called by the Grand High Priest, giving time and place for convening. (1997 - Effective May 20, 1997)

AMENDMENT # 9. ARTICLE XII, Section 11 - Grand Secretary.

Renumber "11 k" to " 11 n".

AMENDMENT # 10. ARTICLE XVII - Ritual, Section 1, designation.

Add. "The ritual adopted, published and distributed by General Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons International together with the Instructions and Guidelines contained in Appendix "D" to this Constitution, a "Book of Essentials" and a "Key Lecture" shall constitute the adopted ritual for this Grand Jurisdiction." (Effective May 20, 1997)

AMENDMENT # 11. CHAPTER SIXTEEN -SUBORDINATE CHAPTERS, CONSOLIDATION & MERGER.

Add 16.04. Regulatory Procedures.

"Procedures for proposing, processing, notification, voting and implementing consolidation and/or mergers of Royal Arch Masonic Chapters within this Grand Jurisdiction will be in accord with the provisions prescribed in Chapter 16, Digest of Masonic Laws of Florida."

AMENDMENT # 12. CHAPTER SEVENTEEN - SUBORDINATE CHAPTERS, CHARTERS.

Add 17.07. Forfeiture of Charter.

"A Chapter failing to convene in at least four convocations in one year, or failing to make returns and payment of dues to The Grand Chapter, or failing to be represented at The Grand Chapter for two consecutive years, forfeits its Charter, and the Grand High Priest shall order the Charter, records and effects of such Chapter, sent to the Grand Secretary." (1997 Effective May 20, 1997)

AMENDMENT # 13. CHAPTER TWENTY EIGHT-CHAPTER PROPERTY, OWNERSHIP & USE.

Add 28.02. CORPORATE REPORTS.

"In accord with s.617.1623 F.S., the Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons of Florida and the several Constituent Chapters, each a corporation under the laws of Florida, will be required to file an Annual Corporate Report with amounts of fees due to the Secretary of State for Florida between January 1 and July 1 of each calendar year. Such Corporate Reports will be forwarded thru the Grand Secretary's Office for monitoring and recording purposes. (1997 - Effective May 20, 1997)

AMENDMENT # 14. CHAPTER THIRTY SEVEN -FORMS AND CEREMONIES

Amend 37.01 Deviation Forbidden.

a. Delete the words "Red Book". Add in place thereof the words: "Appendix D, Instructions and Guidelines,"

Also Add following the words "Key Lecture the following words: "Ritualistic Ceremony of an Antient Craft Table Chapter Convocation of Royal Arch Masons".

Add 37.01 b. Ceremony for Antient Craft Table Chapters.

The Ritualistic Ceremony of an Antient Craft Table Chapter Convocation of Royal Arch Masons is the officially adopted form and order for a tiled Convocation of Royal Arch Masons at the Feast or Festive Board. The Committee on Work is charged to include this ritual in the programs for Schools of Instruction. The Grand Secretary will make this Ritualistic Ceremony available to the Constituent Chapters upon request for a nominal cost. (1993)

AMENDMENT # 15. CHAPTER THIRTY SEVEN -FORMS AND CEREMONIES.

Amend 37.04 by adding the following sentence: "When any degree is opened for Work or Conferral of the Degree, any member not wearing robes shall be properly clothed with the Royal Arch Apron. (Grand High Priest Ruling 1997)

AMENDMENT # 16. CHAPTER FORTY-THREE-RECOGNITIONS AND AWARDS.

Add 43.06 Membership Growth Awards.

a. The Grand High Priest shall formally recognize each year at the Grand Convocation those outstanding Companions who distinguished themselves in the promotion of Capitular Masonry and Membership recruitment.

b. The Secretaries of each Royal Arch Chapter will submit to the Grand Secretary the names of each "Top Line Signer" on petitions for the Royal Arch (Capitular) Degrees of Freemasonry.

c. The Grand Secretary will tabulate and present those names of "Top line Signers", with the number of petitions signed by each, to the Grand High Priest in a timely manner for scheduling and presentation of awards.

d. The Grand High Priest is authorized to present awards to "Top line Signers" on petitions for Capitular Degrees in accord with the following awards schedule:

Three	Special Certificate presented by this Grand Chapter. Their name will be read at the Grand Convocation and will be published in the Proceedings of the Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons of Florida.
Five	Their Grand Chapter Convocation Registration Fee paid, plus a gift certificate for \$20.00 to the Masonic Order Supply House of their choice.

Fifteen	All of the above Awards, plus a free Banquet Ticket at the Grand Convocation, and a Specially designed York Rite Watch.

The Ladies lunch was a success with 130 ladies attending. R. E. P. G. C. Harry Rosenthal gave a talk on antique glass, followed by First Lady of the Commandery, Joyce Waltman, regaling the audience with a few renditions of her own.

The Mens Lunch was an unqualified victory. For the first time in several years we were able to have a full sit down lunch for the men rather than the usual sandwiches. All attending expressed their great appreciation.

Our Grand Banquet had a few changes in it this year. Some were successful and others were not. The Grand Presiding Officers implemented some suggestions that

had been made to them. Sometimes what sounds good and looks good on paper does not work out in the real world. However, this committee and the Grand Line learned a lot and while those positive aspects will be retained, those negative ones will just as quickly be disregarded. While we did have 341 in attendance at the banquet several of our Companions and Sir Knights were not served even though we were well within our contract. This severely cuts down the time that each of you has to spend at the registration desk and allows us to be able to have adequate materials for those attending. We end up guessing each year how many have not preregistered and bringing extra materials. Each year we run out and there are those who do not get the materials they need all because these individuals refuse to preregister. The Grand Secretary's office cannot afford to print an extra 100 copies of everything to cover those who may or may not attend. All of those individuals who preregistered received everything they needed.

Speaking of the Grand Secretary's office, this committee wishes to thank Comp/Sir Knight Robert Young for his assistance, and especially thank Chris Dixon for all of her efforts throughout the year. Chris is and always has been available to assist us in anyway she can. Without her help, this committee would have a lot more work to do.

This year an experiment was tried utilizing the convention database for Mileage and Per Diem. We worked out the bugs and it was a success. We have been informed that this system will be implemented again next year. What this does is reduce the computer time for Mileage and Per Diem, and gives the Convention Committee an additional check for those attending the convention. With this additional check we discovered that 12 Comp/Sir Knights Registered with Mileage and Per Diem to receive their checks but failed to register with the convention committee and pay their registration fee. Comp/Sir Knights, it is absolutely essential that everyone register with the Convention Committee. Please do not forget this next year.

Special thanks need to go to Companion Bernard Cole for handling the room set ups and the fruit baskets. Also special thanks need to go to Mrs. Shirley Anderson and Mrs. Elaine Graulich who manned the registration desk throughout the convention along with providing other services to York Rite. Without their help, we would not have been able to provide you with the services we did.

Last but not least, this committee wishes to welcome Comp/Sir Knight Walter Hammond to this committee. Companion Hammond, was elected to fill the Chapter chair on this committee. We look forward to working with him. As always it has been a pleasure serving the craft in putting this convention together, and we are looking forward to seeing each of you at the Camberley Plaza, Sabal Park, Tampa next year.

FOREIGN RELATIONS

Your committee on Foreign Relations is pleased to note that within the United States there seems to be peace and quiet, as we continue to be guided by the rules and regulations of the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Free & Accepted Masons of Florida.

By following the direction of the Grand Lodge, we have been able to avoid most controversy. This is not to say, however, that some of our sister jurisdictions seem

to have set aside from time to time a few of the precepts of brotherhood. The result has been that some reject the opportunities to further our cause by visitations back and forth.

By reviewing the proceedings for our 1996 annual convocation, we note that a Grand Chapter in Greece has appointed one of our members as their Grand Representative near our Grand Chapter, and that someone in Greece appears as our Grand Representative near a Grand Chapter of Greece. This was not done by action of this Grand Chapter in annual convocation convened. We recognize that there has been confusion in the temple in Greece for several years. It is our hope that a statement will be forthcoming illustrating that harmony now exists among the several Grand Chapters in Greece as well as the several Grand Lodges. As of now, with Greece being smaller than the State of Alabama, it would seem appropriate to recognize only one Grand Lodge and one Grand Chapter.

A letter of inquiry has been received from a Grand Chapter in Belgium concerning the possibility of recognition. The Regular Grand Lodge dates only from 1979, although there were lodges in what is now Belgium as early as 1784 (under English Supervision). The Grand Chapter is newer, and does not appear in Grand Chapter rosters around the world. Your committee feels it proper to wait for more information as to "regularity", and other matters before exchanging Grand Representatives.

In 1979, the Grand Lodge followed the old Grand Orient into irregularity by abandoning the necessity of a belief in God; they became the "old Grand Lodge". The "Regular" Grand Lodge apparently maintained the belief in God, and now consist of 21 lodges as the new or "Regular" Grand Lodge. Should one contemplate visiting a Chapter in Belgium, one should first verify through our M.W. Grand Lodge the lodge with which it might be affiliated.

THE GRAND HIGH PRIEST REPORT

It is a distinct pleasure and high honor that I have this morning. Before we get into the meat and bones of my report I want to extend a warm sincerely heartfelt welcome to each of you who are here for this 150th Annual Grand Convocation of the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida. I want you to know that you are most appreciated by having honored us with your presence. As I look around this hall at the delegates and visitors who have assembled I see many old friends, and some new ones. It is always a pleasure to have distinguished Companions representing the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Florida. Most Worshipful Brother Padron, it is a real honor to have you and your party here with us.

We are pleased to have visitors from our sister grand jurisdictions. We are honored to have representatives of the General Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons International with us, Most Excellent Companion Benny Allen, General Grand Scribe and Most Excellent Companion Jacque Sweeney, Southeastern Regional Deputy of the General Grand High Priest. I trust that you all are enjoying these accommodations; the world famous beach at Daytona just outside the East Gate; the ever changing Atlantic Ocean; and the fellowship of these grand sessions. I hope that you will profit greatly by having been here with us.

It is my prayer that we approach the deliberations of this Grand Convocation with a sense of gratitude to the Supreme High Priest of Heaven and earth, The Great I AM. Help us recognize the many blessings bestowed on each of us during this past year. Cause us to be humbly conscious of our frailties. We pray always for the courage and strength to do right. May we all look forward with confidence to opportunities for more effective service and greater accomplishments in the coming years.

Time has flown. I was Initiated, Passed and Raised in 1976. I worked a lot in those days. However, in October of 1980 I became active with my son in DeMolay. Because of the influence and high esteem I felt for three Masons I asked to become a part of the York Rite of Freemasonry. Charles E. Palmour, Milton Immanuel Ryberg, and William Abram Bessent, III had all made deep and favorable impressions on my mind. They epitomized Freemasonry to me, each in a different manner. Because of their influence I was Exalted to this Most Sublime Degree of the Holy Royal Arch and made a Knight Templar in 1982. Family, work, DeMolay and Freemasonry were the major influences of my life for years.

DeMolay influenced my son to master the politics of DeMolay and become State Master Councilor. His mother and I were glad to finance this opportunity for him.

During those years I had the pleasure of getting to know Most Worshipful Franklin Columbus Smith, P.G.M. and P.G.H.P. and his lady Virginia. He always made me feel as if he were really interested in me and my improvement and advancement in Freemasonry. Looking back, it seems that he saw to it that we would talk often. I am sure that he influenced my thoughts and actions heavily.

Unknown to me in the meantime, the influence of Bessent, Ryberg, and Palmour were at work. They saw to it that I was looked at in Schafer Lodge and the Gainesville York Rite. Somebody had to fill those stations and places, and, after all, Julia is a good cook and fed the Craft well. By 1985 they engineered me into Junior Warden of my Lodge and the next year presiding in all three Chairs across town in the York Rite Bodies. My Lodge advanced me to the East in 1987. Not long afterward, I was asked to represent Right Eminent George Chipouras as his Deputy in the Eighth Chivalric District. Unknown to me there had been a real thrust of political influence made in my behalf by Charlie and Right Excellent Companion Lee Taylor of James Yeager Chapter No. 62. In those days, such appointments were highly prized, and rightfully so. The Deputies in all the lines felt the duty to the Craft to do their best all the time. Charlie and Lee won.

I was not aware of the contest. I had a plate full of Freemasonry to take care of. My Grand Master in 1987 was M. W. George Hayes from right there in Gainesville. We wanted to support him properly and let Florida know we were proud of our Grand Master. We did our best, and I believe Most Worshipful George was pleased. The Gainesville York Rite Bodies gave the York Rite the biggest One Day York Rite Class there had been in 10 years on October 30, 1987 in honor of our Grand Master. Most Excellent Russell Hammond Exalted and Right Eminent George Chipouras Knighted 107 Templars that day.

Again Charlie was at work talking to Vernon Miller. I didn't know it. Several months later Most Excellent Companion Vern Miller called to talk. We did and some time later he asked if I was interested in learning and preparing myself to become Grand High Priest of this Most Excellent Grand Chapter. I was. I sincerely hope I learned enough to have governed this Craft well and to their satisfaction. I also hope that I exhibited enough polish over the year not to offend my Companions. I am rather plain. Those years of Masonic training for this job, I pray, have not gone to waste. Charlie, Lee, and Vernon, we must believe that Milton and Bill and Franklin have seen all this and are at least somewhat pleased.

To the Companions of Gainesville Chapter No. 2 R.A.M. I give my sincere thanks and appreciation for making this whole portion of my life possible. The opportunity to serve my Chapter in the Chairs, as Secretary, and as Director of Work has been wonderful. At times it has been stressful. But it has been an association wherein I have gotten to know pretty well some very good men and Masons. My Royal Arch Chapter, my Council, my Commandery, and my Lodge have continuously and heavily supported my activities in this Grand Chapter and in Freemasonry. I am very grateful. Thank you all.

To Most Excellent Companion Vernon Miller I will say with pride that for these ten years I have found and developed a very close friendship and even a type of kinship that I am pleased to have had develop. Your advice and admonitions have served me well. I am proud to call you and Miss Fran my very close friends. I will cherish that friendship for the rest of my life.

I owe my deep and abiding love and gratitude to my wife Julia. She has truly been a Masonic Widow. She has, almost unfalteringly, supported me in all my Masonic activities. I am very grateful to her. We have shared over thirty years of each others lives. Hers has been the hardest job. My children seemed to know that Daddy was either working or off taking care of Masonic business. Elizabeth turned 21 in April having so far survived the experiences of aging. Harvey Jr. is earning a living and improving himself in Masonry. He is currently the Senior Deacon of our Lodge and holds appointive offices in the rest of the Rite. It is a pleasure to know that he also loves our Fraternity. I am a proud man.

I have served one year in this highest office in your power to bestow. I was Elected and Installed into the office of Grand High Priest on May 20, 1996 and this is May 20. I worked the whole year. The start was a little slow due to my heart attack last May 12th, The Supreme Grand Master said "Slow Down", I did. I dropped a good portion of my planned activities and re-scheduled. I prefer living to the alternative.

The climax of this Capitular year is upon us. You are the judges of whether this was a good, mediocre, or poor year in Capitular Masonry. Charlie and Vernon have their ideas and I have my hopes. I have done my best. The plans I gave this Grand Chapter if pursued will not mature quickly. It will be three to five years before we can notice significant countable differences. If pursued, our numbers will grow.

These 365 days have run very fast. It has been a busy and rewarding year. It is time for me to render an accounting of my stewardship in the administration of the affairs of this Grand Chapter. I do so with tremendous gratitude to you, the Craft for the privilege of serving you as Grand High Priest.

During my term of office Warrants to the Treasurer have been signed numbered 001 through 148. The Grand Chapter budget was approved for \$48,755.00. The Grand Chapter has spent \$48,284.11. Which is 99.03% of the budget, for a savings of \$471.00.

Added to that and set aside in February of 1996 by this Grand Chapter was \$20,000.00 to finance the Sesquicentennial Celebration. Since February 1996, I have requested the Grand Chapter spend \$12,794.13 of that \$20,000.00. Of that \$12,794.13 we have paid back into the Grand Chapter treasury the sum of \$ 6,938.07 (as of 4-30-97). That currently puts that special 10999 numbered account in the hole by \$ 5,856.06. There is still some memorabilia from the 150th Anniversary celebration to sell to interested persons. All proceeds from those sales will go toward the repaying of the 10999 account. Whatever that total falls short of when we finalize it during the term of the next Grand High Priest is what it cost this Grand Chapter to celebrate its anniversary in a proper manner and advertise Royal Arch Masonry. I would like to think that we have sown some seeds that will, if cultivated, sprout into more new Royal Arch Chapters and new Royal Arch Masons. That will take time and attention. When you have heard and seen the rest of this report then decide if this budget was spent frivolously, or wisely. I believe you will be favorably impressed with the financial aspects after weighing the progress.

Necrology

Each year we are saddened by the absence of our familiar Companions. Those familiar faces whose memories we cherish and can no longer greet. Those Companions who have completed their labors in the quarries and vineyards of this life and have gone on to present their token and to receive their wages. In the midst of our deliberations we remember with love of Brotherhood the 272 Companions of this Grand Chapter who passed from here to their reward during this Capitular year.

While the Supreme High Priest of Heaven and earth was gracious to us we have lost Companion Charles Junior Corbin, Grand Organist from our Grand Line. He was a truly gifted musician and has no doubt assisted in the making of music in that celestial Grand Chapter on high. We were also saddened by the loss of M.E. Companion Wilbur Masters who led all four bodies of Ancient Craft Freemasonry. While we are saddened by their loss from us we confidently can leave them in the hands of a being who doeth all things well and we are comforted that they have been rewarded by the greater glory of God.

State Of the Craft

The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida is similar to other Grand Jurisdictions and areas of Freemasonry. While in some areas of our Craft there are

outstanding initiatives, innovations, zeal, and enthusiasm; other areas of our Craft suffer for lack of interest, cooperation, or application of leadership. Many officers and High Priests can look back with rightful pride to their accomplishments in the past year.

I have had the opportunity to observe many Chapters in the ten Capitular Districts throughout the past nine years, most particularly though, during the past year. I assure you that there is a wide spectrum of not only ritualistic proficiency, but in the fervency and zeal that is necessary to promote Royal Arch Masonry. We should promote that from Chapter to Chapter and District to District. We must, with fervency, zeal, and great enthusiasm evangelically sell Royal Arch Masonry and the completion of Antient Craft Masonry to our Brothers in every Lodge. Especially YOUR LODGE. I believe an improved positive visibility will produce increased activity, desire, and membership. Overall our Grand Chapter sustained a net loss of 180 Companions for the Capitular calendar year 1996-97. The number suspended NPD was 234 while Exaltations were 240. The Supreme High Priest summoned 272 from our midst. There were secretarial adjustments downward of 116. Our membership numbers are 7,946 as of April 30, 1997. The number of Companions Exalted from May 1, 1996 to May 1, 1997 is 287

I will remind you, the Companions who can make a difference, that the population of this great state of Florida continues to rise at a rapid rate. The Masonic population of this Grand Chapter and of Freemasonry in Florida overall continues to decline. In my view this is a strange phenomenon. I believe that with the action described here by the leadership of Capitular Masons at all levels of our fraternity we can reverse this strange phenomenon. For too long we have hidden ourselves. We must do things publicly to bring a positive recognition by the public to our fraternity. We must do that same thing within our fraternity so that the Holy Royal Arch is not hidden out of existence. For at least 50 years we have not promoted ourselves well enough within Freemasonry. We live in an age where name recognition says it all. It either sells or it does not. We must do things differently than we have been doing. If not, then Companion Luther Bodiford will not have much to preside over. We are able to change. The whole secret for success is

P. Caldwell and many other Companions in Pensacola who produced outstanding Work. An extra pleasure and benefit that the Companions at Pensacola produced was the Ground breaking Ceremony for a new York Rite Temple in which I had the pleasure and honor of assisting the M. W. Grand Master take care of. That evening we all enjoyed a wonderful banquet where I was presented with several gifts including an honorary membership to Mount Horeb No. 6. I will long remember my Companions in Pensacola and their outstanding efforts in behalf of Capitular Masonry.

The Class in Orlando on March 22, 1996 was also superbly executed. It was in the charge of R. E. Companion Fred Morris of Eureka Chapter No. 7. The Chapter under whose Charter it was worked was that of Monroe No. 15 because it occurred at the Scottish Rite Center of Orlando that is actually in Seminole County. The teams and workers performed outstandingly to the enlightenment and enjoyment of all.

The Sesquicentennial Class on February 1, 1997 in Tallahassee was ritualistically in the charge of M. E. Companion Jim MacDonald, Chairman of the Committee on Work of this Grand Chapter. Cabal - Jericho Merger

As we know, Hurricane Andrew several years ago devastated the Homestead area of South Florida. It destroyed the Masonic Temple that housed Cabal Chapter No. 61 R.A.M. The membership became scattered while building new lives for themselves.

Some of their leaders died. The Royal Arch Chapter became unable to meet its Constitutional obligations to hold viable Convocations. The Companions of Jericho Chapter No. 11 in Miami became aware of the plight of the surviving Companions and voted to accept all of the members and property of Cabal No. 61 as theirs. No memberships were lost. The rights and benefits of the Royal Arch Masons of Cabal Chapter were not impinged upon and they retained membership as R.A. Masons in Jericho Chapter. This action saved the members from losing rights as Cryptic or Chivalric Masons, as well as all the other orders that predicate their membership on Capitular membership. Most of the Chapter regalia and books were lost over the several years.

M. E. Companion Earl Shiver of Jericho Chapter was asked to see to it that the laws concerning the merger of these two Royal Arch Chapters was adhered to and that the merger be accomplished in a proper manner so that the Companions best interests as well as the laws of this Grand Chapter would be served. M. E. Shiver did an admirable and timely job.

Highlands Chapter U. D.

Excellent Companion Frank Whittam, PHP in Pennsylvania, lately of Florida loves Capitular Masonry. After living here a while and becoming active with the Companions of Thomas Brown Chapter No. 22 of Bartow he decided to see if he could involve himself in starting a Royal Arch Chapter. He spoke with R. E. Companion Joe Ken West about his desire. Right Excellent Companion West being a devout Freemason and desirous of assisting the promulgation of the high causes of the Holy Royal Arch of Freemasonry was more than pleased to assist. R.E. Ken West provided the leadership and direction to many Companions. He inspired the involvement of other leaders in Thomas Brown Chapter to become involved in an effort to assist Companion Whittam and other Companions in the Highlands County area. Soon with the aid of Almighty God, plenty of fervency and zeal and plenty of hard work these Companions applied for Dispensation to form a Chapter of Royal Arch Masons in Avon Park. Permission was granted by the Brothers of Poincianna Lodge No. 227 for a Royal Arch Chapter to hold Convocations there. Your Grand High Priest was pleased to grant the Dispensation. On October 5, 1996 Thomas Brown Chapter No. 22 R.A.M. opened a Convocation in Avon Park and the Capitular Degrees of Freemasonry were conferred on a class of Master Masons. After Exaltation the Chapter was closed.

An Emergent Convocation of this Grand Chapter was opened for the purpose of Setting to Work Highlands Chapter U.D. Royal Arch Masons. The Dispensation was presented. The Grand Chapter officers assisted by many P.G.H.Ps installed the officers of Highlands Chapter U. D.. The Chapter has met regularly since that time

under and with the continued watchful eyes of Ken West, Wilbur Allen, Ben Holland, and others who have assisted the Companions of Highlands Chapter often.

On March 14, 1997 Highlands Chapter invited the G.H.P. to ask the Committee on Work and the Charters and Dispensations Committee to come watch them perform. Highlands Chapter under the leadership of E. Companion Whittam and others performed all the tasks asked for by the Committees without ritual or falter.

Of course, there is much more to the story than can be related here. Suffice it to say we are extremely proud of the accomplishments of this dedicated group of Royal Arch Masons. R. E. Companion Joe Ken West has set a high standard. He is deserving of the credit for causing it to happen. Congratulations Ken. You have the thanks of this Grand Chapter.

I am pleased to recommend that you vote positively to grant this new Royal Arch Chapter a Charter today.

Island Chapter

On June 29, 1996 this Grand Chapter participated in a One Day York Rite Class honoring Most Worshipful Michael A. Padron, Jr. in his home District at Marathon in the Florida Keys. Interest was stirred since the Royal Arch and the rest of York Masonry had not been conferred in the Keys since early this century.

The Companions there led by Excellent Companion Jorge Aladro notified your G.H.P. on April 8, 1997 that on Friday April 25 they would like to start a Royal Arch Chapter. Jericho Chapter has voted their approval. The Request for Dispensation was received with more than the required number of signatures (39). The Grand Chapter wheels were set in motion to assemble at the Lodge in Marathon to assist these Companions. At preliminary meetings they have chosen the name of Island Chapter to replace the original Island Chapter No. 4 that was at the second Grand Convocation in 1848.

Island Chapter U.D. R.A.M. was duly and legally Set To Work on Friday April 25, 1997. Accompanying me, also representing the Grand Chapter was M.E.P.G.H.P. Jim MacDonald, Chairman of the Committee on Work, R.E. Fred Young, Grand King, R.E. Wm. Robert Young, Grand Secretary, and R.E. Robert Niles, of the Charters and Dispensations Committee.

Island Chapter demonstrated at that time a sufficient level of proficiency to satisfy the printed statutory requirements. There were about 45 Companions in attendance

At that Convocation I was pleased to officially receive our M. W. Grand Master, Michael A. Padron, Jr. He was afforded the Public Grand Honors of Capitular Masonry and additionally the Private Grand Honors of Symbolic Masonry. He is the King of Island Chapter. When our Grand Master received the gavel he proceeded to present M.E. Companion Jim MacDonald a 50 year pin and Certificate of Membership from the Grand Lodge. He was afforded the Grand Honors of the Lodge. M.E. MacDonald was very appreciative.

I am pleased to recommend that you vote positively to grant this new Royal Arch Chapter a Charter today.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The sum of the parts equal the whole. Therefore, the following are not listed in an order of importance:

1. The Constituent Chapters and Companions were made more aware of the need to positively enhance the image of the York Rite of Freemasonry in general and the Holy Royal Arch in particular.
2. The visibility of the Holy Royal Arch has been increased by recognizing the rightful and proper place of the Royal Arch in the order of Appendant Bodies.
3. We have revived the publication of The York Rite Light and have sent it not only to Capitular Masons but to All Masons of Florida Lodges, our prime prospects. Due to cooperation between the Grand York Rite and the Grand Lodge The Florida Mason was used to carry the information. Some of our good works are published. R.E. Companion Bob Burleson has presented outstanding work as our Editor.
4. Two new Royal Arch Chapters have been set to work U.D.. The Companions in Highlands County around Avon Park requested a Dispensation to form a Chapter. They had more than the required number sign the request as Charter Members (43) and on October 5, 1996 this Grand Chapter set Highlands Chapter U.D. to work. They have met regularly and have accomplished their required goals. We will have an opportunity to grant them a Charter today.

The Companions in Monroe County around Marathon requested a Dispensation to form a new Royal Arch Chapter. They also had more than the required number sign the request as Charter Members (finally 39) and on April 25, 1997 this Grand Chapter set Island Chapter U.D. to Work. They have accomplished their required goals. They have set a course to establish the rest of the York Rite Bodies of Freemasonry in Monroe County. We will have an opportunity to grant them a Charter today.

5. The work of the York Rite of Freemasonry was conferred in the Florida Keys for the first time in many, many years. There is now a Royal Arch Chapter in Marathon. We have a toehold. Let's build on that.
6. We have attempted to teach through the various schools conducted, the exercise of proper protocol and Masonic etiquette in the execution of the business and fraternal matters of the Chapters.
7. This Grand Chapter has maintained good relations with foreign jurisdictions and our sister appendant orders. We have substantially increased our relationship with and our recognition by the M. W. Grand Lodge of Florida. It is my earnest prayer that we can maintain and increase our positive relationship with the Grand Lodge. The Grand Lodge has beyond a doubt placed this Grand Royal Arch Chapter in full recognition. Our wholehearted thanks go to our M. W. Grand Master, Mike Padron.
8. A plan to increase our membership has been written and distributed to the Grand Chapter officers and deputies last year. It has been implemented in some places to a small degree. The results have been positive. You must decide to further execute the plan or let it die.
9. I have by edict implemented a plan of awards and rewards for Top Line Signers of petitioners for your Chapters. Today you will have the opportunity to decide if you want that plan adopted and continued by this Grand Chapter.
10. As a result of the official Florida Work not being found in the Chapter Red Books by the Craft in the local Chapters we have prepared legislation allowing the publication of that Work, except for the Key Lecture and Secret Work, as an appendix in the Constitution Rules and Regulations. You will have an opportunity to approve that today.
11. We have been living with a Life Membership plan that did not pay the members per capita tax. This caused the Chapters to pay additionally to take care of its enrolled members. Legislation has been prepared so that we can grandfather the Life Membership plan into one that will work to our benefit and not cost our Constituent Chapters. It is patterned after the Grand Lodge Perpetual Membership plan that is so popular. You will have an opportunity to adopt that ETERNAL MEMBERSHIP plan today.
12. We have celebrated with great enthusiasm the Sesquicentennial Anniversary of this Grand Chapter. The 150th anniversary was marked well on January 31 and February 1, 1997 in Tallahassee. Details are in this report under that subject.

13. We financed and paid for a portion of the 150th Anniversary costs by the sale of various and sundry items of official memorabilia including bronze and silver coins, shirts, car tags, tote bags, caps, and lapel pins. These items increased our visibility and some are good public relations items. The figures appear in the financial reports.

14. Our Grand Secretary now has a computerized list of the Capitular Masons of Florida Chapters. If we can get our local Secretaries to complete the requested paperwork correctly and timely our Grand Secretary has our membership information readily available.

15. Our M. W. Grand Master, Mike Padron has truly been great for Royal Arch Masonry in Florida. He has been true to his word that he gave me four years ago when he was in contention for the Grand South. He is a Man of His Word. He has been with us and participated in three One Day York Rite Classes in his honor held in Marathon on June 29th, 1996, one in Pensacola on November 30, 1996 and one in Orlando on March 22, 1997 (his wife's birthday), as well as being with us during the Capitular Degrees on February 1 in the 150th Anniversary Class.

16. M. W. Brother and Companion Padron requested your Grand High Priest to assist and participate in the Ground breaking Ceremonies he conducted at Pensacola on the site of the new York Rite Temple. It was an exciting and moving experience. I am grateful to have had the opportunity.

17. Perhaps the most significant growth in the relationship between the Grand Chapter and the Grand Lodge of Florida can be exemplified by the fact that our Grand Master requested the presence of me, the Grand High Priest, as often as I could, at his District Meetings. I had five opportunities to join Most Worshipful Padron at District Meetings, and each time the Grand High Priest was introduced as a part of the Grand Master's official party and afforded a seat in the East. My Companions, this is a significant step forward in the recognition of Capitular Masonry in Florida. By affording the Grand High Priest this honor, the Grand Lodge of Florida acknowledges the rightful place of the Holy Royal Arch within the York structure. Grand Master, this Grand Royal Arch Chapter as well as the rest of the York Rite of Freemasonry has well enjoyed the time and attention you have given to Antient Craft Masonry. The Craft in Florida have realized that you understand from whence you and Freemasonry came. The ancient historical relationship and kinship between the Symbolic Lodge and the Holy Royal Arch has been recognized and made stronger by you and the efforts you have exerted while leading the Freemasons in Florida. You have the gratitude of the Freemasons who know their historical roots and who are in possession of both, the Substitute Word, as well as, the Long Lost Master's Word. Thank you.

18. The work of the Ad Hoc Committee set up for the update and completion of the Constitution Rules and Regulations has done a tremendous job. We have too long been without our up dated laws easily referred to. We will have the opportunity today to accept their work.

19. Your Grand High Priest represented the Capitular Masons of Florida on as many occasions as time and circumstances would permit. The visibility of the Royal Arch was enhanced. (See the activities and visitations section of this report).

20. For the first time in memory a calendar of Capitular and York Rite activities was made and published that was never in conflict with that of the Grand Lodge in a geographical area.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. I recommend that the plan initiated this last year to enhance the image and increase the visibility of Capitular Masonry be continued to the ultimate ends of:

A) All Master Masons in Florida realizing that the Holy Royal Arch completes the Master's Degree.

B) Having a healthy Chapter of Holy Royal Arch Masons in every county in Florida.

2. I recommend that this Grand Chapter initiate planning and organization to celebrate publicly the 200th Anniversary of the General Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons International. That Anniversary will occur in October of this year.

3. I recommend that this Grand Chapter exert greater efforts to recognize, utilize, and reward the leadership abilities of Companions at the local level of the constituent Chapters.

4. I recommend that each constituent Chapter strive to confer each of the Degrees of Capitular Masonry in their Chapter for their candidates so as to increase activity, sense of purpose, and Chapter pride.

5. I recommend that this Grand Chapter cooperate with the rest of York Masonry including the Grand Lodge and continue to publish and disseminate The York Rite Light. We must advertise our existence to the rest of Freemasonry. We must give our membership the knowledge that we are active and worth their while.

6. I recommend that this Grand Chapter continue the practice of appointing the Grand Line from the Sentinel through the Captain of the Host and electing the Scribe,

King, and M.E. G.H.P. The reason for that long schooling process is evident to those who have passed through it. In order to perform well a great deal of preparation is necessary. Commitment is tested. Above all, the Craft of all Florida must have an opportunity to see if they approve of the officer, and the officer must have an opportunity to decide if he can handle all the implications of the job. The Craft of Florida should not be asked to elect grand officers who are not willing to pay a great price of themselves.

I want to tell the M. W. Grand Master, Michael Padron, the M. I. Grand Master, Paul Friend and our R. E. Grand Commander, Guy Waltman that I appreciate the opportunity of serving the York Rite of Freemasonry with the three of you. It has been quite a year, packed with experiences.

To the Officers and District Deputies of this Grand Chapter with whom I have had the pleasure to serve I want you to know that I have enjoyed the relationships we have formed. To those of you who have earnestly promoted my program I know that you have seen the planned for results occur and can truly enjoy the fruits of your labor. You have earned your Capitular wages and are entitled to the enjoyment of them.

My Companions I sincerely pray that Almighty God continues to bless this great fraternity and continues to provide the leadership of this Grand Royal Arch Chapter with the wisdom to contrive, the strength to support and the beauty of harmony to administer the affairs of this Grand Chapter so that all our doings will continue to be pleasing in His sight.

To the incoming M. E. Grand High Priest, His Officers, and my Companions, I pledge my support when called upon and my advice when I think it might help and for as long as God provides health and strength.

**REPORT OF THE GRAND HIGH PRIEST
ON THE
SESQUICENTENNIAL ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION**

This Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons was born in Tallahassee on January 24, 1847, according to our charter. The published Proceedings of the first Grand Convocation however, tell us that there was no quorum present on that day and the Convocation was postponed and held on February 1. The Proceedings do not elaborate as to why. We are left to wonder, were the civilized folk of that area under Indian attack and fighting for their lives and property, or were they under siege from the terrific cold that sometimes invades the territory, later known in our history as "the Girls' School".

Whatever the reason, we celebrated our 150th Anniversary in Tallahassee on Friday evening January 31 and Saturday February 1, 1997. Early planning revealed that those dates would be most convenient for the Grand Chapter this year.

The Indian uprising that occasionally still occurs in the Winter around "the Girls' School" was completely squashed (52-20) by "The Boys from Old Florida" in early January of 1997. Peace and Harmony prevailed not only among the Craft but among the University system of this great state. The Florida Gators of Gainesville representing the Flagship of the university system in Florida resoundingly trounced the Seminoles of our number 2 school. The Gators are the undisputed champions of college football in this whole country. (To those Companions who do not care, you have my sympathy. To the rest I will say that to the winner go the spoils and the opportunity to write the history. Enjoy it my fellow Gator fans. (M.E. Companion Earl) It has been a long time coming.)

On Friday afternoon January 31 I opened an Emergent Convocation of this Grand Chapter at the Civic Center in Tallahassee for the purpose of Installing Excellent Companion Charles R. Denman of Cocoa as Grand Organist of this Grand Chapter. He will fill that position due to the untimely death of Companion Charles Corbin in November. The Emergent Convocation was closed and a short rehearsal for the next days activities was accomplished. Excellent Companion Denman presented outstanding work at the organ for the 150th Anniversary Celebration. His expertise at making music for the enjoyment of the Companions was well appreciated.

On Friday January 31, 1997, Andrew Jackson Lodge No. 1 in Tallahassee, the birthplace of this Grand Chapter hosted the beginning festivities of the 150th Anniversary Celebration of this M.E. Grand Chapter. A good Bar-B-Que Supper was fed to more than 358 people.

This was over 100 more people than had made reservations and the seating was in short supply as was the food. More of both were soon brought in. A live professional band made up of Freemasons from the Lodge at Quincy played enjoyable music to the standing room only crowd. The Grand Master, Mike Padron and his lady Sally were present along with R.W. Keith Dean, the Junior Grand Warden and M.W. George Hayes, P.G.M. and Lady Wilma, and M. W. J. Roy Crowther, P.G.M., Grand Treasurer and his lady Frances. We were pleased to have M.W. and M.E. Joe Bracken, Past Grand presiding officer of all four Grand Bodies of Ancient Craft Masonry in Alabama and his lady Shirley. M.E. Companion Murray Cooke, General Grand High Priest R.A.M. International and lady Marge traveled from California to be with us. M. E. Companion William Schoene, Jr. General Grand King R.A.M. International. and Lady Toni were with us from New Jersey. M. E. Companion Benny Allen, General Grand Scribe R.A.M. International. and Lady Ruenelle traveled from Georgia to celebrate with us. M. P. Orville Wessler, General Grand Master of the General Grand Council Royal And Select Masters was present with us from Kansas. These along with hundreds of other distinguished and important guests helped us celebrate the occasion. The DeMolays and Rainbow Girls assisted in serving the meals. A very good time was enjoyed by all who attended. The mixing and very apparent enjoyment of this social gathering continued for over six hours. The current Worshipful Master of Jackson Lodge, Companion James Jackson remarked that the Lodge building had never been so full.

The jurisdiction which 90% are representing here in Florida are not helping the jurisdiction who commissioned them, and certainly are not deriving much "honor".

Your Committee recognizes the frustration, and makes this proposal: That a workshop be scheduled during our annual meeting in 1998 for the purpose of more clearly defining the position, and the many techniques that are available to do a better job. The KEY word in Capitular Masonry is EXCELLENCE. We can do better. We must do better. Your Committee believes we all can do better as a Grand Representative.

GRAND SECRETARY'S REPORT

Our office has now completed the development of a single Record on each active member of the York Rite in Florida as furnished by the Chapter Secretaries. With the help of the Chapter secretaries we have purged our records and have about 95% accuracy. The 69,000 plus records previously reported have been reduced to approx. 30,000 records and will be reduced to approx. 20,000 records when we are able to consolidate the members who died, demitted, or are NPDED in the computer. The first four action items in last year's report are now between 90 and 95% complete. The remaining items should be completed in 1998. Our overall goal is approx. 80% complete.

Response time for information has been reduced from days to minutes in most cases. Our overall response time has been reduced to an average of one week. This will be improved in the future.

Due to the deteriorating condition of our former office; rumors of a rent increase; safety hazards; and neighborhood condition, it was agreed upon by our 1995-96 presiding officers and the incoming 1996-97 Officers that we should find a better place for our Office. We did locate a better facility and at a lower cost for rent. Two hundred fifty dollars a month instead of \$275 (Cost for Chapter \$83.33 per month). With the help of many of our Companions we moved to 400 Julia St. in Titusville. Those who have visited us will tell you that it is a better location and much better facility. The people who built the place must have been a Royal Arch Mason as there are Keystones over the windows and two arches plus two wooden columns in one of the arches.

We have started a program of reducing expenses by closing the Post Office Box, getting rid of the Postal Meter, making up more forms and printing them in the office instead of going out to Commercial Printers, etc. and will continue to cut cost where possible, without cutting efficiency.

Our present problem is a copier that we obtained 10 years ago. It does not have the capability of Duplexing, Collating, or Auto-feed, preventing us from doing more in house printing. Last year it cost us \$ 973.71 for maintenance and the quality of printouts has gone down. This past year we have copied 40,000 papers. Our maintenance man indicated that we should start thinking about a new one. We have looked at three different copiers that also have the capability of printing on both sides and collating. An in-house study indicated that we could purchase a newer copier and pay it off with saving in two years. By printing our Constitutions and Bylaws; Chapter red books; Council rituals; Commandery rituals; Directories; forms; etc. we could reduce the average booklet cost from \$ 4.00 each to 1.00 per copy. This should

give us a saving of more than \$ 1500.00 the first year. Read our printing report showing the dollars spent for printing. We would still have our Proceedings printed at the Printers. This has been recommended to the Budget and Finance committee.

HISTORY COMMITTEE

Another year has passed and this Committee is still seeking the proceedings of 1872 and 1873 to make up a complete set of Royal Arch Proceedings for the Grand Chapter of Florida. If you have these two volumes or know where I can borrow them, it would be greatly appreciated.

During this past year, Florida did participate in writing Florida Royal Arch History for inclusion in a History Book being printed by the General Grand Chapter. This is a worthwhile history and may be purchased, for \$25.00, from General Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons International, P.O. Box 489, Danville, Ky. 40423.

In the printing of this volume, sixteen words which were included in the author's original manuscript, were omitted by the printers. The second paragraph of the Florida History, on page 260, should read:

"Before organization of the Grand Lodge of Florida in 1830, Royal Arch Masonry had already become a part of the society in this virgin territory. Florida Royal Arch Chapter No. 32 had been chartered by the Grand Chapter of Virginia in 1827. Florida Royal Arch Chapter No. 4 was chartered in 1844 by the Grand Chapter of South Carolina and Magnolia Royal Arch Chapter No. 16 on April 15, 1845 by the Grand Chapter of Virginia." The sixteen words, underscored above, were omitted by the printers and this makes a big difference in our Fla. History. On page 263, we make reference to our fifty third Annual Convocation on "May 9-10, 1899." The printers showed "May 9-10,189", omitting the second nine in the year 1899.

Our sincere appreciation to our Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Harvey L. Ward, for allowing us the privilege of serving.

JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE

The Jurisprudence Committee reviewed the report of the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Companion Harvey L. Ward, Sr.. We find the Grand High Priest acted judiciously within the Constitution, Laws and Regulations of this Grand Chapter, and within the prerogatives of his office.

We reviewed six requests for dispensation and 14 requests for amendments to Chapter By-Laws. The actions to grant approval for each of the six dispensations and 12 By-Law amendments was proper. Two amendments were denied for good and valid reasons together with explanation and instructions for resubmission.

The Committee reviewed legislation proposed by the Ad Hoc Committee for Constitution Revision and Up-date for consideration and adoption at this Grand Convocation. Proposed legislation for adoption of an "Eternal Membership Program" was also reviewed. Each proposed legislation was found to be proper for presentation and consideration.

The Committee reviewed the resolution distributed by the Grand Secretary's Office, which proposed a \$ 1.00 assessment on each member, and to invest such funds in a manner to guarantee the future financial health of this Grand Chapter. The resolution was found to be flawed in that:

1. It could not be implemented during 1997,
2. It would warp the Autonomous power and authority of the Grand Chapter R.A.M. of Florida

We recommend this proposed resolution be rejected at this time and prepared to eliminate the flaws.

The proposed amendment # 1, distributed by the Grand Secretary's Office, relative to Chapter 31.01 - Eligibility of Petitioners; Chapter 33.01 - Reception of Petitions; and Chapter 34.01 - Balloting (Chapter to be open); was found to be in conflict with the Ancient Landmarks of Freemasonry and this Grand Chapter of R.A.M. of Florida. The Ancient Landmarks of Freemasonry set the Fraternity apart from other social or service organizations. We recommend this proposed amendment not be considered.

The Proposed amendment # 2, distributed by the Grand Secretary's Office, relative to Article XIV - Officers of the Chapter, Section 2, Election & Appointment, was withdrawn by the proposer.

Two Requests for Dispensation to institute two Royal Arch Chapters within this Grand Jurisdiction were reviewed. The dispensations granted and the By-Laws for Highland Chapter UD., Royal Arch Masons, Avon Park, FL, and Island Chapter UD, Royal Arch Masons, Marathon, FL., were in accord with the Constitution, Laws and Regulations of this Grand Chapter. Therefore each of the Chapters are lawfully eligible to be granted a Charter.

The records for the consolidation and merger of Cabal Chapter No. 61, R.A.M. with Jericho Chapter No. 11, R.A.M. were reviewed. It was noted that this merger had been pending for a few years. Although the record reveals the administration and cooperation for executing the merger were less than desirable at best, the leadership and tenacity displayed by the Grand High Priest assured the completion of the dissolution of Cabal Chapter and consolidation of members and property in a lawful manner.

The Grand High Priest represented well this Grand Chapter at the 1996 South East Regional Conference; The Triennial Convocation of General Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons, International and those several foreign jurisdictions wherein he traveled.

This Committee commends M.E. Companion Ward for the diligent, prudent, deliberate, tireless and decisive manner with which he executed the affairs for this Grand Royal Arch Chapter. His service and dedication to the Craft and Capitular Masonry were evident in the broad and varied range of initiatives, undertakings and accomplishments enumerated in the Grand High Priests' final report.

Particular noteworthy was the continuous communication between the Grand High Priest, Grand Officers and Committees. His frequent consultation with the "Grand Family" on matters of Capitular Law/Regulations, procedures and projects status permitted well founded plans for action and decisions. We commend him for such extensive measures.

This Committee continues to take cognizance of errors-of-fact and significant omissions existed in the Proceedings published for this Grand Chapter. It is here reiterated that the proceedings of Grand Convocations are the official, adopted, historical and lawful record of this Grand viable enduring institution. Therefore, care must be taken in the recording, preparation, review and printing of this vital record if it is to be useful by the present Craft and a reflection for our successors.

Each member of this Jurisprudence Committee expresses his personal gratitude for the distinct privilege of serving this Grand Royal Arch Chapter.

LIBRARY COMMITTEE

The committee is pleased to report the Ray V. Denslow Library has proven to be a valuable tool. This year request for research material has been received from Hot Springs, Arkansas. The request centered around Greenwood Chapter # 15 Royal Arch Masons of Florida, The chapter was located at Greenwood near Marianna and is now defunct, It was however a very vibrant and active chapter during the 1860's producing several Grand Chapter officers,

Again the General Grand Chapter International library has lived up to its name. An international request has been tendered for any possible information regarding a particular persons participation surrounding the activities at the battle of Yorktown. We are pleased to report progress, but we have more research to do.

We hope everyone read the excellent article regarding the Grand Chapter of Florida's stewardship of the General Grand Chapter R.A.M. library which appeared in the winter issue of the Royal Arch Mason magazine. The Denslow Library was originally purchased by the General Grand Chapter R.A.M. International several years ago from William R. Denslow PGHP and son of Ray V. Denslow Past GGHP R.A.M. International.

After the article appeared in the magazine there has been an ever increasing interest in the library shown from all areas of the country; including some donations from outside the state .

Recently Mrs. William Denslow was visiting friends in Sarasota, during her brief stay in Florida members of the committee had the privilege of escorting her on a tour of the library.

This library is already one of the largest Masonic libraries in the southeast, and has been the recipient of books from appendant and allied organizations as well as from individuals and private collectors.

With no additional shelf space available the library must be enlarged. With that in mind plans are being considered for expansion, As previously reported a "library that does not grow will surely die".

Most Excellent Grand High Priest, members of the committee were privileged to attend recently the " Florida Antiquarian Book Show". The committee was fortunate to purchase several rare and out of print books for the library.

Last year the committee reported they were redesigning book plates and hoped to have them within a few months. My companions, with all the activity this year, your committee has not yet been able to undertake that portion of the work.

It is also available by special appointment.

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

The Committee understands its task to be that of "membership development" rather than, for a lack of a better word, "recruitment"

The Committee congratulates the Grand Chapter of Florida in its successful year of exalting Master Masons and the formation of new Chapters. An increasing and, more importantly, actively participating membership is surely a sign of progress.

The Committee rather focused its attention to the problem of, first of all, office leadership development, and secondly, which follows fast upon the first, activating the membership. No better comments could be made than that received by the chairman from one of the committee members, Companion Robert E. Burleson:

(This is a paraphrase.) Freemasonry has lagged behind the times. Rather than bemoaning the causes, it would be more useful to look at solutions.

1. Leadership begins by example. After proper and complete training on presentation skills, most of the program of the Grand Chapter could be presented by the DDGHP on their official visits. At the District meetings the Grand Line could hold an informal discussion session on what makes a good leader. Among those characteristics are:

- Vision - What does Freemasonry want to accomplish?
- **Inspire and motivate** - Positive attitudes leading to positive action. Read positive books like, *The Power of Positive Thinking*, by Rev. (Bro.) Norman Vincent Peale.
- 'Persuasion - We must be prepared to change. Give reasons why change is necessary. Don't dwell on increasing the membership. "We need to change because we're not as good as we should be and this is how we can improve."
- ' Knowledge - We must know what we want to teach and how we are going to present it in a way that the members will receive and act upon it. What kind of time commitment do we, (Grand Line; Chapters; DDGHPs), want to make? We must respect the members' time and not waste it but we must give them enough to use.
- "**A good leader will recruit and train his successor.**" - Search out the leaders. Go to the Blue Lodges and seek those who can make a positive contribution. Not everyone is able and interested in ritual work but there is so much more that needs to be done as well. There is more to leading and managing a lodge than being a good ritualist, as essential as that is to an active lodge. Mentor those who you enlist. Encourage them when they encounter resistance.

"Running a Chapter poorly leads to poor attendance which leads to fewer prospects of filling officer stations which leads to poor leadership, etc., etc., etc."

2. The Committee recommends the following:

- * The Grand Chapter emphasize leadership and management.
- * Funds be budgeted for leadership training.

* District (Area) meetings focus on helping the Chapter officers in leading their Chapters and let the DDGHPs present the GHP's program in detail on their visits after they have been trained to properly do so.

* Send a personal letter to all Chapter officers telling them what they will gain by attending District meetings; how this will help them in their year.

* Investigate using existing materials of the Grand Lodge of Florida and the General Grand Chapter.

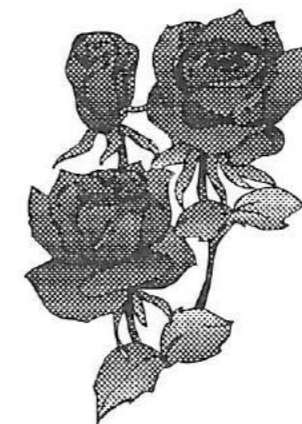

ROYAL ARCH RESEARCH ASSISTANCE

This is the report of activities and progress of the Royal Arch Research Assistance Program for the year 1996 - 1997. The companions of the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Florida, continue their support of the philanthropy of the General Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons International. The Companions of this grand jurisdiction have completed their twentieth year of support of this great charity. Although membership has decreased our Companions have given excellent support to the efforts made in behalf of the charity.

During this reporting period thirty-seven chapters, five honorary bodies and several York Rite Ladies Groups have contributed to the effort and have supported the charity in the amount of \$11,098.18 of which \$ 10,463.18 was for general contributions and \$ 635.00 for memorial contributions. YORK RITE PUBLICATIONS

Before their installations as Grand Presiding Officers of the Grand York Rite Bodies of Florida, M. E. Companion Harvey L. Ward, Most Excellent Grand High Priest; M. I. Companion Paul W. Friend, Most Illustrious Grand Master; Sir Knight Guy E. Waltman, Right Eminent Grand Commander, expressed that one of their collective goals during their term in office was the "re-publication" of "*The Florida York Rite Light*" whose publication had been "on-again, off-again" since its inception in 1962. In that respect, they asked Companion and Sir Knight Bob Burleson to spearhead this effort and to serve as Editor, under the terms of a mutually agreed upon contract.

Although 5 issues were originally planned, professional opinion (and persuasion) together with budget consideration narrowed that number down to 4 (with the recommendation to publish on a quarterly basis from May grand convention time frame). Following some annoying and expasperating exchanges with the U.S. Postal Service and its seemingly bottomless pit of regulations, the re-inaugural issue was published and distributed in June 1996. The first issue was generally well-received (although a few diehards and curmudgeons muttered something along the line: Oh, that thing again, Hrumpf!). Few things in life are so challenging as communications!

As the deadline for the second issue approached, word was received that the Grand Lodge of Florida was planning to publish "*The Florida Mason*" again. It was suggested that the Grand York Rite purchase four advertising pages and published the *York Rite Light* as a supplement in the Grand Lodge publication. Efforts by *The Florida Mason*, Business Manager, Brother Companion and Sir Knight Jim Rudman, and others to offer a reduced price to all allied and appendant Masonic bodies for advertising pages was instrumental in the Grand York Rite's decision to buy space in Grand Lodge's publication.

The difference between what it cost the Grand York Rite to publish and distribute on its own and what it cost to buy space and have *The Florida Mason* publish and distribute was not appreciably more, considering the significantly larger circulation base it would provide for our publication. On a "per reader basis," the cost was dramatically reduced while our audience was dramatically increased. [For example, if it costs \$3,500 to reach 10,000 readers, the cost-per-reader is \$. 35. If it costs \$ 4,000 to reach 65,000 readers, the cost-per-reader is \$.06]. In the long-run, we believe this will be potentially beneficial to the York Rite in Florida.

Difficulties between reconciling our mailing list and that of Grand Lodge's (dealing with Florida York Rite members not belonging to Florida lodges) continues to be worked between our Grand Secretary/Recorder and Grand Lodge's Grand Secretary.

Subsequent issues of *The Florida York Rite Light* were published in *The Florida Mason* as follows:

- * The second (Oct. 1996) appeared in the Fall 1996 edition
- * The third (Jan. 1997) was published in the Winter 1997 edition
- * The fourth (May 1997) was included in the Spring 1997 edition

Whether or not we continue to publish in this manner will depend on what transpires at the Grand Lodge Communication in June. Your Right Excellent Grand King, Right Illustrious Deputy Grand Master, and Very Eminent Deputy Grand Commander have indicated that *The Florida York Rite Light* will continue to be published next year, and, if necessary, we can do so using our mailing permit.

One of the concerns of any Editor is having more "stuff" than needed to fill the space allotted. With any new publication, this build-up process usually takes time and education. Since we don't publish on a more frequent basis (i.e., monthly), some material becomes outdated even before it arrives, although every bit of information is read and its "timeliness" ascertained. This process should not deter York Rite Bodies and members from sending in material for publication, however. We won't know what's happened (or happening) unless you tell us. And those who did just that this past year, my gratitude (with special thanks to Companion and Sir Knight Warren Almand for his insight and continued flow of "stuff" of interest).

We believe we have a quality publication which is well-rounded in news content and provides a "vehicle" from which the Grand Presiding Officers can expand on their programs and reports on their progress. It is the art of communication which enables "the body" to talk with "the parts." Common sense tells us that the more we communicate, the more we become knowledgeable. And the more knowledgeable we are, the better our decisions, the greater our successes, and the greater the pride in ourselves.

I thank Most Excellent Companion Harvey, Most Illustrious Companion Paul, and Sir Knight Guy for their understanding and appreciation of what is required to publish a quality statewide publication. I thank them for their trust in my professional abilities and for their support in seeing an idea become reality. To see that happen and to be a part of it is an opportunity for which I will always be grateful.

And to you, our readers, we trust that our work has merited your interest, gained your respect, and warranted your continued support. If we have accomplished those goals, our efforts, by any standard, by every measure, have been successful.
