At this time we also extend our sympathies to our Sister Grand York Rite Bodies in the loss of their leaders.







CONSTITUTION, INDEX & UPDATE COMMITTEE

This committee presented four proposed amendments to the Constitution and Regulations for the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Florida. Each of the proposed amendments were coordinated with the Jurisprudence Committee as content and propriety. All were found to be in proper style for presentation to the delegates for their consideration and ballot. (Each Proposed amendments is numbered here for ease of reference only)

Proposed to amend Laws, Rules and Regulations, Chapter Nine Amendment No. 1: - Grand Secretary, by adding Section 9.02 (New):

"All fees, reports, donations (except donations to the Royal Arch Research Assistance), and all registrations shall be sent through the Grand Secretary's Office, who shall keep a proper record thereof and provide copies to the Most Excellent Grand High Priest and the necessary Grand Chapter Committees."

This proposed Amendment failed the two/thirds majority vote required for adoption. adoption.

Amendment No. 2: Proposed to amend Laws, Rules and Regulations, Chapter Twelve.

Grand Chapter Conversation (1). Grand Chapter Convocations and Proceedings by amending Section 12.02 a. (1).

Mileage and per diem, to read

(1) Each Grand Officer and one Representative of each Chartered ding the Grand Community of the Chartered of Chapter attending the Grand Convocation of this Grand Chapter, all members of Chapter attending the Grand Convocation of this Grand Chapter, all members of Chapter attending the Grand Chapter, all members of Chapter attending the Grand Chapter, all members of Chapter attending the Grand Chapte Committees, Past Grand High Priests, District Deputies, and Distinguished to receive Medal Holders, who are in attendard. Medal Holders, who are in attendance in no other capacity, shall be entitled to may be from the funds of the Grand Characteristics. from the funds of the Grand Chapter such funds for mileage and per diem as may be recommended by the Budget and Eigenstein as may be recommended by the Budget recommended by the Budget and Finance Committee and approved by the delegates.

If on any occasion the Grand Council If on any occasion the Grand Council and/or Grand Commandery should meet on the same day as the Grand Chanter when the same day as the same d same day as the Grand Chapter when mileage and per diem are usually paid and companion is also entitled to mile Companion is also entitled to mileage and per diem from either of the other hodies. In

no event shall any Companion of this Grand Chapter receive more than 1 day mileage and per diem for any single calender day. Such mileage to be calculated one way for the distance from the site of their Chapter or their place of residence, whichever is nearer to the place of the Grand Convocation. Those who reside outside the limits of the state will be paid from the site of their Chapter or their place of entry into the state whichever is nearer to the place of the Grand Convocation. This resolution shall become effective on June 1, 2000.

This proposed amendment was duly adopted.

Amendment No. 3: Proposed to amend Laws, Rules and Regulations, Chapter Thirteen - Grand Chapter Committees and Convention Board (General Provisions) by adding Section 13.05 (New):

"No committee created or described under this Chapter shall maintain a separate bank account, and all moneys received by any committee shall be forwarded to the Grand Secretary for proper accounting. No committee, either created or described under this Chapter, shall expend any funds except in accordance, as more specifically provided in these regulations."

This proposed amendment failed the two-thirds majority vote required for adoption.

Amendment No. 4: Proposed to amend Appendix A, Uniform Code of By-Laws for subordinate Chapters by amending Article XI, Dues, to read:

"The annual dues to this Chapter shall be (Amount) dollars, plus the annual per capita of the Grand Chapter plus such additional sums as the Grand Chapter shall from time to time prescribe, payable in advance at the beginning of each Chapter year, to wit: December 28th of each year. This resolution shall become effective June 1, 2000."

Companions, on behalf of the Convention Committee, let me welcome you to Daytona Beach for the 152nd Grand Convocation of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida. We hope that you have managed to enjoy the sun, sand, and hospitality of the East Coast while attending to Grand Chapter business. While we did experience some difficulties with the facility, the fellowship and brotherhood were outstanding

Before we proceed with this report, it is necessary for us to thank Rita Moore for her work at the bazaar table. The bazaar was one of the best we have ever had, and this

committee received nothing but extremely positive comments about the results. We should all be grateful for her service.

The ladies lunch was again a rousing success, with 141 ladies attending. All who attended told us how much they enjoyed the time they spent and the entertainment. The mens lunch was also a smashing success. We had 192 Companions and Sir Knights attending. The response this committee received was also very positive.

It should be noted that 304 Companions/Sir Knights along with 141 ladies were in attendance at the banquet. This makes it one of the largest banquets in recent history. This year the Grand Presiding Officers arranged for entertainment at the banquet. We on the committee are in agreement with every comment we heard, that this year's entertainment was outstanding. While we had some difficulties with the banquet, from the comments we have received, and from our own personal experience, the food was outstanding. The level of fellowship was extremely high.

Florida Graphics was again the lowest bidder for our souvenir program, and once again they did an outstanding job. It should be noted, however, that ad sales were down this year. A greater effort needs to be made by the Companions and Sir Knights to help sell ads. Please remember that this is a source of revenue for our Grand Bodies.

Every year in this report we have stressed the need for pre-registration. This is not only for the convention committee but also for each of you. This year we timed the Companions and Sir Knights as they attempted to register. For those who pre-registered the time spent at the registration table was (on average) 1 minute 32 seconds. For those who had not pre-registered this average was 15 minutes 42 seconds. Further, by pre-registering you are insuring yourself all of the information and supplies we give. I would like to thank you for electing me as your Grand Secretary/Recorder. I hope you have noticed the inhave noticed the improvements Christine Dixon, our Office Secretary, and I have incorporated incorporated.

During the past year your Grand Secretary-Recorder's Office has continued updating the Records with the hole. the Records with the help of your Secretary-Recorder's Office has continued upon of our active members. of our active membership are now at 98%. Unfortunately, there are about 8,000 records of Demits, NPD's and Dead of the state of the sta of Demits, NPD's and Deaths that have not been put in the Computer as of this date. Five hundred dollars has been added to the Budget in order to eliminate this "backlog."

We have brought the Office up to the new information are updating of our records. We have brought the Office up to the new information are updating of our records. the new information age. Improvements include all active members being now in Data Base in the Computer of the Data Base in the Computer, the ability to sort records based on Top Line Signers; those who have received their days are members. who have received their degrees during the Fiscal year; 25 yr. and 50 yr. members NPDs, demits, deaths, etc. NPDs, demits, deaths, etc.

The company that developed and sells the "Lodge Secretary" used by many Lodge throughout the USA, is in present the sells the "Lodge Secretary" used by many Lodge Secretary. throughout the USA, is in process of being updated to allow it to be used for York Rife

Chapters, Councils, and Commanderies as well as Blue Lodges. This could provide us with a program to improve our system as well as each Secretary/Recorder.

Another system is under study that will allow Secretary/Recorders to directly input the master data bank, thereby reducing their work load and cutting the cost of mailing, etc. There will be a Committee of experienced Software programers appointed by our three Leaders with knowledgeable Secretary/Recorders to review and debug this program to see that it meets our needs. It is hoped that each Secretary/Recorder will some day obtain Computers or have a member of his Body with a computer that will help him. This will improve our operation and reduce his and our work load, as well as standardize our record system. We will set up classes for any who desire them.

Computer printouts are being provided to Secretaries and Recorders requesting them for their Chapter, Council, and Commandery. Hopefully, by the end of next year we will also be able to provide them with floppies containing their records, forms, etc.

Our Florida Web page has had more than 2800 visitors. Have you visited our Web Page? It contains Schedule of Events, lists of our Grand Line Officers, District Deputies, etc. We have had many good comments on it.

Our E-Mail system is working very well, for information, monthly reports, schedule impacts, ordering forms, and other supplies. We now have thirty Secretary/Recorders who use computers, allowing improved communications, in addition to other members who keep them informed. (For those who do not have computers or E-Mail.) Remember, Secretary/Recorders, if you are not interested in using a computer have one of your officers or friends work with you.

Christmas Eve we were informed about a tragedy of a son of one of our Grand Line and we opened the office up Christmas Morning to get the message out. (Try to get people, Christmas Eve or Christmas Morning by telephone!) By using E-Mail and telephone we were able to spread the word to more than 200 Companions and Sir Knights immediately. Had we waited until Tuesday and used only the telephone, it would have taken us two or three days plus \$200 to \$300 dollars. The more we use the E-mail system the more we can cut our operating cost.

Your Grand Secretary/Recorder has attended four Grand York Rite Secretary/Recorder conferences this year where interchange of ideas has been very



I have in my possession, various documents from (24) of our Active Chapters and (34) Chapters which are now defunct. It may be that Chapters have no use for such of yesterday's history; however, I will keep them in the Grand Lodge Museum and History Committee vault so that they are available, if needed. The active Chapters for which I have such documents are: Gainesville # 2, St Johns # 4, Eureka #7, Putnam #9, Jeriche #11, Live Oak #11, Ocala #13, St Augustine #17, Manatee River #18, Keystone # 20 Thomas Brown # 22, Lake Worth # 24, Indian River #27, Joppa #28, Lakeland #29, S Petersburg #31, Jackson #32, Sarasota #35, Bay County #39, Crestview # 40, Winter Haven # 41, Clearwater # 45, Duval #48, and Poinciana # 50.

If any Chapter or Grand Chapter should want to take charge of these papers, I will be pleased to turn them over to them.

Our sincere appreciation to the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, for permitting this committee to serve in this area of our fraternal affairs.

JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE

The Jurisprudence Committee has reviewed the report of the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Companion David C. Wilkinson. We find the Grand High Priest acted judiciously within the Constitution, Laws and Regulations of the Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons of Florida; and within the prerogatives of his office.

W examined eleven (11) By - Law Amendments which were properly approved and sealed. Eight requests for dispensation were examined, of which M. E. Wilkinson granted six. Two requests were denied for valid reasons.

The Committee took cognizance that M.E. Companion Wilkinson, in unity and cooperation with the Most Illustrious Grand Master and Right Eminent Grand Commander, appointed a Protocol Committee to serve this Grand Chapter in particular, and the Grand York Rite Bodies in general, during the Capitular Year 1999-2000.

Further cognizance was taken that M. E. Companion Wilkinson implemented the Perpetual Membership Program, adopted at the 1999 Grand Convocation, by appointing the required Committee to administer the program.

Three proposed amendments to the Constitution, Law, Rules and Regulations for the Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons of Florida, adopted May 20, 1997, as amended; and, one proposed amendment to Appendix "A" Uniform code of By-Laws, thereto, were examined in coordination with the Constitution Review Committee. Each of the proposed amendments was found to be proper for presentation to the delegates for consideration and ballot.

The Grand High Priest represented well this Grand Chapter at the 1999 Southeast Regional York Rite Conference; the Triennial Session, General Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons, International; and those foreign jurisdictions wherein he officially visited.

M. E. Companion Wilkinson is commended for sustaining a high visibility for this Grand Chapter through the number of visitations to constituent Chapters and allied Masonic organizations. This committee commends M. E. Companion Wilkinson for prudent and deliberate manner with which he executed the affairs for this Grand Royal Arch Chapter during his term of office. Each member of this Jurisprudence Committee expresses his personal gratitude for the distinct privileges of serving this Grand Royal Arch Chapter.

PROTOCOL

It has been roughly sixteen years since PROTOCOL has been addressed by the Grand York Rite Bodies. During the last sixteen years most of you have become the leaders of York Rite. More often than not you have heard the word PROTOCOL, but it was never explained.

The committee applaud your Grand York Rite presiding officers for their decision to appoint a committee to study and implement a program on PROTOCOL.

PROTOCOL, as defined in Webster's Unabridged Dictionary is as follows: an original copy, draft, minutes, or a record document, more specifically it is referred to as a civil law system. However, the Spanish, Dutch, and Romans more specifically referred to its usage as DIPLOMACY. The definition of diplomacy has been accepted as the art and practice of conducting local, national, or international intercourse with skill and tactfulness. Perhaps a more permanent definition is provided in Webster's Ninth New Collegiate Dictionary: A code describing strict adherence to correct ETIQUETTE and PRECEDENCE.

From the latter two definitions we can form a definition that is most applicable to the diplomatic performance of our activities in York Rite. Ergo, PROTOCOL for our application shall be defined as the "Art and Practice of conducting local, state, and national meetings with skill and tactfulness by following a code describing strict

adherence to correct ETIQUETTE and PRECEDENCE. Such adroitness, kindness, fineness, distinction, courtesy and chivalry, which by the way have been hallmarks of our fraternity from time immemorial.

If each of us would practice the foregoing and develop a more refined sense of PROTOCOL, the fraternity would once again attain some of the enviable position it held in bygone years.

The subject of protocol is so broad and comprehensive that a large volume could be written about it. As you are aware, much of our conduct in the York Rite is governed by tradition, custom, and usage. There should not be a need to enforce the use of proper PROTOCOL or to penalize for infringement of good practice, but all should be aware of what it constitutes.

Our fraternity is a unique creation. The presence of the HOLY BOOK on the altar makes it inconceivable how any Brother, Companion, or Sir Knight could allow an atmosphere of slovenliness or undignified activity to be permitted within the walls of the respective body. Within these walls the HOLY BOOK opened is truly a place whereon "thou standest on HOLY ground." Within these walls there should be a sacredness and reverence to the fraternity in all its facets. That reverence should be sufficiently manifest to impress one as he enters. A great portion of the dignity which emphasizes reverence hinges on PROTOCOL.

The following are some examples as they should apply within our bodies: 1. Sir Knight, Companion, or Brother is known as the style of an individual of our organization. Within these walls of the respective body the individual should always be addressed by the proper style, followed by the Surname. For example, Sir Knight Jones-never Jones, or Mr. Jones, or even Sir Knight James Jones. Amplifiers of Modifiers of the style might be such as Worshipful, Right Worshipful, Most Worshipful, Right Excellent, Most Excellent, or just plain Excellent as the case may be; even Illustrious, Right Illustrious, Most Illustrious, Eminent, Right Eminent, or in the Case of the Grand Master of the Grand Encampment, Most Eminent Grand Master.

These modifiers should These modifiers should precede the style where appropriate. For instance, one might address Right Excellent Jones without making reference to his title.

Titles signify the station which the individual occupies or has occupied. Titles might be Captain of the Host or Captain of the Captain of the Host, or Conductor of the Council, or Senior Warden, or any of the appropriate TITLES that abound. It follows then that to address a member you should

use the style and surname, while to introduce you should use the style and full name followed by his title and organization. For example:

When Most Excellent Companion John Doe is being introduced in United Commandery Number 99, it would likely be proper to introduce him as Sir Knight John Doe, past Commander of Whistle Stop Commandery Number Twenty One, currently serving as the Most Excellent Grand High Priest of the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida. Introduce him by his title in the respective body first, then honor him with any currently prominent title in a sister body.

When introductions are being made, announcements read, or statements made, it shows a complete lack of PROTOCOL to make any form or remarks, especially derogatory

If someone is speaking, wait until he is finished before you rise to be recognized. You should always rise to be recognized.

If a guest speaker is running past his allotted time, it is the duty of the presiding officer and no one else to gently remind him that his time is up and that no other business is to be handled (no remarks or giggling from the sidelines).

Some guidelines for written communications:

Do not use Style prefixes as a part of the address envelope. Generally if you are writing to a current or past Grand Officer it is appropriate to use the preface HON. (implying honorable), but be sure you put a period after the n; otherwise just the name is

It is most appropriate to use the Style prefix in the salutation beginning the letter. This is an example of PROTOCOL when you properly recognize the Style and the current title that the individual has earned.

When closing the letter to a Masonic family member there are particular closings that are considered Masonic.

Masonic closings should read as follows:

Courteously for Chapter correspondence, Zealously for Council correspondence, Courteously and Fraternally for Commandery correspondence, Fraternally for Symbolic Lodge correspondence, and Fraternally when in doubt.

Examination of Masonic documents of the past reveals that our forebears tended to use considerably more flowery and eloquent terms. This may have been a way of separating the educated Mason from the less educated profane, or as a way of promoting the education of the Craft. Remember, Masonry has always fought illiteracy. While currently not in vogue, the use of intelligent and eloquent remarks possibly could help restore the fraternity to the elevation it once held. For example, the addition of the words "your humble and obedient servant" could he added to any of the closings above.

A prime example of respect and PROTOCOL is found in the admonition "Congratulate in public, admonish in private." This should always be a watchword of our gentle craft.

GRAND COMMANDERY PROCEDURES

When the Grand Officer makes a scheduled visitation he should be met at the hotel or some place agreed upon and the presiding officer should, unless the District Deputy has accepted the duty, take charge of the hospitality of the Grand Officer visiting. If there is no dinner planned for the meeting, then the presiding officer, or one of the dais officers, should take the visiting officer to some restaurant.

We are not talking about any member when we say there are those who attend dinner of an official visitation and then leave before the meeting. That is most improper and lacks PROTOCOL. Also, at the dinner see that your distinguished guests are served first. That is PROTOCOL.

If a member arrives late, he should not indulge in loud talking, in the anteroom, and also no joshing of the candidates while work is being conferred. Mirth has no place in our degree work. Neither should there be applause. When you applaud a ritualist, you reduce the Ritual to the level of a stage play. Give the member a pat on the back or a warm handclasp after the work has been concluded.

Prayers should never be offered in an off hand manner, because although Masonry is not a religion, it is religious in nature, and the Chaplain or Prelate should perform his duty with earnestness and sincerity, not in haste.

No officer should be dropped from the line for light or frivolous reasons; but if an officer is dropped from the line he should not take offense. He may not be qualified. He then should find where he can best serve the York Rite.

Always remember, whether you are in public, at work, with your family, or even when you are alone, you are a Mason. A non-Mason that might know you, will judge you and all Masonry by the way you conduct yourself. So you have in trust the reputation of every one of us. DO NOT BETRAY THAT TRUST.

YOUTH ACTIVITIES COMMITTEE

For the past several years, all three Masonically sponsored youth groups have suffered from the lack of adult leadership. Properly trained and motivated leaders who are willing to spend the needed time with our youth are in short supply. Our apathy is showing.

While the Order of Rainbow for Girls in Florida appears to be increasing their membership slightly, most Assemblies do not have enough girls to put on their initiations without outside help. Here and there we see strong Assemblies, owing mainly to strong support from their sponsoring bodies. In 2001, the Rainbow will have a millennium celebration, for which they will need our financial assistance.

The International Order of Job's Daughters is barely hanging on. They no longer have a sufficient number of members to be officially recognized by their supreme governing body. For the past three years, this has meant that they are operating more or less unofficially, without a Grand Guardian Councilor Grand Bethel of Florida. The membership prerequisite of having a Masonic relative reduces the pool of eligible girls from whom they can draw. Add this to the problems all volunteer organizations are having, and there is no question why they are hurting.

The Order of DeMolay is not in such dire straits, but membership numbers are shadows of former times. The number of Chapters has dwindled from a 1968 all time high of 101 to the current number of about 30, with a corresponding drop in active membership. Most Chapters, like the Rainbow Assemblies, must get help from other Chapters to confer their work. Membership ideas and efforts in various parts of the state have promise, but results are yet to be seen. DeMolay International has instituted a screening procedure for prospective adult workers, which addresses parents' concerns about child abuse and fitness to work with young people.

In all three organizations, the youth have difficulty recruiting members because of the preponderance of alcohol, drugs, and gangs in the schools. Children involved with those things are not material for our groups. Parental fears also get in the way of recruiting. Many parents think our groups are demonic cults, anti-Christ, or some other bad thing. Even many decent kids say they are too involved in computers, video games and the Internet to be interested in getting out in a group. Nobody seems to have answers for these challenges.

One answer would be more active involvement on the part of Masons in helping our Masonic Youth build their groups. We can be on the lookout for decent kids ages 11-

20: Our children, grandchildren, nephews, nieces, neighbors, and co-workers kids, and give their names to youth leaders. We can invite Masonic and non-Masonic families to activities where they can meet members of our youth groups. We can invite the young people to perform or serve at various Masonic Functions. We can talk with the current adult youth leaders, give them encouragement and recognition, find out what they need. And, yes, we can contribute money to their causes. They need adults working with them most of all, but financial contributions can't hurt. Bottom line: We need to do SOMETHING, ANYTHING, before Rainbow, Job's Daughters, and DeMolay are just memories.



CHRONOLOGY Titles of Meetings and Dates of Bodies Composed Exclusively for Masons

The ordinary Calendar, or vulgar era, is not generally used by Freemasons in dating their official documents. They have one peculiar to themselves, differing according to their various Rites.

Ancient Craft Masons in all parts of the World, add 4,000 years to the Christian era, calling it Anno Lucis - Year of Light; abbreviated A.L. (This fact has a symbolic reference world, and the principles and light reference, not because they believe Freemasonry is, but that the principles and light of the invited that the principles and light of the institution are coeval with the creation.) AF & AM Lodges hold "Communications."

Royal Arch Masons date from the building of the second Temple - 530 B.C. Their style is the discovery. Royal style is, therefore, Anno Inventionis - A. Inv. - in the year of the discovery. Royal Arch Chapters hold "Convocations."

Cryptic Masons date from the completion of Solomon's Temple 1000 B.C.. Their style is Anno Depositionsis - A. Dep. - in the year of Deposit. Royal and Select Councils hold "A council solo "Royal and Select "Royal and "Royal and

Knights Templar date from the organization of the Order in 1118 A.D. Their style is, therefore is, therefore, Anno Ordinia - A.O. - in the year of the Order. Knights Templar

Order of the High Priesthood dates from the blessing of Abraham by the High Priest Melchizedek, which occurred 1914 B.C. Their style is Anno Benedistionis - A.B. in the year of the Blessing, Councils of Anointed High Priest "Convocations."

Scottish Rite differs from the Ancient Craft in that they use the Jewish chronology, ANNO MUNICIPAL CONTROL OF THE PROPERTY OF ANNO MUNDI (A.M.) "In the Year of the World".

ANCIENT CRAFT MASONS - Add 4,000 years. Thus: 2001 + 4,000 = A.L. 6001

Royal Arch Masons - Add 530 years Thus: 2001 + 530 = A. Inv. 2531

Royal and Select Masters - Add 1,000 years. Thus: 2001 + 1000 = A. Dep. 3001

Enights Templer a Subtreet 1,118 years, Thus: 2001 - 1118 - A.O. 883 Order of Fried Priceshond Add 1017 years, Thus: 2001 + 1913 - AB, 3914

Scottish Rite - Add 3760 years. Thus 2001 + 3760 = A.M. 5761
