



REPORT OF THE GRAND HIGH PRIEST 2000 - 2001

To the Officers, District Deputies, Past Grand High Priests, and members of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida, welcome to the One Hundred Fifty- Fourth Annual Convocation of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida. We are very pleased and honored by your attendance and participation in conducting the affairs of our Grand Chapter. I hope that you have been properly received and that your accommodations are satisfactory.

We extend to each of you our most cordial greetings, and are particularly pleased by your attendance. We trust that you have been properly received, and that your accommodations are satisfactory.

STATE OF THE CRAFT

Capitular Masonry is alive and generally well in Florida. Some of our Chapters are strong and vibrant; some are weak and floundering; most are just getting by. The relative strength of a given Chapter, and the interest and attendance at its meetings is depending upon the comradeship of its members and general preparation of its officers. Relative size has nothing to do with its strength. The loss of members due to NPD's is still a major problem. The long-term effect of the Shrine's action to drop the requirement for membership in the York or Scottish Rite is still to be decided.

On January 13, 2001, my Grand Chaplain, R. E. Companion Vernon G. Hitchcock, one of my oldest friends and my Masonic Mentor, lost his battle with cancer. I appointed, and installed, R. E. Companion Robert A. Niles on February 8, 2001, to fill the remainder of the term as Grand Chaplain.

In recognition of our long time members, this year we added a 40-year silver certificate and pin; and 55, 60, 65, 70 - year gold certificates and pins to the existing 25 and 50 year certificates and pins.

AUDIT

On July 14th at 9:30 A.M. the Audit Committee met at the Grand York Rite Office to audit the Chapter, Council, Commandery, Convention, and York Rite Office books.

The Grand Secretary/Recorder and Grand Treasurers for the Convention were in good order, showing money and members who had preregistered. We were able to use records from the Grand Treasurer in place of not having the records from the Mileage and Per Diem Committee. The lack of proper records from those at the front desk prevented us from doing a complete audit of the convention.

It was pointed out that due to the Hotel problem of over booking and contract, we had higher than normal room cost.

It is recommended that a record keeping system be implemented for the registration desk. We were informed that there will be a new system in place of the old for the next convention to provide better control and records of late registrations. Also, the new preregistration program worked very well and we will continue using the same system at the next convention.

Income was \$24,299.34 and expenses were \$28,227.22. However, there is still income of \$649.51 outstanding from the former Convention Board's checking account that is being closed. The difference between the income received and expenses of the convention will be taken from the approximately \$7,500.00 that has been in a separate Convention Fund Account for many years, the balance going into the General Fund. Income included \$3,429 in Registration fees and \$3,204 from the ads in the Convention Program.

CONVENTION REPORT

Our York Rite Convention, April 28 through May 1, 2001, was a big success. A total of 307 Companions and Sir Knights preregistered, with 35 late registrations, for a grand total of 342. We had 392 men and women at our banquet of steak and chicken. Our Mens Lunch had 192 men and the Ladies Lunch had 152 ladies, the largest turn out ever.

Other then the Commandery exceeding its estimated schedule by 1 1/2 hours, due to an abnormal number of resolutions, the two-day session was a great success. We had many good comments about a shorter convention, especially from many of the Delegates. Some complained that the introductions are still too long. However, there were fewer complaints this year than in the preceding years, so we are improving. Some suggested that the Order of High Priest, Silver Trowel, and Knight Crusader degrees could be done prior to each GHP, GM, and GC Homecoming.

All the convention committees: Convention Assistance, Returns & Credentials, Mileage & Per Diem, Convention Board, and Registration members did a very good job.

The Divine Service collection of \$303.00, Church Service collection of \$92.00, and the Ladies Bazaar money was split between the Charities. The Ladies did an outstanding job!

The problem with the Convention Board's contract with the Hotel was, only 169 rooms at \$65,00 per night were available instead of the 200 rooms needed, and several of those were not available for Sunday and Monday. The hotel had overbooked prior to our cut-off date of April 6. This caused us to send many Companions, Sir Knights, and Guests to other hotels. To those who had to go to other hotels, we apologize. Our future contracts with hotels will have clauses to prevent this from happening again.

A new system, replacing the Convention Board system, will be used next year, eliminating or greatly reducing the problems at the registration desk. However, pre-registering earlier will also help to reduce this type of problem. We did implement one part of the procedure for this convention, by having the Grand Secretary/Recorder handle Preregistration. As always, changes can confuse things. We hope to have the problems worked out, and we will implement other changes for our next convention. We hope to continue to improve the convention operation and reduce our expenses.

Convention Board member George Malone handled the Convention Souvenir Program. He collected the money for the Souvenir Program ads, put the program together, and had it printed. This earned

\$3,204.49 toward Convention expenses. Everyone needs to get behind this project in order to reduce our Convention expenses. His report is in the Commandery section of the Proceedings.

Income was \$3,005 from Registration, plus the Souvenir Program's \$ 3,204.49, for a total of \$6,209.40. General expenses were \$ 5,932.35

Delegate & Distinguished Guests expenses of \$22,360.87 were taken out of the Chapter, Council, and Commandery General Accounts.

CONSTITUTION REVISION COMMITTEE

This Committee was presented with nineteen matters for consideration. There were proposed three Constitutional amendments and sixteen amendments to the Laws, Rules, and Regulations. Each of the proposed amendments was coordinated with the Jurisprudence Committee as to content and propriety. Some were found to be in proper form to be presented to the delegates for their consideration and ballot. (Each proposed amendment is numbered here for ease of reference only.)

Proposed Amendments to the Constitution of the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Florida;

1. Proposed to amend Article V, Section 2 (Eligibility to hold grand office) Would allow a PHP who had not presided over a Florida Chapter to hold office.

The Committee finds that: There is no effective date. The proposal is not in proper form. It should not be considered in its current form.

2. Proposed to amend Article XII Powers and Duties of Grand Officers, Section 5; Standing Committee add "n" Investment. Add Section 19:

The Committee finds that: The proposal is not in proper form. The letter "n" is already used for Constitutional Revision. There is no effective date. It should not be considered in its current form.

3. Proposed to amend Article XII, Section 5, Standing Committee; d. Mileage and Per Diem by deleting Mileage:

The Committee finds that: The Proposal is not in proper form. There is no effective date. It should not be considered in its current form.

Proposed amendments to the Laws, Rules, and Regulations of the Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons of Florida:

1. Proposed to amend Chapter Nine - Grand Secretary; To add (.02 dealing with fees, reports, and donations.

The Committee finds that: The proposal is not in proper form. There is no effective date. It should not be considered in its current form.

2. Proposed to amend Chapter Twelve - Grand Chapter Convocations and Proceedings. It would delete the payment of mileage and other qualifiers in the current legislation.

The Committee finds that it is not in proper form. There is no effective date. It should not be considered in its current form.

3. Proposed to amend Chapter Twelve - Grand Chapter Convocations and Proceedings; 12.05; Delete entire section.

The Committee finds that it is in proper form for the consideration of the delegates.

4. Proposed to amend Chapter Thirteen - Grand Chapters Committee and Convention Board (General Provisions); 13.04 York Rite Convention Board; Delete entire section.

The Committee finds that it is in proper form for the consideration of the delegates.

5. Proposed to amend Chapter Thirteen - Grand Chapter Committee and Convention Board (General Provisions) 13.01 and 13.04 as presently written; 13.04 new dealing with Committee's receipt of money.

The Committee finds that it is not in proper form. There is no effective date. It should not be considered in its current form.

 Proposed to amend Chapter Twenty-Nine - Chapter representatives to Grand Chapter; Stops mileage from being paid.

The Committee finds that it is not in proper form. There is no effective date. It should not be considered in its current form.

Proposed to amend Chapter 43.05 Certificates of Longevity and Presentation; adds Certificates
of Longevity.

The Committee finds that it is not in proper form. There is no effective date. It should not be considered in its current form.

8. Regulations 1.04, 8.02, 9.02, 12.01, 13.04c, 26.03c2, 26.03c3, 26.03e2, and 44.01 were all proposed for amendment. The Grand Secretary advised the Committee that they had been withdrawn by the person who wrote them, and were therefore not considered by the Committee.

The Committee wishes to point out that its stands ready to serve the Companions of this Grand Chapter in preparing legislation for consideration. Any legislation received by the Grand Secretary's office ninety days or more prior to the opening of the annual Grand Convocation is eligible for review by the Committee, and the Committee will be happy to offer assistance and correction for such legislation. Unfortunately, legislation submitted past that date will not be offered the opportunity for revision. No assistance was requested for any of the legislation referenced in this report.

Should any Companion wish assistance in preparing or reviewing legislation for the ensuing year, he should feel more than welcome to contact this Committee through its Chairman and/or the Grand Secretary's Office.

The Committee thank the Most Excellent Grand High Priest for the opportunity to serve the Grand Chapter.

JURISPRUDENCE

The Jurisprudence Committee has reviewed the Report of the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Most Excellent Companion Virgil P. Brown, Jr. We find the Grand High Priest acted judiciously within the Constitution, Laws, and Regulations of the Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons of Florida, and with the prerogatives of his office.

We examined five (5) By-Law Amendments, which were properly approved and sealed. Three requests for dispensation were properly granted and sealed.

Five proposed Amendments to the Consitution, By-Laws Rules, and Regulations, for the Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons of Florida, and several Resolutions were examined in coordination with the Constitution Revision Committee. The Committee's Recommendations are as follows:

- Proposed amendment to Chapter 12- Grand Chapter Convocation and proceedings, Deleting entire section 12.05 - Management of Convocation and Chapter 13 - 13.04 York Rite Convention Board - Deleting the entire Section 13.04 - the Committee recommends adoption.
- Proposed amendment to Article XII, Section 5 - dealing with Standing Committees adding Section 19 - Investment Committee and Chapter 26 - - Memberships, Right, Status, and Dues, Section 26.03 dealing with the Investments Committee -- the Committee recommends rejection.
- 3. Proposed Amendment to Article XII, Section 5 - dealing with Mileage and Per Diem, and Chapter Twelve, dealing with Mileage and Per Diem - the Committee recommends rejection because it was our opinion that it should remain a Constitutional provision.
- 4. Proposed Amendment to Article V, Section 2, and Chapter 29, Section 29.01 - Dealing with eligibility for office in Grand Chapter - the Committee recommends rejection because of ambiguity in wording.
- 5. Proposed Amendment to Chapter 13M, Section 13.01 and 13.04 dealing with Grand Chapter Committees and Convention Board specified by R.A.R.A. - the Committee recommends rejection because it is not in proper form.
- 6. Proposed Amendment to Chapter 9, Section 9.01 Dealing with the office of the Grand Secretary regarding handling of money - the Committee recommends rejection because it isn't in proper form.
- 7. The Resolution from the Constitution Coordinating Committee dealing with sections 8.02, 9.02, 12.01, 13.04, 26.03 and 44.01 -- the Committee recommends rejection because it isn't in proper form,

MUSEUM COMMITTEE

Shortly after the conclusion of the Grand York Rite Convention this past year, the committee received from B. John Ross of Trinity Commandery # 16 some very interesting items for the museum. Among the items received were an old chapeau, an unusual small ornate Knights Templar apron, velvet type sleeve gauntlets, the old style Templar belt, and a variety of other items.

In June, MIPGM Robert Burleson notified the chairman of the committee that he had a couple of boxes of odds and ends that he would like to donate to the museum. Arriving in the Clearwater area, he brought the items to the chairman for cataloging. Items included plaques, certificates, pictures, jewels, letters awards, patents, a KYCH black hammered lamp, etc., all from the estates of Robert Shugart and Harold Bremmer, two well known York Rite Masons.

Most Illustrious Burleson and your chairman later went to the museum and spent several hours adding many new items (that had been previously cataloged) and rearranging the existing items in the several showcases which house your museum.

In July, Sir Knight James Mason, DDGC of the third Chivalric District, presented your chairman with more Knight Templar items for display. These items were donated by Sir Knight Harry Beardsley, formerly of Saudi Arabia. Among those items included a very unusual K. T. Turban (head wear which he wore on occasions, in lie of the chapeau), also an ornate chapeau and belt.

Cataloging all the items donated by M. I. Companion Bob Burlseon and Sir Knight James Mason in the log book, then transferring all the information onto computer records, took considerable time. When this was accomplished, Bob Burleson and Fred Morris offered their services in helping arrange and display the more than 170 new items. They drove over from Orlando the morning of August third to assist with the work. After all the work was completed, two hot, tired and dedicated Masons drove back to Orlando, just in time to attend another Masonic function.

I am pleased to report at this time the museum has more than 500 items on display. These items represent the Chapter, Council, Commandery, Lodge, O.E.S., Job's Daughters, Rainbow for Girls, Shrine, Scottish Rite, DeMolay, Grotto, KYCH, Night Masons, York Rite College, Grand Chapter, General Grand Chapter, Grand Council, General Grand Council, Grand Commandery, Grand Encampment, and the Grand Lodge of Florida.

At the area meeting held at Venice, September 16th, M.I. Burleson again presented your chairman with a box of memorabilia containing Masonic items from his own personal collection. These could be added to the bookcase to improve security for the books. After checking with some of the home centers, it was felt the cost of new doors was prohibitive. The three of us then scouted others sources and located two matching sets of sliding glass doors, complete with tracks, etc. After negotiating the price (which was a fraction of the cost of the Home Centers), we purchased them,





and then inquired as to delivery. They also agreed to deliver them to the York Rite Temple at no cost.

On February 6th, at 7 A.M., Duane and Floyd again drove from Lakeland to Clearwater and met yours truly and Mike La Follette (Illustrious Master of Clearwater Council). We began assembling the enclosure necessary for the sliding glass doors and tracks. About 6:30 that evening we thought we had put in enough time for one day. Although all work was not quite completed, we had a feeling of accomplishment. What an addition to the Ray V. Denslow Library! By the time Duane and Floyd arrived back home in Lakeland, no one had to rock them to sleep that night.

Tuesday, February 21st, Mike Lafollette purchased the necessary wood trim for the doors. He then began routing and mitering the material so it would look nicer than just rough stock.

Wednesday, February 21st, Mike Lafollette and Marvin W. Gerhard met at the Temple close to 11 A.M., and began installing the trim around the sliding glass doors; all the preliminary routing and mitreing fit into place without a hitch. That evening, while the men were attending a Council meeting, Betsy Gerhard painted all the trim a shade of blue that complimented the rest of the room. When the meeting was over, Betsy was still painting. The men all commented on how nice it looked and thanked her very much. As of this writing there is still a small amount of work necessary before this project is completed. We will keep you updated.





This Amendment was approved.

ARTICLE XII - GRAND CHAPTER COMMITTEES, Section 5, Standing Committees add:
 Investments

Article VII Grand Chapter Committees, add Section 19: Investment Committee

The Investment Committee shall be composed of three Royal Arch Masons in good standing in Florida Chapters. The committee will work in concert with the Investment Committees of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Florida and the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Florida should those committees be authorized and formed. The members of the committee shall be men of experience in the management and investment of funds or members qualified in professions that acquaint them with the duties and responsibilities of management and investment of funds, including but not limited to bankers, public accountants, lawyers, financial counselors and mem of similar training and experience. Initial implementation shall be by appointment by the Grand High Priest of one member for a term of three years, one member for a term of two years, and one member for a term of one year. Each incoming Grand High Priest shall then make one appointment to this committee. No person while a member of this committee, or for a period of two (2) years after serving on this committee, may, directly or indirectly, gain any economic benefit by reason of bidding, providing or contracting to provide financial services to the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Florida. Any attempt to circumvent this regulation will be prima facie evidence of unmasonic conduct and will be punished as such.

The committee shall make recommendations to the Grand High Priest and Treasurer in respect to the following matters:

- (a) Selection of Registered Investment Advisor(s) to manage, or Registered Representative's(s') broker-dealer or its clearing firm to act as custodian for such portions of the Grand Chapter Funds as shall be entrusted to such Registered Investment Advisor(s) or Registered Representative's(s') broker-dealer or its clearing firm by written contract/document with the Grand Chapter.
- (b) The terms of contract with the Registered Investment Advisor(s) or Registered Representative's(s') broker-dealer for management and custodianship of the Grand Chapter's funds.
- (c.) The means, methods, and standards for evaluation of the services of the Registered Investment Advisor(s) or Registered Representative's(s') broker-dealer managing and investing the Grand Chapter's funds.
- (d) The Committee shall comply with the foregoing in respect to the Life Membership Plan, as well as operating funds and funds held in trust by the Grand Chapter.

Chapter 26, Paragraph 26.03 (3) change first sentence to read "The Grand Chapter Treasurer is hereby empowered to invest all funds received by the Grand Chapter for this program."

Chapter 26, Paragraph 26.03 (3) delete the second sentence, which states "Investments are to be in Government Insured Securities of maximum interest yield."

Chapter 26, Paragraph 26.03 (3) change the third sentence to read "Term of Securities are to be determined by the Investment Committee."

This amendment was approved.

3. ARTICLE XII - POWERS AND DUTIES OF GRAND OFFICERS

Section 5; Standing Committees - It is proposed to be changed to read as follows; e. Per Diem

This Amendment was approved.

CHAPTER TWELVE to be amended as follows:

Chapter Twelve - Grand Chapter Convocations and Proceedings 12.02 .02; Per Diem

a. Each Grand Officer and one Representative of each Chartered Chapter attending the Grand Convocation of this Grand Chapter, all members of Committees, Past Grand High Priests, and District Deputies, who are in attendance in no other capacity, shall be entitled to receive from this Grand Chapter such funds for per diem as may be recommended by the Budget and Finance Committee and approved by the delegates. Past Grand Officers now residing or sojourning outside the State of Florida, shall receive per diem only for the days actually in attendance at Grand Chapter.

b. The Grand Chapter shall advance an amount egual to one half the annual allowance to the Grand High Priest upon his installation, and after spending same, he shall receive the balance. He shall not be required to account for these funds to the Grand Chapter.

his Amendment was approved

CHAPTER TWENTY-NINE - Chapter Representatives to Grand Chapter 29.01; Chapter Representatives

The representatives of each Constituent Chapter to the Annual Grand Convocation and Special Convocations of the Grand Chapter shall be High Priest, King and Scribe of such Chapter or their awfully authorized Proxies; the High Priest or his Proxy shall receive Per Diem as provided herein. This Amendment was approved.

- 4. ARTICLE V, SECTION 2 Eligibility It is proposed to be changed to read as follows;
- a. Any Companion shall be eligible for office in this Grand Chapter who has been regularly elected, installed and presided over a Chartered Chapter for one full year, and must be a member in good standing in any Chartered Chapter.

This Amendment was disapproved.

 CHAPTER THIRTEEN - GRAND CHAPTER COMMITTEES (General Provisions) add new section as follows: Section 13.04 (New)

No committee, except RARA Committee, shall maintain a separate bank account, and all moneys received by any committee shall be forwarded to the Grand Secretary for proper accounting. No funds shall be expended by any Committee either created or described under this chapter, shall expand any funds except in accordance, as more specifically provided in these regulations. This amendment was approved.

CHAPTER NINE - GRAND SECRETARY be amended to add the following new section.
 Section 9.02 (new)

All fees, reports, donations (except donations to the Royal Arch Medical Research Assistance Foundation), and all registrations shall be sent through the Grand Secretary's office, who shall keep a proper record thereof and provide copies to the Most Excellent Grand High Priest and the necessary Grand Chapter Committees as required.

This amendment was approved.

- An amendment from the Constitution Committee on the rewording of various sections of the Constitution and Regulations was rejected and withdrawn.
- 8. 43.05 Certificates of Longevity and Presentation. Be amended to read as follows: Certificates of Longevity shall be of two Classes:

- a. A Companion who has been a Royal Arch Mason in good standing for a period of Twenty-Five or Forty Years, and who has not been disciplined, suspended or expelled for an offense involving moral turpitude, and is a member of a Florida Chapter upon presentation of satisfactory evidence of such length of membership by the Recorder of his Chapter to the Grand Secretary, and said evidence being certified correct and final judgement being given on the eligibility by the Grand Secretary and approved by the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, shall be entitled to receive a Certificate, a Silver Card, and a Silver Lapel Button issued by the Grand Chapter; provided, that the Council shall carry the name of the Companion on its regular roll of membership and shall pay to the Grand Chapter all annual per capita taxes and assessments for said Companion.
- b. A Companion who has been a Roayl Arch Mason in good standing for a period of fifty, fifty-five, sixty, sixty-five or seventy years, and who has not been disciplined, suspended nor expelled for an offense involving moral turpitude, and is a member of a Florida Chapter upon presentation of satisfactory evidence of such length of membership by the Recorder of his Chapter to the Grand Secretary, and said evidence being certified correct and final judgement being given on the eligibility by the Grand Secretary and approved by the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, shall be entitled to receive a Certificate, a Gold Card, and a Gold Lapel Button and if twenty-five years of such services have been in a Florida Chapter or Chapters, shall be exempt from all Grand Chapter all annual per capita taxes, dues and assessments.
- c. Forms for applying for Life Membership class, and under the Certificate of Membership (Longevity) class will be furnished by the office of the Grand Secretary.
- d. The Certificates for Twenty-five, Forty, Fifty, Fifty-five, Sixty, Sixty-five and Seventy Year Membership, the Silver and Gold Cards, and the Silver and Gold Lapel Buttons shall be obtained from the office of the Grand Secretary.
 - e. Presentation Ceremonies.
- (1) At the time of presentations of the Fifty, Fifty-five, Sixty, Sixty-five and Seventy year Certificate, Gold Card and Gold Lapel Button, the Companions receiving same shall be entitled to the Private Capitular Grand Honors; provided that such Grand Honors shall be given only in a Tyled Convocation.
- (2) When a recognized Grand Jurisdiction requests that one of its members be presented a Fifty, or greater, Year Certificate by a Florida Chapter, the recipient, if presentation is made in a Tyled Chapter Room, shall be accorded the Private Capitular Grand Honors, unless the Grand Jurisdiction requests that it not be done.

This Amendment was approved.



Knights Templar date from the organization of the Order in 1118 A.D. Their style is, therefore, Appendix Control of the Order Knights Templar therefore, Anno Ordinia - A.O. - in the year of the Order Knights Templar Commandries hold. Commandries hold "Conclaves."

Therefore, in answer we might know the truth of everlasting life." Therefore, in answer to Job's question: "If a man die, shall he live again?", the Great Captain of our salvation answers: "I am the resurrection and the Life; he that believeth in Me, though he were dead, yet shall he live; and whosoever liveth and believeth in Me shall never die." "And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes, and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain; for the former things are passed away." Praise be to God, that through Christ's victory over death, and His great love for us, we have the Blessed Assurance that when our labors have ended and we have laid down the working tools of this mortal life a place, eternal in the Heavens.

Each year it is our sad duty to report on the number of our members from the three Grand York Rite Bodies who have passed through this vale of tears, never to pass again; knocked and the door has been opened to them as we pray it shall be opened to us one day. The Grand Chapter lost 203 by death; the Grand Council 204 and the Grand Commandery 230. This, of course, includes some overlapping as some of them belonged to all three Bodies. As Masons, we believe in the mortality of the body and the Immortality of the soul and we rejoice in the knowledge that each of them has heard that thrilling admonition, "Well done thy good and faithful servant, thou hast been faithful over a few things, I will make you ruler over many. Enter thou now into the joys of thy Lord."

Our ranks have been thinned by the loss of the following Past Grand Presiding Officers since May 1999: Most Excellent Companion Woodrow W. Cash, Grand High Priest in 1972 and S.K. Cornelious K. McAvoy Past Grand Captain General in 1968.
