

At 8:00 AM on Friday May 2, 2003, -the-156th Grand Convocation of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida was opened in full form by Steven Q., Steele, M. E. Grand High Priest. The M. I. Grand Master, Richard E. Foreman, and R. E. Grand Commander, Robert E. Burleson, were introduced and welcomed. The M. E. Past Grand High Priests were introduced and given Grand Honors. The Distinguished Guests were then introduced by M.Ex Companion Duane B. Young and given proper honors. The roll call was then taken (list to follow minutes). The Grand Secretary made the motion that all visiting Dignitaries be given Honorary Memberships; it was seconded and passed. The Grand Secretary, Wm. Robert Young, then made a motion that the minutes as printed and distributed in the proceedings be accepted as written; it was seconded and approved. The Grand Secretary then made the motion that the committee reports be accepted as printed and distributed. M. Ex. Companion Virgil Brown commented that the distributed report for the Audit Committee was the report for Grand Council, not the Grand Chapter, but that the report according to the Chairman, Glenn Chandler, is the same and was therefore accepted. The Grand Secretary then commented that in his report, it stated there would soon be Discs of the Constitution available. He announced that there are hard copies and Discs of the updated Constitution available at the Grand Secretary's office now. The motion was seconded and passed. Companion Walter Hammond gave the preliminary report on Per Diem. A motion was made to accepted this preliminary report, and it passed.

M. Ex. Grand High Priest, Steven Q. Steele gave his report; it was accepted as read. M. Ex. Companion Duane B. Young, Grand Treasurer, then gave his preliminary report. Stated the report will be printed in the proceedings, and the report was accepted. Companion Young stated that the Companions should note that they are under the budgeted amount and that the Grand High Priest used only 6% of his expense account. Ex. Companion Warren Almand, the Grand King, gave the report on the budget. He stated that his task was to cut the budget, but how do you cut a budget that is already tight and prices are rising on the needed items? The two year assessment of \$1.00 for each member has helped offset the cost of adding helpers in the York Rite Office. After a discussion on the budget, was then accepted.

Virgil Brown, MEPGHP, gave the report on the committee on Work and the RARA. There was a change on the original RARA report due to more donations being received. There also is a change in the closing date of the donations for RARA from convocation to convocation, from June to June. The report was accepted. R. Ex. Warren Almand, Grand King, gave the report on the Life/Perpetual Membership, and it was accepted.

Ex. Companion William Wyllie gave the report for the Committee on Thanks; it was accepted as read. The Grand Chaplain, John Hendricks, gave the Necrology report, which was accepted as read.

Ex. Companion Virgil Brown, PGHP, gave the Jurisprudence report, which was accepted as read.

Companion Frank Clawson then gave the report of the returns and credentials committee, which was accepted as read.

The Grand Amendments and resolutions were read and voted on. The resolution for an Administration Endowment fund was approved. The amendment for the changing of wording in the open installation ceremony section of Appendix "D" was accepted. The resolution for a formal Ceremony for presentation of service awards (50 & 60 years) was accepted.

Companion Charles Hollinger, MIPGM, gave a short talk on the financial need to raise the funding of our York Rite Bodies. Companion Paul Friend, MIPGM, also commented on the financial needs of our bodies.

R. Ex. Companion Warren Almand, Grand King, gave the report on Time and Place Committee, it was accepted.

The Election of Officers was then held. Ex. Companion Arnold Lamb cast the unanimous ballot for H. Warren Almand, Jr., as Grand High Priest. Companion Lamb also pledged \$1,000 for the Administrative Endowment fund in the name of his father, Past Grand High Priest George A. Lamb. M. Ex. Richard I. Lanier cast the unanimous ballot for Glenn Chandler as Grand King. Companion Robert Brigman, HP, cast the unanimous ballot for William F. Wyllie for Grand Scribe. R.E. Companion Wm. Robert Young cast a unanimous ballot for Duane B. Young, Grand Treasurer. M. Ex. Companion Duane Young, PGHP, cast the unanimous ballot for Wm. Robert Young, Grand Secretary.

The Grand High Priest then requested that Companion Howard Gardner be presented in the east to be presented his commission as the Grand Representative to Alaska.

The Grand Chapter then recessed for lunch, reopening for the Installation of Officers at 1:30PM after which the Grand Chapter closed it annual Convocation for 2003.



PRESENTATIONS AND HONORARY MEMBERSHIPS

I am pleased to have received Honorary Memberships in the several Grand Chapters visited during my tenure in office. Those I received were from Georgia, Alabama, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia. I have received honorary memberships from several of those Chapters visited within the state of Florida and some personal gifts from friends and Companions. My thanks to each of you for these kind and thoughtful acts; these small kindnesses are what make our fraternity the greatest the world has known.

VOUCHERS

As of May 1, 2003 I have signed vouchers 1 through 79 for a total expenditure of \$40,535.09. I am proud to say that we have expended only 81% of the amount which was budgeted to be expended for this Capitular Year.

STATE OF THE CRAFT

My companions, I am pleased to say the state of the Craft among the active and dedicated Companions is as friendly and cordial as it should be. I have been received with warmth and Masonic friendship wherever my journeys have taken me in the state. But I regret to say that the numbers of those dedicated Companions are becoming fewer and fewer. Our numbers dwindle year over year. I can not, in good conscience, paint a rosy picture for you. Now is the time for plain speaking; a time for truth, even though it be a bitter pill to swallow. We profess to work in the vineyards of this fraternity seeking truth. Then why do we rail against it when we hear it, when we know in our minds and hearts what is said is true? We lament our lack of attendance, lack of proficiency, and lack of enthusiasm. Yet we reject the paths to recovery as too difficult, too costly in time and money. We would rather sit in a circle, complain about the present situation, and fondly remember the past.

The situation of Masonry in this country is serious, even dangerous. The Grand Bodies themselves are confronted by conditions so critical that further procrastination in squarely meeting them would almost amount to a betrayal of the Craft. Exactly the same conditions prevail in other branches of Masonry; and all that is said here applies with equal force to them.

Some of the dangerous things confronting us are: Insufficient funds to properly carry on the work; reduction in membership, due mostly to suspensions for non-payment of dues; poor attendance at meetings; lack of interest; loosening of the bonds of fellowship; the use of Masonry as stepping stones to other organizations; and other things of a like nature.

And so begins a presentation to the Companions of the Grand Chapter of Florida in 1931 by Companion Hamilton Baluss, Chairman of the Educational Committee and the Right Excellent District Deputy Grand High Priest of the Ninth Capitular District. Further comments germane to our time were made to the Grand Chapter of Florida in 1918 by Most Excellent Companion Alex B. Steuart, Grand High Priest.

Masonry like all other institutions, during these troublesome days, is passing through a period of trial. In the language of current events, "a period of liquidation," finding out that genuine progress is really something more than a mere multiplication of numbers, slowly learning of the enormity of the mistakes of the recent past, and learning too the wisdom of conserving, in days of plenty, against the day of adversity, which comes as certain as the changing of the tide.

But for every condition and calamity there is some underlying and fundamental cause and a tremendous burden of responsibility rests upon the shoulders of the members of this fraternity and its leader, in helping to find the strength and influence of the fraternity, set about to remedy the situation lest it become much more aggravated and disturbing.

But first we must put our own house in order, and to do so, we must recognize and return to first principles. We must give more consideration to the idea that, as members of Chapters and Lodges owe a duty to Lodge and Chapters, so too has the Lodge and Chapter a duty to the membership.

Too many Masonic Bodies, in days but recently passed, have spent for non-essentials the means which should now have been available to help, aid and assist the worthy distressed, of whom, unfortunately, there are far too many at the present time.

Masonic bodies, more or less everywhere, hypnotized by the prevailing influence of wild extravagance have succeeded in mortgaging, not only the income, but the Spirit of the fraternity, in the providing of imposing edifices far in excess of their needs and frequently unsuited for their purposes.

My Companions, if we do not learn from the past, then we are doomed to repeat its mistakes. However, we can look to history both to avoid the errors and also to learn from its successes.

Again Companion Baluss:

Much time has been spent along many lines seeking the reason for these conditions. Two answers are usually given by the unthinking person or the one who is afraid to speak the truth; hard times – and the multitude of other attractions. Hard times as an excuse will hardly bear the searchlight of truth when we ponder on the money spent for amusements; such as automobiles, movies, radios, baseball, football, golf and the like. Concealed within the second answer lies the hidden truth. Let us examine it more at length.

There is all too much of sorrow, suffering, worry, troubles and heartache in this world for us to blame those who seek such moments of innocent pleasure as may come their way. It is not a theory, but a fact that confronts us. Not so long ago, the problem was to find enough pleasant things to occupy our leisure hours-now the problem is to select out of the immmerable things those which most appeal to us.

Whether we like it or not, we might as well admit that the present unpleasant situation is wholly and entirely our own fault. We have done those things we ought not to have done and have left undone those things which we ought to have done. We have fled from before this serpent-now let us put journey.

It is safe to say that nearly everyone who joins our order is honestly seeking brotherhood, friendship and social intercourse. Except in very rare cases, he is not yet in possession of all the Masonic secrets, even if he has taken all the degrees. He is a stranger to his Brethren and they are equally strangers to him. He attends one or two meetings. There is practically no one present except the officers and they are absorbed in their work. The meeting is opened according to the ritual; and may be good, bad, or indifferent, in proportion to the interest the officers take in their work. The minutes are read and a bill or two passed for payment; then they close and hasten away-althotigh

they may throw a bone to the hungry dog by saying, "My name is Smith; glad to meet you; come again; good-bye." In a more hopeful mood he goes when they are putting on work and finds some pleasure in this until the novelty wears off, but still he does not find that fellowship he is seeking.

Honestly now, (after this is repeated a few times) do you really blame him when he decides later to go to a movie or a dance or take an automobile ride instead of going to Lodge? He has found neither friendship nor a real understanding of what Masonry is. The Brethren are still strangers to him and he is still a stranger to them. The destiny of a Lodge is in the hands of its officers and they seldom, if ever, realize the utter boredom of the new member who sits on the side-lines. The officers seem to think that the membership should come to meeting after meeting and sit with bated breath and watch them go through their parts; when in fact each meeting is as near like each other as a carbon copy is like the original.

Companion Baluss goes on to establish nineteen "rules" for conducting meetings and events to raise the level of social intercourse amongst the members of the craft. In the interest of brevity I will not here delineate these rules. However, I would strongly recommend, to every member of the fraternity, take the time to read and contemplate this Companions entire presentation to the craft.

My Companions, too long have we been tilting at the windmills of the symptoms and not at the root of our illness. If we are sufficiently studied in the history of our fraternity (at least within the United States), we know of the growth of Masonry from the mid 1930's to the 1960's and possibly 1970's. Some will say that hard times cause a rise in the desire of men to unite in fraternities. I suspect, however, that intelligent men took to heart the words of Companion Baluss. If you will, we need to get back to the basics of feeding that need for social intercourse. The tides of time and social change still continue to move inexorably into the future. These we cannot change. However, we can and must change the way in which we conduct our business. The way in which we treat our membership in our interpersonal relations needs to be examined. We all can do more to nurture the deep-rooted desire that resides in all of mankind; more, too, we need to foster brotherly love and affection. That cement which bides us "into one sacred band or society of friends and brothers.

Again, I say to you that the winds of change are upon us. A little less than two years ago events welded and fused this country into a single purpose. We are truly citizens of the world. Our generosity knows no bounds. Every day brings reports of the death and loss of our Daughters, Sons, Brothers and Companions, and each of us shall feel the wrench of sorrow. May we not be found wanting of the strength to sustain us in these times.

Other events within our great nation signal change. We need now to remember more than ever that Masonry was founded as a self-help fraternity. In the past we provided for widows and orphans, and we can be proud of our involvement in the establishment of the public school system and many other institutions we now consider governmental "social programs." If we truly listen to current events and watch the "trickle down" of those assistance programs from the Federal to the State and from the State to the Local Governments, we will find that many of those programs that help truly need individuals are being terminated or seriously curtailed due-to lack of funds. We may soon find ourselves back in the "self-help" business, and we must begin to plan and provide for the financial basis of doing so

AWAKE, ARISE there is much work to be done and none other than those of us who sit in our Lodges, Chapters, Councils, Commanderies and other diverse Masonic Bodies on a regular basis can begin to work to cure this illness. Those of us who love this fraternity for all that it teaches us about the brotherhood of man and the fatherhood of God. Let us take up our staff and begin that long trek into the future without trepidation and without hope of fee or reward.

RECCOMENDATIONS

- 1. That the Chapters continue to be encouraged to confer the Chapter degrees within their own confines and that the Grand Chapter Officers continue to support these endeavors with their presence and assistance.
- 2. That the Grand Chapter purchase an adequate "Business Style" accounting program to record and track the financial transactions of this body and that the practice of using "spreadsheets" for tracking same be discontinued.
- 3. That the program of upgrading the equipment and systems at the Grand York Rite office be continued.
- 4. That a qualified group of Companions be identified and charged with the instruction of the esoteric and floor work of the Opening, Closing and degrees of the Chapter.
- That a formal program be developed to educate and assist the High Priest and other elected Officers of the constituent Chapters.
- 6. That the funds attributable to the Life Membership and Perpetual Membership Programs be withdrawn from the securities market placed in financial instruments with a guaranteed revenue stream. These changes to be accomplished when the market level allows for a guarantee of at least 5% return. Known income will allow the Grand Chapter and the constituent Chapters the ability budget income.

Whatever I have accomplished has been through the efforts of many Companions, friends and family. The Grand Chapter Officers, and their wives I might add, have been outstanding in their support, we are family. To my business partner Brother/Companion David A. Cockrell, I owe a great deal of debt. He has allowed me the time and finances to conduct the business of the Grand Chapter. To my family, my thanks for your support and understanding of my many absences during the past year.

GRAND CHAPTER AUDIT COMMITTEE

On September 14, 2002, the Audit Committee met with Duane B. Young, R. Ex. Grand Treasurer and William Robert Young, R. Ex. Grand Recorder at the Office of the Grand Secretary/Recorder in Titusville.

The records of the Grand Recorder and the Grand Treasurer were reviewed. Although a few minor errors were detected, no discrepancies were found in any of the financial records.

Comp. Charles T. Hutton, a CPA, made a number of recommendations that this committee thinks should be considered.

- a. A clear definition of the duties of the Audit Committee, and how the audit should be performed, should be placed in the Regulations of all three bodies.
- b. Although the Grand Secretary/Recorder and the Grand Treasurer are responsible for approximately a half million dollars in funds and securities, and many of the local secretary/recorders and treasurers are responsible for large funds; they are only bonded for \$10,000 each. In addition, insurance coverage of the assets of all three grand bodies is not adequate. A knowledgeable committee should review and make recommendations to correct these deficiencies.
- c. The Grand Treasurer should maintain only one Checking Account for each of the Three Bodies, using bookkeeping procedures to track the various accounts, etc.

CONVENTION REPORT

Our York Rite convention on April 30 through May 3, 2003 was a big success. A total of 273 Companions and Sir Knights preregistered, with 47 late registrations for a Grand Total of 320. We had 300 men and women at our Banquet of Prime Rib or Roast Pork. Our Mens Lunch had 115 men and the Ladies Lunch had 102 ladies. .

We had many good comments about the Resort. Many of the Delegates prefer the Banquet in the middle of the week instead of the first or last day. Some complained that the introductions are still too long. However, there were fewer complaints this year then in the preceding years, so we are improving. Some suggested that the Order of High Priest, Silver Trowel, and Knight Crusader degrees could be done prior to each GHP, GM, and GC, Homecoming.

All the Committees did a very good job. Pre registering earlier did help to reduce problems. The new Convention Board system, is really working well. We hope to continue to improve the convention operation and reduce our expenses. Your comments from previous conventions and this convention were greatly appreciated and we will continue working to improve our future conventions.

The Souvenir Program earned \$4726.62 toward the Convention expenses. This was better than last year. Everyone needs to get behind this project in order to reduce our convention expenses.

Income was \$17,264.23 from Registration. The Souvenir Program \$6924.00 for a total of \$24,188,23 and \$33,600.00 from the General Budget for a Grand Total Income of \$57,788.23. - 7. That you will not acknowledge or have intercourse with any Chapter that does not work under a constitutional warrant or dispensation?
- 8. That you will not admit any visitor into your Chapter who has not been Exalted in a Chapter legally constituted, without his being first formerly heated?
- 9. That you will observe and support such by-laws as may be made by your Chapter, in conformity to the Constitution and General Regulations of the Grand Chapter of the State of Florida?
- 10. That you will pay respect and due obedience to the instructions of the State Grand Officers, particularly relating to the several lectures and charges, and resign the Chair to them, severally, when they visit your Chapter?

JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE 2003

The Jurisprudence Committee met with Most Excellent Steven Steele, Most Excellent Grand High Priest, on April 24, 2003 at Eola Lodge; and again on May 1, 2003 at the Edgewater Beach Resort to review his GHP report and his actions during the year. We find that the Grand High Priest acted judiciously within the Constitution and Regulations of the Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons of Florida, and within the prerogatives of his office.

We examined sixteen (16) By-Law Amendments, all of which were properly approved and sealed. Thirteen (13) requests for disposition were received, two (2) of which were denied as being contrary to the Constitution and Regulations of the Grand Chapter. The remaining eleven (11) were properly granted and sealed. A careful reading of the Constitution and Regulations would have revealed that seven (7) of these requests were not really necessary. The Grand High Priest reasoned that none of these were glaring obvious that the disposition was unnecessary; and therefore approved them. The Committee concurs with the Grand High Priest's decisions.

The Committee reviewed Three (3) Amendments to the Constitution and Regulations, all of which were properly submitted and in proper form.

M. Ex. Companion Steele made Six (6) recommendations, all of which are being implemented or considered for implementation.

M. Ex. Companion Steele represented this Grand Chapter well at the annual convocations of five of our sister jurisdiction, as well as at the SE Conference, Summer Assembly at Maggie Valley, and the General Grand Chapter Convocation. He also visited all but four of the Chapters of Florida; and visited and continued his ritualistic participation in many Allied and Appendant Masonic Bodies.

Most Excellent Companion Steele is commended for the judicious and considerate manner in which he executed the affairs of this Grand Royal Arch Chapter during his term of office. In every case, he always went that extra mile in his duties. Each member of this Jurisprudence Committee expresses his personal gratitude for the privilege and high honor of serving this Grand Royal Arch Chapter and this Grand High Priest.

COMMITTEE ON FINANCE - LONG RANGE

Your Committee, consisting of the undersigned are also members of what is understood to be the "INVESTMENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE" whereby persons considered knowledgeable of the Stock Market have been assigned to direct future investments.

On March 22, 2002, the then Grand High Priest, Grand Illustrious Master, and Grand Commander directed the investment of approximately 85% of the Grand York Rite funds in the Stock Market. As everyone is aware, shortly after that investment, the market began a decline from which it has not yet recovered. As such, the funds of each of the Grand York Rite Bodies are languishing in the relatively benign market. Prudently, some 15% of the Grand York Rite Funds were retained in Cash, Certificates of Deposit, or other secure investments, which were planned to allow the Grand York Rite Bodies to continue operation without withdrawing any market investments for approximately two years. We are some 13 months into that cycle and it appears that the planning was sound.

The "INVESTMENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE" has been essentially silent in the only alternative -- that of riding out the benign market!

However, with the advent of the semi-permanent investment level of 85% of the funds (essentially all of the "long range funds") in the market and under the guidance of the "INVESTMENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE," the existence of a "LONG RANGE FINANCE COMMITTEE" appears to be a duplication.

It is therefore recommended that the two committees as now understood should be combined, renamed, or whatever into a single responsible committee consisting of long tenure members who may deal with the market lulls as well as possible successes.

LIBRARY REPORT

What an exciting time we live in. The world is ever changing. The country is in a turmoil, the world economy is up and down, and no one seems to know what is going to happen next. As one saga ends another is just beginning.

Some twenty plus years ago your chairman of this committee was involved in relocating the library of the General Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons International.

M.B. Walter H. Winchester then the General Grand King of the General Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons International, informed us that the library of Ray V. Denslow past General Grand High Priest was to be relocated. After much discussion and communication, the Masonic Temple in Clearwater, Florida earned the privilege of housing this particular library.

The Most Excellent Grand Chapter of R. A. Masons of Florida enthusiastically supported this project from the beginning, and budgeted Funds when necessary for its. continued growth.

M.E. Companion James Mac Donald and his wife Evelyn traveled to Cedar Rapids, Iowa to take possession of the library. Renting a U Haul truck Jim and Evelyn began the long trip back to Florida. Several days later they backed the truck up to the Temple in Clearwater, and we began to unload the boxes of books, Some 150 cartons. Jim and Evelyn were tired from their trip, and we were tired from unloading all those boxes.

The work however, was just beginning. The books had been stored for years, and the majority of them were covered with mold. It took weeks to unpack and clean the mold. The mold was on the front and back covers as well as on the inside pages. What a dirty job that was. A room had been selected to house the library, but it had to be renovated. The brethren came forth, donating their time and money. Paneling, acoustical ceiling tile, carpeting and light fixtures were installed. The library shelves were made in Lakeland by M. E. Duane B. Young then trucked 50 miles to Clearwater, and installed on the premises.

It would be impossible to name every one that helped with this project, but it is important that a few be remembered. Ralph H. Swanker, PHP, Duane B. Young PGHP, Lonnie Barrow, PGC, Dr. Walter H. Winchester, PGGHP, James B. Terry, PC, Jeff Jeffries, PHP, Wallace C. Stitch, PHP, Jacob J. Krawiec, PHP, Betsy Gerhard and Marvin W. Gerhard, PHP-PGC.

Then the work (fun) really began To arrange the books in proper order on the shelves. This also took months, actually years, because a library that does not grow will surely die, but grow it did. It was necessary to expand, and remodel. Donations were received from the companions, both from within the state and from out of state. We thank these companions once again for their support Some of the necessary material was purchased, but the labor was donated.

Pride was everywhere. Although not all the companions thought we needed a library, they supported it.

The years rolled by, and the library was used more and more. Valuable knowledge was gleaned from the pages of these books, and more than One person from out of state came and visited the library. A couple of times non-masons hearing of your library came and spent hours and even days doing research. This being a research library it was necessary for some member of the craft to be present at all times. They donated their time because of the love of the fraternity.

Then recently your committee faced the reality, twenty plus years had passed. Many of our supportive companions had left us, gone to that place no man can return. Now a new professional building is being built next to the temple, and a new bank next to that. The Temple is now in a prime location. Sooner or later someone may want this prime location. Our responsibility to the craft was first and foremost in our minds. Be prepared for the future. Make the decisions now, be ready to act. Be responsible. Is it time to relocate the library.??

The committee had contacted the General Grand Chapter about a year ago and spoke with them about the future construction. Locations were reviewed within and without the state. Other grand jurisdictions were communicated. A decision would have to be made. Finally, with construction of the new buildings nearing completion the talking stage became the actual stage.

Preparations were made, and the beginning of the end was about to take place. It was time to relocate the library once again.

We kept in contact with-Benny Allen the General Grand King. (now General Grand High Priest)

Later, J. Benny Allen called and set a date when the library would be moved. He and Jeff Hodges (Georgia) would personally oversee the moving. The Greater Atlanta Masonic Temple would be the future home of this magnificent library.

Two days of procuring large boxes, (in excess of 210) in which would accommodate the books. Two and a half days (five persons) unstocking the shelves, packing and repacking the books, stacking the boxes ready for loading, disassembling steel shelving, numbering, and identifying the boxes, perspiring, perspiring, and perspiring. Finally, came loading day.

A seventeen foot closed covered U Haul truck was rented. (11000 # gross weight) Up and down, up and down the ramp. Boxes, Boxes, and boxes, shelving, filing cabinets, card files, and more boxes. Also it started to rain and we really got wet, not only perspiration, but wet with rain. Oh well!

We started gathering boxes on June 17th, started the dismantling June 19th, and packing June 20h, It took all day Thurs, Friday, and Saturday morning to pack the books in the boxes. Friday afternoon Benny, Jeff, and I loaded while my wife Betsy continued to pack. Saturday morning with the additional help of Dale Kinsley (H.P). and Chic Cicero (King) we finished loading the truck in the rain. We were really wet, but what a relief. At 11:00 "all is finished".

This is the end of our journey as custodians of the General Grand Chapter Library, and as Masons we know, we should try to leave this world a better place than when we came. I am proud and pleased to report when the General Grand Chapter Library left Clearwater, and the state of Florida it was in better condition the when it came.

Thank You Most Excellent Companion Dr. Winchester for the confidence you had in Florida, more especially Clearwater when under your guidance the General Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons International selected us to be the custodians of this great library. To all the other General Grand High Priests who allowed Florida that same courtesy, to all the Grand High Priests of Florida who allowed us to serve Capitular masonry. Thank you Rt. Ex. Companion Benny for your friendship these last 20 years, more especially these last several days and to my new friend Jeff Hodges, thank *You* for your hard work, wisdom, and wit.

It is our hope and desire that this research library will grow and be used to further unlock the knowledge that is stored within their pages.

A little before 10 p.m. on Saturday the 22nd of June 2002 I received a phone call from Jeff stating that he and Benny arrived back home safe and sound. They had periods of hard rain, and it was nerve wracking traveling, but as I said in the beginning as one saga ends another is just beginning.

Clearwater, and Florida may have ended their responsibility of caring for this great library, but as masons our responsibility to seek further light should never end. We will continue to serve whenever and wherever needed.

August 1st, I received a telephone call from M. E. Companion Richard Sagar of Georgia asking if it would be possible to attend a General Grand Chapter library meeting at the Greater Atlanta Masonic Center Friday August 16th. I mentioned Betsy and I had planned to be in Georgia about that time so we would endeavor to make the meeting, Dick also suggested Jake Krawicc and Florence accompany us.

August 16th Jake Krawiec., Florence, Betsy and I drove from North Georgia down to Atlanta about 8:00 a.m. and arrived at the Atlanta Masonic Center about 10:00 a.m. We met with Dick Sagar, Jeff Hodges and several other brethren from Georgia, including J. Benny Allen (G.G.King), Bernard Blackwell, Wade Bridges, and Jack Ford, and their wives. After lunch several announcements were made regarding the progress of the G.G. Chapter library. Later we toured the Masonic Center, and then visited the rooms where the library will be housed. You enter the library through a solid door then go up several steps to the library itself The brethren and commanions of Georgia had already unpacked and placed about 120 cartons of books on the shelves. Approximately 80 cartons were left for unpacking There was considerable discussion on operations, expenses, etc. Decisions were made and progress will be upcoming. The committee plans on installing a 10,000 BID Air Conditioner in the room and place wrought iron wall railings with locked wrought iron doors leading into the library. The solid door to the entrance to the stairway will be replaced with a wrought iron locked door. This will aid the air circulating throughout the library. Dick Sagar, Hodges, and others plan to have certain books that are worthy of rebinding completed during the upcoming year. The committee will submit its report at the General Grand Chapter's triennial in Atlantic City this October. Plans for improving the Library are already under way, and it is with great pride we look forward to Companions using this research Library.

What a privilege it was for Jake, Florence, Betsy and I to be guests of the Atlantic Masonic Centers Library Committee where the General Grand Chapter Library is now housed. It is rather unique because the center will now have two libraries. Their own Masonic Center Library which loans books and the separate research library of the General Grand Chapter. Disk Sagar and the Companions of Georgia are-to-be congratulated on their hard work and enthusiasm. Without brethren like them mountains could not be moved.
