MASONIC RESUME OF MICHAEL PADRON, JR. M.E.G.H.P. FOR 2006 – 2007

Most Excellent Companion Michael A. Padron, Jr. is a native Floridian. He was born in Key West, Florida on June 2, 1934 and with only the exception of a couple short years has resided in the Sunshine State.

Under the tutelage of his Father Mike learned the plumbing business. At the age of 16 years he passed the union test as well as the City of Key West test and received his Master Plumbers license.

Our Grand High Priest received his formal education in the Florida Keys. His business and scholastic endeavors led him further into the world of business. He became a Residential Contractor, and then expanded his career by becoming a State Certified General Contractor, Real Estate Broker, Mortgage Broker and a State Certified Commercial Investment Manager. He is currently retired and resides, with his wife Sally in Sebring, Florida.

Grand High Priest Padron began his Masonic career during his high school years, when he joined Fernando A. Camus Chapter, Order of DeMolay, in Key West. On November 9, 1955, at the young age of 21, he was raised to the degree of Master Mason in Dr. Felix Varela Lodge No. 64, the oldest Spanish speaking lodge in Florida, chartered in 1873, the home Lodge of his Father and Grandfather. During the following 34 years he served his lodge, fellow brothers and community, reaching the pinnacle of his blue lodge career by being elected Worshipful Master, of Dr. Felix Varela Lodge, in 1989.

Over the years Most Excellent Padron has served Grand Lodge in several capacities. In 1990 he was appointed District Deputy Grand Master of the 30th Masonic District. The following year he served as Grand Tyler. In 1992 he served on the Masonic Home Board of Trustees. On May 24, 1993 Michael A. Padron, Jr. was elected Junior Grand Warden of the Grand Lodge of Florida and subsequently, in 1996 was elected and installed to serve the Craft as Grand Master of the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Florida. As Past Grand Master, Most Excellent Padron served Grand Lodge as Chairman of Jurisprudence in 2001 and again in 2003.

Most Excellent Padron was instrumental in returning Royal Arch Masonry to the Florida Keys, when, in 1996, Island Chapter No. 65 was Instituted and Constituted in Marathon, Florida. Most Excellent Padron was elected and served the Craft as Excellent High Priest of Island Chapter No. 65 in 1997, and in 1998 was elected Treasurer the Office which he currently holds.

Michael A. Padron, Jr. GRAND HIGH PRIEST'S REPORT 2007

In 1999, I began my journey towards the Grand East when M. E. David Wilkinson appointed me as Grand Sentinel. During the years prior to 2006, I constantly considered and put my heart and much thought into the development of my vision, plan and activities as Grand High Priest. Spiritual energy and personal commitment can describe the results of my Grand King's Retreat at the Four Points Sheraton of Sebring. Thirty-two Grand Chapter Officers, elected and appointed, Past Grand High Priests, Honored Guests and their respective wives attended this event. While I presented my program for the year, the ladies met in a separate room with my wife Sally and discussed her charity project for the ensuing year: "Children Do Matter Campalgn". The objective is to furnish 100 needy children with one new set of clothes. We are giving them something "NEW" to wear: something that no other child has worn: something that belonged only to the recipient. I think this is a very worthy project and all of the ladies are very excited about it.

Our Fraternity is plagued by four distinct challenges: MEMBERSHIP, EDUCATION, COMMUNICATION, and RETENTION. To address these, I adopted as my theme "GATHERING STRENGTH TODAY FOR A POWERFUL TOMORROW". I addressed each challenge as follows:

- MEMBERSHIP: I appointed Companion Jimmy Boone of Jacksonville Chapter, as Chairman of the Blue Lodge Representative & Membership Development Committee. Companion Boone developed and published a training manual modeled after the Blue Lodge, Brother Bring a Friend program. The Vision Statement printed on page three of the manual says "Building the future of York Rite Masonry by advancing our Blue Lodge Relationships is the goal of this Committee". The manuals were printed and distributed to all District Deputy Grand High Priests, Grand Chapter Officers and to all constituency Chapters. Companions I am sure that given time and the use of this program, it will bring dramatic results. I want to thank Companion Jimmy Boone for all of his work and effort in preparing and distributing this manual.
- EDUCATION: I addressed education on two fronts. First, I asked the Chairman of Committee on Work to prepare a program for the appointment of District Instructors in each District to disseminate the Ritual, making it his goal that all Chapters would be capable of opening and closing their business meeting without the use of rituals. Chairman, M.I. Companion Paul Friend did accomplish the first objective in preparing a District Instructor Program, which you will be asked today to adopt and I ask you for your support. Even though, we did fall short of our second objective, of having the Chapters open and close without rituals, we did make great headway and I do look for this goal to be achieved in the near future. I want to thank M.I. Companion Paul for all of his work and support in this endeavor. I also want to thank the District Instructors for their support and work.
- <u>COMMUNICATION:</u> All of our programs are of no use if they do not reach you. With this in mind, I asked my District Deputy Grand High Priests to appoint District Committeemen as Chairman of each of our Grand Chapter programs. This enables the District Deputy to bring you a message from the Grand High Priest while each Committeeman can concentrate on the particular program that he represents. The program has had very good results, and I thank each of my District Deputies and their respective Committeemen, for their effort and support. In conjunction with my counterparts, I instituted a Communications Committee with the objective to revive a quarterly Grand York Rite Newsletter. This

newsletter would be our medium to communicate, within our jurisdiction, our events, articles of interest, education and messages from the Grand York Rite leadership. I am proud to announce that we have published our first issue in March 2007 and a second issue is in the works for June 2007. I am sure that you have received your copies and will agree with me that the Committee has done a fabulous job. I want to thank R.E. David Aponte for chairing this Committee and for taking on this task together with Excellent Companion Charles "Chic" Cicero and R.E. Ron Blaisdefl.

• RETENTION: As we all know retention is a major problem. It is hard enough to attract good Masons into our membership, but to keep them interested and involved seems to be more difficult. I appointed R.E. James P. Rudman, Grand Captain of the Host, as Chairman of a Mentors Committee, and charged him to develop a program that would guide a new initiate from his admission into the Chapter throughout all of his travels within our various committees and offices. As an example, when a Grand High Priest appoints a Past High Priest into the line of the Grand Chapter Officers it should become his duty to guide this companion through the various Offices he may assume, always making himself available for counseling and mentoring. More importantly, in the case of a new initiate, his top – line signer should assume the same role. R.E. Companion Jim has developed a program which I am very proud of and I ask you today for your support to adopt this program. Thank you Jim for a job well done.

I am pleased and very proud that all of my subordinate Officers have supported these programs and plan to incorporate them into their agendas when they are elevated to the Office of Grand High Priest. I have no doubt that these programs will impact our Fraternity in a positive manner and I am looking forward to much success.

I promised you, as one of my goals this year, to make our Grand Secretary's Office accessible to everyone via the internet. I would like to thank M.E. Steven Q. Steete, Grand Secretary and R.E. Wilbur R. Allen for all of their work and dedication to see that this was accomplished. We now have a web site, dedicated to the Grand Chapter of Florida, which is maintained and updated regularly by R.E. Companion Wilbur. Chapter Secretaries can now download all of their forms, file reports and receive announcements from the Grand Secretaries Office instantaneously.

Another promise I made was to see published the proceedings of the 2006 Convocation prior to our 2007 Convention. I am happy to say that the 2006 Proceedings are published and distributed. Our Grand Secretary, M.E. Steve Steele, not only relocated our Grand York Rite Office, with all of the packing, moving and unpacking required, but managed to assist me, by publishing the 2006 proceedings, while keeping up with the current business of our very busy Grand York Rite Office. My understanding is that the two previous years of proceedings, which had not yet been published, will soon be ready to go to the printers and be distributed also. Thank you M.E. Steve, for all of your support to me and your dedication and devotion to our Fraternity. I applaud you and your staff for a job well done.

An area I am always toiling with is Protocol. I know that several Past Grand High Priests have done a fine job in assembling a study of our Protocol and Customs, but no one has ever consolidated all of this information into one book. I therefore asked M.E. Harvey L. Ward, Past Grand High Priest to chair a committee of Past Grand Officers of Grand Lodge, Grand Chapter, Grand Council, Grand Commandery and other distinguished members of our Masonic Family, to research and assemble suitable material that could be published in one book, concerning Masonic Protocol, Etiquette and Customs. M.E. Companion Ward diligently worked with the other members of the Committee and has presented a fine and, think, very valuable tool for us to use in our various travels. I ask you to adopt this work so that it may be distributed for our usage. M.E. Harvey, thank you for all of your support and dedication to the Craft.

Another area of my concern was the method in which we handled our finances. For several years now, due to decreasing membership and increasing costs we have been spending more money than we were taking in. Each year this deficit was passed on to the incoming Grand High Priest. In my case, the funds available for the budget of my year had already been spent by an amount of seven thousand dollars in the previous year. This is neither sound financial nor fiscal procedure.

To address this problem I issued three Edicts:

EDICT I: Establishes a Grand Chapter Administrative Endowment Fund. All monies not committed to the Life Membership Fund, Perpetual Membership Fund, committed to a specified charity or the current budget shall be consolidated and deposited into this existing. Sacred Trust Fund. Furthermore, a Five Year Moratorium shall be imposed on any expenditures of this Fund allowing all monies in the Fund to be invested and reinvested for growth. The said Five Years to commence upon the acceptance and adoption of a corresponding resolution by you, during this Annual Convocation and continuing for the next successive five years, specifically the Grand Convocation of 2012. And I ask you for your support in this endeavor.

EDICT II: This edict creates the "Administrative Current Revenue Account" and identifies which receipts, funds, proceeds and moneys shall be allocated to this Fund, THIS IS NOT THE ADMINISTRATIVE ENDOWMENT FUND. (This is a fund set aside to handle the ongoing current budget and to administer it.) and upon receipt thereof shall be credited to and deposited in a bank, in an income producing account designated "Administrative Current Revenue Account". The funds thus designated are as follows:

- Current Assessments / Per-Capita Tax (money received in Jan.-Feb 2007 will fund 2008/09 budget.)
- 2.) Fees
- 3.) Sales of Merchandise and Publications
- 4.) Miscellaneous which shall include receipts related to Administrative Fund purposes and not otherwise designated herein.
- Seventy-Five Per-Cent (75%) of all interest, dividends or capital gains earned from the previous year investments of the Administrative Fund, if so allocated by the Annual Budget.
- Other Funds allocated to the Administrative Fund by Grand Chapter Regulation or action.
- 7.) The first year, this year (2007), will require the funding of this Administrative Current Revenue Account with an amount equal to the anticipated income, estimated at this time to be Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00), (this has already been done), and this fund amount has been used by the Grand King in the preparation of his 2007 2008 Administrative Budget.

This edict enables the Grand King to know twelve months in advance the amount of money available to him to fund his budget for his term as Grand High Priest. This will allow him the time to prepare his budget early in his term as Grand King, enabling him the opportunity to plan for fund raisers if required by his budgeted expenses. This resolution will bring fiscal responsibility to our fraternity and stem the practice of over spending due to funds not becoming available as anticipated.

A resolution creating the proper changes will be presented during this Grand Convocation for your decision and I ask for your support.

EDICT III: The Grand Chapter of Florida, following the example of other Social and Fraternal Organizations, including the Grand Lodge of Florida incorporated under and by virtue of Chapter 28326, Laws of Florida, Acts of 1953, and it and all particular Chapters Masonically chartered by it, are corporate bodies, subject to laws governing corporations so created and existing in Florida. The reason the Grand Chapter of Florida and other entities incorporate, under the Laws of Florida, is to protect the assets of their Organizations.

My concern is that we did not follow through with the incorporation of our Officers, separating their corporate responsibilities from their fraternal ones. This exposes our Grand High Priest and our assets to overzealous and aggressive attorneys. Following the example of the Grand Lodge of Florida and other Fraternal Organizations within our Jurisdiction I proposed the following for use during my term and have presented legislation at this Convocation for it's adoption and I sincerely request your support.

The Grand High Priest, Grand King, and Grand Scribe are hereby designated as corporate officers and together with the Grand Treasurer, the Grand Secretary and two appointees, as hereinafter set forth, are hereby designated as the Board of Directors of the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida in its corporate character, which Board of Directors may be referred to as the Executive Board.

The Grand High Priest is Supreme in all Fraternal Matter - In all purely fraternal matters, as hereafter designated, the Grand High Priest is the supreme authority and in corporate matters, as hereafter designated, the Executive Board is the supreme authority. In the recess of the Grand Chapter all executive powers of the Grand Chapter of fraternal character vest in the Grand High Priest and all powers of the Grand Chapter of corporate character vest in the Executive Board.

All financial affairs of the Grand Chapter are hereby declared to be corporate in character and the Executive Board is hereby declared to be and constituted as the Budget Commission of the Grand Chapter and is hereby vested with all the powers and duties of such Budget Commission.

My Companions what this does is establish another layer of protection for your assets. Under our current Constitution, which was created and brought forward from a time before we were incorporated, one man alone, the Grand High Priest, makes all of the decisions in regards to your assets. Under the Corporate system a Committee makes such decisions. This Committee consists of all of the elected Officers of the Grand Chapter. The Grand High Priest will retain veto rights. This means that no decision can be made without the consent of the Grand High Priest. It has worked well for us this year and was the reason implemented the same by edit. I believe that this is a housekeeping measure which will complete our incorporation under the Laws of the State of Florida. I am sure it will prove its value in the future, as it has for the Grand Lodge of Florida.

It has been my high honor and privilege to represent the Office of Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter of Florida. I am humbled by the thought of those Great Men. York Rile Past Grand High Priests for all of their septont, counsel and vote of confidence, when I needed it. I particularly would like to thank M.E. David Wilkinson who appointed me to the bottom of this line and has always been there for me. M.E. Companion David has Thank Thank

you M.E. I would also like to thank M.E. Harvey L. Ward for his support and dedication to our Fraternity. M.E. Companion Harvey and I shared the Grand East together in 1996, he as Grand High Priest and I as Grand Master. M.E. Harvey has always been an inspiration to me and has always been there for me when I have needed help. Thank you M.E.

As many of you are aware R.E. Wilbur resigned as Grand King this year due to health conditions and doctors orders. I know that this was a soul searching decision for R.E. Companion Wilbur and my heart goes out to him and his family. In spite of all this R.E. Wilbur completed the web site and continues to maintain the same and has promised to do so for as long as he is physically able. R.E. Wilbur you are a true Companion, a Brother and a Friend. I would ask everyone to stand and give him a well-deserved round of applause. R.E. we love you and we will miss your leadership.

I want to thank R.E. Anthony Marotta, Jr. for his assistance, counsel and guidance in the financial matters of our Grand Chapter. R.E. Companion Tony accepted the Chairmanship of the Investment Committee and has worked tirelessly in providing us with sound financial recommendations. I am proud of our accomplishments and I sincerely thank you R.E. for your service and support.

I think what makes me feel the proudest is the support that I have received from all of my Officers, both the elected as well as the appointed. It was not unusual for there to be a contingency of ten to twelve Grand Chapter Officers at all of our Official Visits as well as at most of our special events. They stood out in their Red Coats or in their White Tux jackets at the more formal events, as they are here today. I want you to know how proud I am of each of you and I want to thank you for your support, your enthusiasm and your love for our Fraternity. There was never an occasion that I asked for help that you did not step up to the line and deliver. I love each one of you and if there is any way that I can ever help you in the future, you need only to ask.

R.E. David Aponte is my personal secretary. He accepted my request while I was Grand King and, for those of you who can recall, this was at the time that my home in Key West was flooded by Hurricane Wilma. I could have never made it without his dedicated assistance. R.E. Companion David was there to assist me in the selection of my appointments, to prepare sort and mail my correspondence, accompanied me on most of my road trips, handling all of the related correspondence. R.E. David has always been there for whatever and whenever I have needed. R.E. you have served me well and I applaud you for your service to me and for your love of our Fratemity.

In closing, I would like to recognize my wife Sally and all of our children, for all of their support, help and love during these many years that I have pursued my Masonic endeavors. I have received many honors and made many, many friends over the years and for that I am deeply humbled, but I recognize that none of this would have been possible except for the love and support of my wife, my best friend Sally. I love you darling.

THE GRAND HISTORIAN LECTURE (Continued)

EARLY ROYAL ARCH CHAPTERS AND GRAND CHAPTERS IN AMERICA

The organization of separate Chapters, independent from Lodges, began in the 1780's after the American Revolution. Several of these Chapters titled themselves Grand Chapters with the probable togic that as no Grand Chapters existed in the United States, there might as well be one, and charter additional Chapters as the need arose. Also, the English Provincial Grand Lodges were no longer considered sovereign on this side of the ocean.

Historically, the first three Chapters to assume the title or prerogatives of a Grand Chapter upon, more or less, separating from Lodge control were first New York City, then Middletown, Connecticut and the third also in New York City.

The first historical record is that of "Old Royal Arch Chapter" in New York City, where on July 26, 1783, a letter was written to the Grand Master of Masons of New York, styling themselves as "the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of this city", requesting him and other Grand Lodge Officers who were Royal Arch Masons to preside over their affairs. Evidence indicates that this "Grand Chapter" warranted five or six Chapters in New York and Connecticut.

On September 5, 1783, a number of Royal Arch Masons, who were members of Saint Johns Lodge No. 2 in Middletown, Connecticut, assembled and formed themselves into a Grand Royal Arch Chapter. They operated for thirteen years under that name; however, there is no record that they chartered additional Chapters, This "Grand Chapter" accepted the designation of Washington Chapter No. 3 in 1796 which was later assigned No. 6 upon organization of the Grand Chapter of Connecticut in 1798.

The third "Grand Chapter" to form in the United States was Washington Chapter of New York City. The events leading to their constitution are unknown today; however, they were in existence in 1789. While not calling themselves a Grand Chapter, they proceeded to issue warrants and chartered six Chapters in Connecticut and Rhode Island between 1791 and 1796. All of those Chapters are still in existence at this time.

THE SYMBOLISM OF COLORS IN MASONRY

Masonic colors are made up of mainly seven colors: blue, purple, red, white, black, greefing and yellow. The first three; blue, purple and red were called in the former English lectures "the Old Colors of Masonry". They were said to have been selected because "they were royal and such as the ancient Kings and Princes used to wear". Sacred history also informs us that the Veil of the Temple was composed of these colors.

Blue is emphatically the color of Freemasonry. It is the appropriate color of the Ancient Craft Degrees. It is to the Mason a symbol of universal friendship and, benevolence, because, as it is the color of the vault of Heaven, which embraces and covers the entire globe, we are admonished in the breast of every Brother, that these virtues should be equally extensive. It is, therefore, the primary color. Together with white and a brief introduction of green, these colors should be used in a Lodge of Master Masons.

Among the religious institutions of the Jewish people, the colors of blue, purple, red white were of great significance. All of these colors were used in the vestments of the High Priest and as coverings for the veils in the Tabernacle. Josephus informs us that: blue was symbolic of air, purple of water, red of fire and white of earth. They were the colors of the Reuben-purple and Dan-blue.

Blue held a prominent position among all the Nations of Antiquity. Among the Medieval Christians blue was considered an emblem of immortality and red of divine love. Purple is the appropriate color of the degrees, which in York Rite, have been interpolated between the degrees of Ancient Craft Masonry and the Royal Arch. Its' mixture symbolizes a fraternal union of the Ancient Craft (blue) and the Royal Arch (red) and is intended to signify the close connection and harmony which should ever exist between these two bodies of the Masonic system. It is significant that the Hebrew word for purple, "argaman" is derived from "ragam" or "regen", of which one definition is "friend".

Frederick Portal says "that purple is the profane language of colors, signifying constancy in spiritual combat, that blue denotes fidelity, that red denotes war and comparing it to fire, is the symbol of regeneration and purification of souts".

Red, scarlet or crimson, the color indifferently called by all these names, is the appropriate color of the Royal Arch Degree. It symbolically represents the ardor and zeal which should activate all who are in possession of that sublime portion of Masonry. Hence, there seems to be congruity in adapting red as the color of the Royal Arch, which historically refers to the rebuilding of the Temple and symbolically to the regeneration of life. Red among the Jewish people was a color of dignity. It was appropriated as affluent or honorable and caused the Prophet Jeremiah to describe the rich men of his country as "those who are brought up in scarlet".

White is one of the most ancient and extensively diffused colors of the symbolic colors. It is found in all the Ancient Mysteries, just as in Masonry, where it constitutes the investiture of the candidate. It has always borne the significance of symbolizing purity and innocence.

INVESTMENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE REPORT

Most Excellent Grand High Priest and Companions,

To begin the Investment Committee report for the Grand Chapter of RAM's, I would like to provide some investment statistics and some history on our accounts. It is hoped that this will help you understand some of the recommendations that we have made during the course of this year.

In 1990, Dr. Harry M. Markowitz won the Nobel Prize in Economics for his groundbreaking work measuring the effectiveness of asset allocation. Although many of the concepts used by Dr. Markowitz are hard to understand, he won the award because he was the person who first quantified risk, and demonstrated how asset allocation works to reduce risk and enhance portfolio returns. Through his work, Dr. Markowitz introduced the concept of the "efficient portfolio".

Asset Allocation is the process of developing the most efficient - optimal - mix of investments. In this case, optimal means that there is not another combination of asset classes that is expected to generate a higher ratio of return to risk.

Simply put, it is dividing your portfolio into different types, or classes of investments, to maximize returns and minimize risk. As they say, "Don't put all your eggs into one basket." Countless investment magazines, newspapers, television shows and websites provide investment advice, yet investors continue to be disappointed by their investment returns. That's not surprising when we consider a 2003 study by consulting firm Dalbar Financial Services that looked at activities of no-load, stock-only mutual fund investors between January 1984 and December 2002. The average stock fund investor in the study earned an unimpressive average annual total return of 2.57% — roughly half a percent less than the rate of inflation. While inflation averaged 3.1% and Institutional accounts (such as major University endowment accounts) earned between 10% and 12% during this same time period, one would ask why did the average individual earn only 2.57%? The answer is that the average Investor made poor decisions on market timing and choosing investments allowing fear and greed to control their actions, while the Institutional accounts based their investment decisions on a disciplined approach rating asset allocation as a high priority.

The allocation of our general account at the beginning of this Grand Chapter Year was 70% Equity and 30% Fixed Income (all Corporate Bonds). This was in non-compliance with our Investment Policy Statement set forth in our Constitution, which calls for a 60% Equity 61% 40% Fixed Income. So some moves were inevitable. The Equity portion of our port and consisted of Asset Classes of 1% Small Company Stock, 8% Mid-size Company Stock in 61% Large Company Stock and from information derived from the above studies, would suggest that during a period of time when either Mid-size or Small Companies are performing well, that our portfolio would tend to lag in performance. In addition, of that 70% Equity exposure 30% of that was in International Stock, which seemed a little on the high side knowing that international investing inherently involves more volatility.

So, armed with this information the process was started to look for an appropriate allocation that would give us a more disciplined institutionalized style of investing, attempting to achieve a reasonable amount of return for a reasonable amount of risk. This process would inevitably take six months of discussion, research and investigation. We looked at loaded funds, no-load funds, ETF's, managed accounts, cost, availability (many managers will not handle accounts less than 1 million dollars in value including Edward Jones which was our current advising firm) and performance.

However, before we came to a decision on the best avenue to take with our general account it came to our attention that all the interest and dividends from our investments were being reinvested. This in itself was not incorrect; however the General Account at the time was a working account and could be called upon at anytime to furnish cash to be used on behalf of the Grand Chapter. The result could mean the sale of an investment at an inopportune time. This also contributed to the over exposure to the equity allocation. So the first recommendation was to stop the reinvestment process allowing the cash to build up in a Money Market within the account, thus providing liquidity should the occasion require it.

At this point several Edicts were introduced by the Grand High Priest. Two of these edicts would have major influence on the General Investment account and caused a series of recommendations for logistical reasons.

First \$48000 of the account would have to be separated for the Administrative account. \$40,000 for the incoming Grand High Priest's Budget and \$8,000 to cover previous years deficits. Since this money was to be used for the functioning of the Grand Chapter it was deemed necessary to remove it from the volatility of the Market. Therefore our next recommendation was to sell some of our funds (which where up in value) and reinvest the \$40,000 in a CD within a separate account and the \$8,000 in a Money Market. The CD to come due in time for this years' budget and the Money Market for liquidity to meet expenses during this past year.

Now, with the 2nd Edict moving the investments that were not ear marked for anything else into the Administrative Endowment Account and already liquidating some of our funds to accomplish the 1st Edict, the account having a positive return and six months of investigation the committee recommended that the general account be moved to Raymond James and placed in the Freedom Account, a managed fund account with rebalancing measures. The recommendation was made believing that this is as close to an institutionalized account as we could get, that would also give us a reasonable return with a reduced risk for a fair cost. Our current allocation is broken down as follows:

2% Cash, 18% Domestic Fixed Income, 5% High Yield Fixed Income, 5% International Fixed Income, 5% USTIP, 7% Real Estate, 18% Large Company Stock Blend, 7% Large Company Stock Growth, 7% Large Company Stock Value, 5% Small to Mid Size Company Value, 5% Small to Mid Size Company Blend, 4% International Stock Growth, 4% International Stock Value, 3% International Stock Blend and 5% Commodities.

For the year now ended our account has earned approximately 17%, but since the move we have earned a total of 5.8% return opposed to a return on our old investments of 5.4% during the same time period.

Our final recommendations were brought about by a Bond that was repurchased in the perpetual account. First, since their was cash available the committee recommended that the triennial money and the charity money be removed and kept liquid in the Money Market, as the Grand Treasurer had informed us that once again this money may be used in the near future. Secondly, that the remainder be used to purchase a Bond using these qualifications:

- That it be "A" rated or better.
- Purchased at Par Value
- Have an Interest Rate of 5% or more

All of which fall within the Investment Policy statement within our Constitution.

GRAND TREASURER'S INTERIM REPORT

To the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida:

Subject: Treasurers Preliminary Report

Since it is general knowledge that I will not plan to continue as your Grand Treasurer, I go pleased to be able to provide you with one of the best financial situations of recent time.

For several years, the income from the Per Capita would not fully support the budget, and as a result it was necessary to borrow from next year's Per Capita in order to continue

With the increase in Per Capita over the past two years, and with a much more efficiently Grand Secretary/Recorders Office, plus frugal spending across the board, the income had finally caught up with the expenditures, and there will be surplus moneys to add to the investments. Major costs, such as Rent and Proceedings have been reduced significantly and others closely regulated. This certainly is a welcome change, since for the last several years it has been necessary on occasion to use some of the Principal of your investments when even temporary borrowing would not suffice.

The forward budget is currently defined to be within the proceeds of the \$40,000 co start aside by edict earlier in the year. The budget as planned will yield a surplus and will careful management, this trend should continue for a few years until inflation (of one sold another) catches us again.

As most are aware, the major portion of the General Fund was directed to be reinvested in what is implied to be a more stable and broader based "Institutional" investment package through Raymond James. The net effect to date has been one of almost performance. As to the Chapters Sacred Funds they are still invested with Edward John where the market value of the Bonds has remained relatively stable, with no great risk than of early calls. The one call of a bond to date has resulted in an increase in the overall value rather than a loss. The Chapter Sacred Funds continue to be invested through

GRAND TREASURER'S FINAL REPORT 2006-2007 JULY 6, 2007

To the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida, and To the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Florida, and To the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Florida

Subject: Grand Treasurers Final Report for 2006-2007

Individual Treasurers Preliminary Reports were presented at the Grand Convention which provided generalized discussion as to the state of the finances of each of the bodies. Accordingly, accompanying final budget reports were sent out to those primarily involved with the finances of the Grand Bodies. Accompanying this report will be the detail as to the distribution of the Life and Perpetual interest payments to the various bodies, and individual Grand Treasurer's Consolidated Reports similar to past years. The Consolidated reports need be taken in the context of what was happening and not as a precise report from an ongoing Treasurer. At the time they were written, the transition to the new Grand Treasurer was in process.

The transition process of finalizing the many accounts and turning them over to the new Grand Treasurer has been an arduous process. While the undersigned has made it a practice to respond to the appropriate handling of moneys within forty eight hours (and usually within less than 24 hours) I find that is not the case in many parts of our fratemity. It may be the influence of our affluent society, or it may be careless management of funds, but the apparent disdain for prompt handling of finances seems to be rampant from the lowest to the highest levels of our Fratemity. I offer the following examples that came about in the process of attempting to close each of the many accounts held by these Grand Bodies.

 I had to call twice to get an individual to cash a \$50 reimbursement check for a District Meeting expense that was over 6 months old.

Some three months after issue, I was informed that one organization could not cash individual body Life and Perpetual payment checks, because their account was in the name of the York Rite Bodies and the bank would not accept the individual checks. Approximately two months later the local body returned the checks so that I could issue one in the name of the York Rite body so that they could cash it. Upon doing so, it took two phone calls and two weeks more to get the check cashed.

After three of more phone calls, one local body admitted that they could not find the checks for Life and Perpetual payment, and requested a reissue, which was accomplished. There was a similar check from the year before that was still missing and I suspect for the same reason, but it was finally written-off.

4) We apparently had a "leak" in our system regarding the conveying of our meager donation to the Order of Rainbow. One of those checks had been outstanding for hearly a year, and after several phone calls I was informed that they definitely had not received one of the checks. In fairness, the check was re-issued directly to the Order of Rainbow, and promptly cashed.

5) One of the checks that had been outstanding for several weeks was sent to the

General Grand Chapter for purchase of rituals at some point in time. I called the General Grand Chapter offices and advised them of the situation that I was attempting to gather all outstanding checks and close the account. The response was that it would be cashed immediately. Ten days or so later I recalled the General Grand Office and was advised that as soon as I hung up the first time they forgot about cashing the check. The second time it took only a few days for the check to clear.

6) I have had to replace several reimbursement checks for Officers at the Grand Level who have apparently lost them. Others have been found through prodding.

7) Although the Grand Convention has been over for more that six weeks, the account cannot at this time be closed because the check to the hotel for in excess of \$25,000.00 has not cleared. Neither have the checks for payment of the printing cost of the Convention Program or another small check for reimbursement of a payment by the Grand Secretary/Recorder. Warrants for those checks were received on June 27, and the checks were sent out the same day, but none have cleared as of July 6. I have a difficult time understanding why a Hotel like the Marriott would not quickly cash such a check — presuming that they got it promptly.

Finally, as of this date (July 6, 2007) all accounts have been closed with the exception of the Grand Convention Account mentioned in item 7) above. All of the funds are now in the hands of the new Grand Treasurer, PMIGM Richard Foreman, however, at last report, transition of the control of the investments was not yet complete. The surpluses from the Office account and from the individual budgets along with the Per Capita income were placed back in the Council and Commandery General Funds. The Chapter surpluses were placed in the Administrative Endowment investment fund, and the Chapter Per Capita was placed in the separate Revenue fund.

Because of frugal control of budgeted funds, and the fact that in recent years the Per Capita was increased to support the expenditures, the financial situation of each of the York Rite Bodies is in better shape than it has been for any time during my stint of 16 years as your Grand Treasurer (now Emeritus)

RESOLUTION #2 (FAILED)

RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE CONSTITUTION OF THE MOST EXCELLENT GRAND CHAPTER OF RAM OF FLORIDA

Whereas, The Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida is both a corporate and fraterial organization; and

Whereas, corporate decisions can and do create civil liability if not properly conducted; and

Whereas, it is deemed prudent to provide for the administration of the corporate affairs of the Grand Chapter, and

Whereas, the formation of an Executive Board would seem the most advantageous method to accomplish these ends.

Now therefore, be it resolved that Article II Jurisdiction and Power of Constitution of the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida be amended to add the following Sections 4 through 8.

ARTICLE II Jurisdiction and Powers

Section 4. Executive Board

- (1) It is recognized that the M.E. Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida is a body politic and corporate created and existing under and by virtue of Chapter 28326, Laws of Florida, Acts of 1953, and it and all particular Chapters Masonically chartered by it, are corporate bodies subject to laws governing corporations so created and existing in Florida.
- (2) The Grand High Priest, Grand King, Grand Scribe are hereby designated as corporate officers and together with the Grand Treusurer, the Grand Secretary and two appointees as hereinafter set forth are hereby designated as the Board of Directors of the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida in its corporate character, which Board of Directors may be referred to as the Executive Board.
- (3) The Grand High Priest shall be Chairman of the Executive Board and the Grand King shall be Vice-Chairman of said Board.
- (4) The Grand Treasurer shall be the Treasurer of the Corporation and the internal auditor of all claims and orders for the disbursement of corporate funds and shall be responsible for pre-audit of all such claims and orders. When in doubt as to the legality of validity of any such claim or order the Grand Treasurer shall not make payment thereof pending appeal to and decision by majority vote of membership of the Executive Board. The Executive Board shall prescribe the procedure for such appeals and the disposition litereof.

- (5) The Grand Secretary shall, ex-officio, be Secretary to, the Board and shall be the keeper of the Seal of the Grand Chapter, which Seal shall be the Corporate Seal. In the event the Grand Secretary shall be, for any reason, unable to attend his duties as Secretary to the Executive Board, the Board may designate a member of said Board to act as Secretary. Full and complete minutes of the proceedings and actions of the Executive Board shall be made and signed by the Grand High Priest and by the Secretary or acting Secretary and shall be filed in the office of the Grand Secretary.
- (6) The two appointive members of the Executive Board, one of which shall be a Past Grand High Priest, shall be appointed by the Crand High Priest for a term of one year. No appointive member of said Board shall serve for more than three consecutive years.
- (7) The Grand High Priest and any three other members of the Executive Board shall constitute a quorum. All decisions and actions by said Board shall be by majority vote, which majority shall and must include the Grand High Priest. There shall be no proxy voting.
- (8) In the event of a vacancy arising by death, resignation, removal or any other cause of an appointive member of the Executive Board the Grand High Priest, then in office, shall appoint a successor to serve the remainder of the term of such appointive member.

Section 5 Grand High Priest Supreme in Fraternal Matter - In all purely fraternal matters, as hereafter designated, the Grand High Priest is the supreme authority and in corporate matters, as hereafter designated, the Executive Board is the supreme authority. In the recess of the Grand Chapter all executive powers of the Grand Chapter of fraternal character vest in the Grand High Priest and all powers of the Grand Chapter of corporate character vest in the Executive Board.

Section 6 Executive Board Powers — (1) All financial affairs of the Grand Chapter are hereby declared to be corporate in character and the Executive Board is hereby declared to be and constituted as the Budget Commission of the Grand Chapter and is hereby vested with all the powers and duties of such Budget Commission as now or hereafter prescribed by this Constitution and the Regulations of the Grand Chapter and all programs, projects, activities, functions and operations of the Grand Chapter and to be administered by such Board in accordance with this Constitution and the Regulations of the Grand Chapter.

- (2) All programs, projects, activities, functions and operations carried on or directed by and under the jurisdiction of the Executive Committees as set forth, defined and prescribed in and by the terms and provisions of Article XII of this Constitution are hereby declared to be corporate in nature and character to wit: Per Diem, Finance & Budget, Auditing, Finance
- (3) Except as provided for elsewhere in this Constitution the Grand High Priest shall appoint all






