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

In my travels I have had the opportunity to visit with many of you at your home Convocations and was received with a warm welcome and many courtesies. It is now my honor for and on behalf of the Honorable Companions of Florida to welcome you to our Grand Convocation. If there is anything I personally can do to make your stay here in the Sunshine State more enjoyable all you need do is ask.

First and foremost, I wish to thank you, my fellow Companions, for the wonderful opportunity to serve you and the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida for the past two years, Together, we have accomplished much. However, we cannot sit back and rest as there is much to be done.

### STATE OF OUR BELOVED GRAND CHAPTER

The overall state of our Grand Chapter is good to excellent. Once again the Grand Chapter of Florida was in a positive gain of total Membership. We have lost 77 (\*) beloved Companions while conferring the Royal Arch Degree and Exalting many new Companions. This number includes 139 (\*) reported Knightings through December 31st, 2013 by our Right Eminent Grand Commander and to be added to that number are the exaltations conferred at the most successful Festivals held in Orlando (8), Ft Myers (12), Jacksonville (12), Lakeland (4), Tampa (12), Pensacola (7), Fort Pierce (10) and Miami (6). This may not be a record year for exaltations but it has been a very productive one (\*as of this writing awaiting actual numbers from Grand Secretary).

Congratulations and welcome to all our new Companions.

I thank and congratulate all of you throughout the State of Florida for all of your efforts in promoting and petitioning of so many well qualified Brothers to be Exalted Royal Arch Masons this year. As we are doing an excellent job of attracting new members, I am confident we will do even better in the future. We cannot lose sight of the ever growing challenge of keeping our Companions active and attending meetings. Many of our Chapters are concentrating on making their Convocations more interesting thus increasing attendance.

Sending electronically, the minutes, correspondence and other mundane items of Business on the Convocation Agenda will help progress the meeting and allow time for other programs such as Appendant bodies, outside speakers, etc. to be provided. Of course, all important matters to the Chapter must be discussed at meetings. As example, By-Law changes, communications from the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Legislation, the reading of petitions, etc. Once distributed electronically, the High Priest can proclaim these items on the distributed agenda approved as distributed. One caution, be sure all members are receiving the information and more importantly, be sure all questions are answered and objections dealt with courteously and thoroughly.

One of the reasons of our growing success is our Blue Lodge Representative Program. This, all important program is starting to pay dividends. Almost always these presentations result in requests for petitions.

Along the lines of increasing our membership, the Grand Chapter has recently launched a new membership program and it is just starting to gain some momentum. Hopefully, it will continue to be funded over the next several years to improve membership. If you have any questions please see the author of this program, Right Excellent Companion Richard A. Wolfe, who is currently serving as our Right Excellent Grand Scribe.

As I travel throughout Florida, I see a marked improvement in our ritual, not only in the opening and closing of our Chapters, but also in the conferring of our beautiful Degrees. Danny Griffith, Right Eminent Grand Commander Henry Adams and Most Illustrious Grand Master Dayle Schrock who worked so tirclessly to bring the Four York Rite Bodies closer together than in any recent history. I would also be remiss, if I did not mention Companion Rusty Glendinning, Personal Representative to the Sovereign Grand Inspector General and Excellent Companion John Drewett, the current High Priest of Clearwater Chapter No. 45 and also the General Secretary of the Valley of Tampa Scottish Rite. Throughout the entire year they have displayed their steadfast support of not only myself but all of York Rite Masonry. Through their efforts, York Rite and Scottish Rite has never been closer. That was some accomplishment! We owe all of these Companions # vote of thanks.

### The Pursuit of our Grand Chapter History

The Grand Chapter Proceedings that were past due and not processed as per the Constitution were activity pursued. This project formally began on September 30th, 2012 although earlier attempts were made prior to that date. As your Most Excellent Grand High Priest I took on this task as a personal challenge. I was determined not to allow our beautiful history to just disappear. Many Companions we enlisted to see that this most important project was a success. I am very pleased to announce that the historic proceedings from previous years have now all been accounted for and through the efforts of our Grand Secretary, Right Excellent Howard Gardner, will all be printed and distributed prior to our next Grand Convocation. I congratulate and sincerely thank all that took part in the preserving of our History.

### OTHER ACTIVITIES OF YOUR GRAND CHAPTER

In a continuing effort to bring our Grand Chapter of Fiorida's Constitution up to date, as was done last year, all proceedings and all changes to our Constitution from the certified copy of 1997 with revisions through 2002 were completed last year. Special attention was given to several years prior to 1997 through April 29, 2014. This reinvestigation was conducted to be sure all updates were included. These documents including Constitution. Appendix A "Uniform Code of Bylaws for subordinate Chapters", Appendix B "28326 Laws of Florida, Acts of 1953", Appendix C "Adopted Grand Royal Arch Symbol for Memorial Markers", Appendix D "Instruction and Guide lines for Conferral of Royal Arch Degrees and Ceremonies". Appendix E "Masonic Capitular Protocol\*, Appendix F "Ritualistic Ceremony of an Ancient Craft Table Chapter" Appendix G. Florida Chapter of Research which was approved by the Companions at Grand Convocation held May 20, 2013. As our Constitution is a living document, it will be updated, as additions and alterations are approved by the Companions and a certified copy filed with the Grand Secretary's Office. A special thanks go to Harry Eisenberg for his many hours of due diligence on this difficult project.

### GRAND CHAPTER WEBSITE

Let's briefly touch on the Grand Chapter Website. What a nightmare! I have found it is easier to nail Jell-O to the wall than to get a handful of computer experts to agree and follow through on our lagging website improvements. I thought this would be completed last year, now I will be happy if there are some marginal changes by the end of this Most Excellent Grand High Priests term of office. The website has changed some but not enough to be a proud showcase of your Florida York Rite Bodies. My fingers are crossed that this will be completed by September 2014.

### **OUR FLORIDA YOUTH PROJECT**

As Excellent Grand High Priest of Royal Arch Masons of Florida, I have had the opportunity to be involved in many pleasant experiences: Table Chapters. Degree Work, Widows recognition, representing the State of Florida around the Country, etc. There has been one experience 1 truly treasure, that is working with our Masonic Associated Youth Groups. It so inspired me that I have made these groups my "Special Charity".

From the very beginning after appointing a "Special Advisory Board to the Grand Chapter for Florida Youth Activities", I was hooked. So much so I designed and commissioned a special commemorative coin to be minted. Right Eminent Grand Commander of Knights Templar of Florida Henry Adams and Most Illustrious Grand Master of Royal & Select Masters of Florida. Dayle Schrock both were instrumental in the success of this fundraiser. This gold like coin has representations of the Chapter, Council and Commandery on one side and a representation for the Jobs Daughters International, Rainbow for Girls and the DeMolay for boys on the other side. These coins were in high demand, resulting in sales and donations in excess of \$12,000,00. I thank everyone who assisted in the sales of these coins. I have to single out several who went over and above to assist with sales: Jack Maulden, AJ Ahrens, Henry Adams and especially Kate Adams.... thank you to all that helped in this worthwhile project.

All profits from this fundraiser will be donated to the Masonic Affiliated Youth Groups at a local level. For example there are three DeMotay Chapters that need banners at a cost of approximately \$500.00 each, several Jobs Daughters need new and/or replacement Jewels for some of their Officers and so on. These groups need only to submit a request to the Charity Board consisting of Henry Adams, Dayle Schrock and myself, who will evaluate and decide on the individual requests. Pass the word on, Our next administration has assured me, that this will be followed up on and the same Board for this Charity will remain.

### PER DIEM

As it has been many years since any Per Diem has been paid to any attendees of our Grand Convocation, it was decided that a small Per Diem be paid to all District Deputy Grand High Priests who attend the one hundred and sixty-eighth Grand Convocation of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida.

There was much resistance to include this expenditure in this year's budget. We are hopeful that this practice will not only continue, but be expanded to

include: Bronze Award Winners, possibly District Instructors and others as the funds may become available.

We send our sincere thanks to all of those who attend our Grand Communication without the hope of fee or reward.

Last, but not at all least, according to our Constitution there is to be <u>no work</u> on <u>Sunday except for funeral services and/or religious purposes.</u> There is no work allowed on Sunday's <u>even if the Bible</u> is closed! Please adhere to this.

An additional note of praise for our Grand Secretary. This past year's proceedings were printed and distributed in accordance with our Constitution. This is the first time since I have been a York Rite Mason that the proceedings have been printed and distributed as per the Constitution. Thank you, Most Illustrious Howard!

There is so much to be thankful for in these past two years. One outstanding honor extended to me was several Honorary Memberships around the State. Thank you: Manatee River Chapter No 18, Bradenton Council No 9, Tampa-Cushing Chapter No. 3, Tampa Council No. 8, Tampa-Ivanhoe Commandery No. 8, Mt. Horeb No. 6 and Plant City Chapter No. 16.

### PRELIMINARY REPORT OF THE GRAND TREASURER FOR 2013 - 2014

As it so often happens, when one attempts to correct something, there are more problems that tend to appear. This year in conjunction with the Grand Secretary/Record, the reporting form for the per capita tax was revised to reflect the deceased perpetual member information. A major problem was encountered when it was learned that many of the constituent bodies had not maintained accurate records of their perpetual member data. Adding to this is that in the last two years there has been a significant change of Secretary/Recorders. This leads to still another reporting problem in that many of the Secretary/Recorders have not maintained the information regarding the effective per capita tax at the time the perpetual membership was obtained.

Additionally, it has been discovered that when a member demits to another body, the gaining body may not be aware that the new Companion/Sir Knight has a perpetual membership. Also, what if the dues structure is not the same? The regulations do not address this particular situation. What is the obligation of the Companion/Sir Knight to the gaining body if the dues are more than what he had been subject to paying in the losing body? Does the Companion/Sir Knight have to make an additional payment to his individual account to balance out the account with the dues requirement of the gaining body? And, what are the reporting criteria to the Grand York Rite office and Grand Treasurer, who is responsible for making the payouts annually?

What are the reporting criteria for perpetual members being transferred to another body because a charter has been surrendered? Firstly, the gaining body needs to accurately report the gain to the Grand York Rite office (this is not always the case). And, secondly, the Grand Treasurer needs to be notified of the change to update the gaining body's perpetual account records.

As was reported last year, the regulations regarding the old Life membership program needs to be updated. And, with the above problems now being exposed, the perpetual membership program needs to be updated to provide for the accurate reporting of membership data to all that need to be informed. It all starts at the constituent level though. The Grand York Rite membership data files are only as accurate as the local Secretary/Recorders provide the information on a timely basis. And, due follow up procedures, particularly with regard to the

perpetual membership data must be provided to the Grand Treasurer as the administrator of the Life/Perpetual funding files.

It would also appear that the regulations pertaining to the investment accounts need to be examined and some adjustments made. The financial markets have changed since the regulations were initially written and some updating is called for to reflect the changes. I would suggest that the Investment Committees, along with the Grand Treasurer, meet to review the regulations and submit appropriate changes as may be necessary.

I thank the craft for allowing me to serve again as your Grand Treasurer. A copy of the final payouts for the Life/Perpetual accounts has been attached to this preliminary report.

That is totally unacceptable and we must attempt to correct this problem next year. I will be talking more to the Secretary's about this problem and the re solution of it.

In closing, I once again thank you for your support. In most cases, it has been an enjoyable year.

### THE GRAND HISTORIANS LECTURE 2013 - 2014

~ Zerubbabel and the Temples at Jerusalem -Compiled by Glenn E. Chandler, MEPGHP Ex. Grand Historian for Grand Chapter RAM of FLA April 30, 2014 A.D. 2544 A.I.

"As He was going out of the Temple, one of His disciples said to Him, "Teacher, behold what wonderful stones and what wonderful buildings!" And Jesus said to him, "Do you see these great buildings? Not one stone will be left upon another which will not be torn down." (Mark 13:1-2)

This was a very bold and specific prediction. It didn't seem very likely. Even if the Temple was destroyed, who would go to all that effort? Most of the stones weighted many tons. However, it turned out Jesus was exactly right.

Four decades after Jesus's death, Roman soldiers under General Titus laid siege to Jerusalem. Even though the General had given orders to not destroy the Temple, during the battle a lire was started that engulfed the structure. The fire caused the gold and silver that was in the Temple to melt and

flow between the cracks in the stone. When the soldiers captured the Temple area, in their greed to obtain this gold and silver, they took long bars and pried apart the massive stones. Thus, quite literally, not one stone was left standing upon another. This Temple was known as Herod's but actually it was a renovation of Zerubbabel's.

The Most Excellent Master's Degree focuses on the dedication of King Solomon's Temple. It is one of our great duties as a Most Excellent Master to dispense light and truth to the uninformed Mason according to the Charge given at the conclusion of the degree. From its completion to its destruction the Temple of Solomon is said to have stood for 418 years. However, I was recently surprised to learn that the Temple retained its original splendor for only thirty-three years.

The Royal Arch Degree reminds us that "new discoveries inspire further research."

In the year of the world 3033, Shishak, the King of Egypt, having made war upon Rehoboam, King of Judah and the heir of Solomon, took Jerusalem and carried away the choicest treasures. From that time forward to the period of its final destruction its history is a story of alternate pillaging and repairs, of sacrileges to idolatry, and succeeding restoration to the purity of worship. One hundred and thirteen years later Joash, King of Judah, restored it to its former condition. In 3264 Ahaz, King of Judah, robbed it of its riches and gave them to Tiglath Pileser. King of Assyria, who had united with him in a war against the King of Israel and Damascus. In 3276 Hezekiah, the son and successor of Ahaz repaired what his father had destroyed and restored pure worship, but fifteen years later he was compelled to give the treasures of the Temple as a ransom to Sennacharib. King of Assyria, who had invaded the land of Judah. But Hezekiah is supposed to have restored the Temple after his enemy had retired. It was again despoited in 3306 by Manasseh, son of Hezekiah, but in 3380 the good King Josiah again restored the Temple and replaced the Ark of the Covenant within the Sanctuary.

In the eleventh year of the reign of Zedekiah, in the year of the world 3416 (588 B.C.). Ierusalem was besieged by Nebuchadnezzar, King of Babylon. The city and Temple were destroyed and the holy vessels and most of the inhabitants were carried captive to Babylon, where they remained captives for a period of seventy years. Such is the history of the House of the Lord at Jerusalem.

To those Israelites who had been seduced by idolatry it was a terrible punishment, however much deserved. To those who had remained true to the faith it was a heart-rending experience:

the infuriating chains of captivity, their peaceful homes destroyed, the Temple in ruins, the sacred Ark and the holy vessels gone, and worst of all the glorious Shekinah departed from Israel forever.

Today, in our Chapters, we are all familiar with the names of Jeshua, Zerubbubel, and Haggai. The office held by the King of a constituent Chapter symbolically represents Zerubbubel.

Zerubbabel was head of the tribe of Judah at the time of the return from the Babylonian Captivity and was the prime builder of the Second Temple.

He is a shadowy figure that emerges as the political and spiritual head of the tribe of Judah at the time of the Babylonian exile.

As a child of the Captivity, Zerubbabel's name literally means offspring of Babylon. He was the son of Shealtiel or Salathiel (Ezra 3:2, 8; Hag. 1:1; Matt. 1:12) and the grandson of Jehoiachin, the captive king of Judah (1 Chr. 3:17). A descendant of David, Zerubbabel was in the direct line of the ancestry of Jesus, Zerubbabel apparently attained considerable status with his captors while living in Babylon. During the early reign of Darius, he was recognized as a prince of Judah. Zerubbabel was probably in the king's service since the Persians had appointed him as governor of Judah.

With the blessings of Cyrus, Zerubbabel and Jeshua the high priest led the first band of captives back to Jerusalem. From Babylon to Jerusalem, as the crow flies, is approximately 500 miles and the journey took about four months. They also returned the gold and silver vessels that Nebuchadnezzar had removed from the ill-fated Temple. Almost immediately they set up as altar for burnt offerings, kept the Feast of Tabernacles, and took steps to rebuild the Temple.

After rebuilding the Temple foundation the first two years, construction came to a standstill for 17 years. This delay came principally because of opposition from settlers in Samaria who wanted to help with the buildings. When the offer was refused because of the Samaritans association with heathen worship, the Samaritans disrupted the building project. Counselors were hired who misrepresented the captives in court, causing the Persian King to withdraw his support. The delay in building was also due to the fixation of Zerubbabel and other captives with building houses for themselves.

Urged by the prophets Haggai and Zechariah, Zerubbabel diligently resumed work on the Temple in the second year of the reign of King Darius of Persia. This renewed effort to build the Temple was a model of cooperation involving the captives, the prophets, and Persian Kings. Zerubbabel received considerable grants of money and materials from Persia and continuing encouragement from the prophets Haggai and Zechariah.

The Temple was finished in four years (516/515 B.C.) and dedicated with great pomp and rejoicing. The celebration was climaxed with the observance of the Passover. If there was a discordant note, it likely came from older Jews who had earlier wept because the new Temple lacked the magnificence of Solomon's Temple.

For some mysterious reason, Zerubbabel is not mentioned in connection with the Temple dedication. Neither is he mentioned after this time. Perhaps he died or retired from public life upon completion of the Temple. His influence was so great, however, that historians designate the Second Temple as Zerubbabel's Temple.

God was apparently pleased with Zerubbabel's role in bringing the captives home and reestablishing Temple worship. On Gods instructions, Haggai promised Zerubbabel a special blessing: I will take you, Zerubbabel My servant, the son of Shealtiel, says the Lord, and will make you as a signet ring; for I have chosen you. (Hag. 2:23)

Wermann, Most Excellent Grand High Priest of Florida, the Chairman of the Committee on Work has authorized the Grand Secretary of the Grand Chapter of Florida to issue three (3) sets of Essentials and Key Lectures to each constituent Chapter of Florida. These sets will be mailed to the Secretary of the Chapter and will be forth coming in the next few days. Upon receipt of these, the Secretary is directed to number each set on the front cover and on a center inside page as follows: Number of Chapter followed by 2014 and the initial of the Dais Office to which it is being issued. Example: 352014HP is issued to the High Priest of Sarasota, Chapter No. 35, (with the "2014" indicating the year was sent by the Grand Secretary); King will be issued 352014K and the Scribe 352014S. Each officer must sign for the issued material upon his installation, and return same to the Secretary prior to installation the following year. No sets may be carried over. A copy of the document to be signed is attached to this email. Companion Secretaries please download and keep a permanent copy for reproduction as necessary. A completed copy of the attached Record Form must be forwarded to the Custodian of Ritualistic Materials by the first week of February each year. This may be done as an email attachment. We are aware that these materials are more often needed by other Companions carrying the ritualistic responsibilities of your chapter, but such issue is not allowed constitutionally. Those allowed to use the Essentials and Key Lecture for each ensuing year are therefore under the oversight and control of the officer to which the copies were issued and he must maintain constant knowledge and location of such and when loaned, must have them in his possession prior to the end of the physical year to be returned to the Secretary. The Essentials and Key Lecture are not to be copied for any purpose and to do so is a violation of Masonic conduct.

All preexisting forms of the Essentials and Key Lectures are to be retained by the Chapter Secretary and returned to the Custodian of Ritualistic Material at the 2014 Grand Conclave of the Grand Chapter where they will be inventoried and placed in the care of the Grand Secretary.

### V. REQUEST FOR CLARIFICATION DIRECTED TO COMMITTEE ON WORK

A. (Regarding Capitulary Grand Honors to newly installed High Priests):

While Royal Arch Chapter Capitulary Grand Honors are given west of the Altar (Appendix D page 33, Reception of Grand Line Officers), it does not address the question pertaining to the High Priest. As the Grand Chapter of Florida follows protocol of the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Florida when not otherwise stipulated, it would follow that at time of installation, or at a tyled convocation following such, the newly installed High Priest, should therefore receive Private Capitulary Grand Honors in the East.

B. After a requested review of the correct spelling of "Japheth" in our ritual work, a directive was sent by the Chairman of the Committee on Work to the Companion District Instructors and Committee On Work Members requesting the following:

A discrepancy between the Appendix D and the General Grand Chapter Red Book in the spelling of Japheth (reference p. w. of the 2nd Veil). While procedures outlined in Appendix D take precedence over those of the Red Book, typos should not. Therefore in Appendix D, page 20 line 27, please correct the spelling of Japeth as follows: insert an "h" after the letter "p" correcting the spelling to Japheth. This is important as it effects the pronunciation of the name which according to researched sources may either be "Jay-feth" or "Jah-feth."

C. Request for clarification of when the Dais Officers stand in Opening Ceremony of Chapter:

In all preceding Masonic work, three raps brings everyone to their feet and without other direction, the same must be followed. When the Capt. Of the Host gives the three raps, the Dais Officers arise with the rest of the companions and then descend to the circle after the report of the Capt. of the Host as indicated in both the Appendix D. and Red Book, page 91.

### CONSTITUTION REVIEW COMMITTEE REPORT 2013 - 2014

Last year this committee was given the task of updating the Grand Chapter Constitution as the version being used was dated from 1997. Therefore research was carried out going back to the Grand Chapter Proceedings of 1997 and in some cases beyond to make sure that all amendments and rules and regulations changes that were approved were added and/or corrected. The amendment regarding protocol was added as Appendix E and the previously approved Table Chapter Ritual was added as Appendix F. The Funeral Service was added to Appendix D. The Four Veils Award was added to the rules and regulations regarding awards.

At that time a comprehensive review was not carried out, but obvious spelling errors, typographical errors, grammatical errors and obvious mistakes which did not in any way change the intent or meaning of any of the content therein, were corrected. This revision was carried out through May 2010, the last year that approved proceedings were available.

This year a comprehensive proof reading of the entire document was carried out. All spelling errors, spacing errors, grammatical errors, etc. were corrected. An index was created for the Articles of the Constitution and the Rules and Regulations. All amendments approved from 2010 through the 2013 Convocation were added, This included the creation of the Royal Arch Research Chapter which was added to Article XIII of the Constitution as Section 20, and whose by-laws were incorporated as Appendix G.

The revised document was approved by Most Excellent John Wermann and then sent to our Grand Recorder for publication on the web site and notice sent out so that any interested parties could review it before this Grand Convocation. There is some confusion regarding the wording of the \$2.00 increase in the per capita, which should be addressed in the future. I wish to thank the Grand Chapter for allowing us to serve our fellow Companions in this important task.

I would also like to thank the REGC's wife, Kate, for her contribution to this effort.

### **INVESTMENT COMMITTEE 2013 - 2014**

During the calendar year of 2013 our investments grew well and further there was much talk of improvement. However, that improvement did not occur until near the end of 2013. Therefore this report will also include changes which occurred during the time of January 1, 2014 until near the present.

There are two investment accounts to be reported upon; The life membership account and the administrative endowment account. At the beginning of the year they were both in the hands of the Broker, Raymond James. They were switched to the hands of Edward Jones near, but slightly prior to the start of 2014.

The life membership account started 2013 with a balance of \$302,090 of which \$111,291 was in cash. It finished 2013 with a balance of \$289,346, with \$12,060 having been withdrawn. Its value at the end of March, 2014 was \$291,104, with \$13,184 in eash. This is an overall effective annual rate of return of less than 1%, with a major factor being the unproductive cash for almost

The Administrative Endowment Fund started 2013 with a balance of \$272,904 of which \$22,294 was in cash. It finished 2013 with a balance of \$313,875 with \$26,827 in cash. Its value at the end of March, 2014 was \$317,847, with only a minor amount in cash. This is an overall effective annual rate of return of 12.2%.

The Grand Lodge of Florida invests similar funds and the overall annual rate of return reported for 2013 was 11.6%. I believe that this is an appropriate standard of comparison, as it most closely compares the range of our investments to similar ones for the Grand Lodge, albeit the size of the Grand Lodge funds is much larger.

I have prepared legislation to change the term "market indices" in our Strategic Investment Policy to "return realized by the Grand Lodge F & A M of Florida's funds of similar purpose". However, it was not received by the Grand Secretary in time for this year's legislative package. Therefore, it must wait for next year's Convention.

A final word about the new Broker, Edward Jones. The representative is named David Jones and is based in Tampa. He is a long time member of the Grand Lodge Investment Committee and has investment responsibility over many Lodge's funds, as well as Chapters. He has familiarity not only with our goals and risk tolerances, but also is a great communicator, and a believer in at least quarterly review, as is our requirements. I remain confident that the quality of communication will be greatly improved, compared to the past several years.

Lastly, I wish to thank the MEGHP John Wermann, for this opportunity to serve.

### GRAND CHAPTER JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTE REPORT 2013-2014

The Preliminary Report of the Grand High Priest was received by the Committee members by the end of March. The Committee met on April 27, 2014, at the Sheraton Suites Airport Hotel in Tampa, Florida, to consider the actions of the Grand High Priest.

There was a huge volume of documents to be considered, including: Dispensations, Executive Orders, a Ruling and Decision accompanied by a Rescindment of that Ruling and Decision. Warrants, Special Communications and Proclamations, Bylaws Changes Requested, a Timeline History of Pursuing Past Due Grand Chapter Proceedings, a partial list of the MEGHP's Calendar of Events, and a List of Grand Representatives.

There were 13 Requests for Dispensation. All but one was in proper form and of a routine nature. Those of a routine nature were handled expeditiously and properly by the GHP. The one not in proper form was redone after the GHP pointed out its deficiencies; it was then correctly approved.

There were six Executive orders issued by ME Wermann. All were within the powers of the GHP and in proper form.

The Ruling and Decision was rescinded after advice from the Committee. Since it was rescinded, it became a non-item.

There were 42 Warrants processed by the GHP. All were in proper form and all dealt with budgeted items.

There were seven Special Communications and Proclamations issued by MEGHP Wermann. Their subject matter included messages reminding the Companions to make a special observance of Christmas, Thanksgiving, Veterans Day, Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, Labor

Day, the 4th of July, and Father's Day. The Committee commends the GHP for thus expanding the horizons of the Grand Chapter.

There were three Bylaws Changes requested. Two were of a routine nature and approved, all correctly done by the GHP. The third involved what would have been a violation of Capitular law, and the GHP, after a series of communications, was able to resolve the problem.

The GHP's Itinerary was a lengthy one. Our GHP is an energetic person who travelled extensively within and outside the state. The Committee is grateful that our Grand Chapter was well represented so often.

There were seven Resolutions to be presented to the Grand Chapter. Two were deemed not to be in proper form and were pulled. The other five will be presented after the adoption of this report.

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The Jurisprudence Committee commends the job Most Excellent did during the 2013-2014 Capitular year. He had a very busy year and put enormous amounts of energy and time into doing his job. With the one exception noted above, he acted well within the prerogatives of his office and exercised his powers judiciously and for the good of the Order.

The Committee wishes to express its thanks to the GHP for entrusting us with the most important function of overseeing the business of the Grand Chapter.

### NECROLOGY

Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Members of the Grand Line, and Companions all,

Necrology in Royal Arch Masonry has grown from the simple definition of "a list of the officially dead," or "an obituary" to a report which includes not only the mention of the dead, but also the statement of the Royal Arch Fraternity's relative health." On that foundation, it can be said that the Royal Arch of Masonry is alive in Florida. Depending on which source you use to extract the numbers for this accrology report, the numbers vary; but bear with me.

Let us deal with the number of deaths. The Grand Secretary and the Most Excellent Grand High Priest have the same figure – seventy-four (74). This number may or may not be accurate and it is not the fault of the Grand Secretary; it has more to do with the secretaries of each chapter who may or may not send the figures to the Grand Secretary. At any rate, that is the number of deaths for the year 2013-2014. Since the original preparation of this report, there has been the passing of the Past Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Vernon H. Miller, who passed away on April 24, 2014. To quote our present Most Excellent Grand High Priest, John F. Wermann, "PGHP Miller was a long and faithful servant to our craft. He led this Grand Chapter in an exemplary Manner and was an inspiration to all who knew him."

There is no list of who passed away. The absence of the list publicly avoids a worthy companion accidentally being omitted thereby causing anguish to some. The omission is accidental if there is one. Be charitable, Companions. Let us remember them and pray for them whose name is listed among the residents of that "house not made with hands, eternal in the Heavens."

Added to the number of deaths are the number of demits. There is no discrepancy here. The figure is nine between our two sources. Add this figure to the death number, and it becomes eighty-four (84). This is how the death figure is arrived at. Whether they demit or die, the Chapter is that much less because of their absence

This past year has been an excellent growth year. The number of Exaltations easily fills in the vacancies in our Grand chapter which was the result of deaths and demits. Several Chapters have contributed to this positive year. The number of exaltations up to the end of the 2013 calendar was 139. There were several very successful festivals: Orlando (8), Ft. Meyers (12), Lakeland (4),

Tampa (12). Pensacola-Ft. Pierce (10), Miami (6). These festivals brought the number of Exaltations to 160(+ -) plus more that were not figured in or were duplicated numbers. The number of Exaltations (139) minus the deaths/demit of (84) equals 55. The 55 represents a growth figure for the first half of our year. The first half of the year got the Chapter off on a

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positive note for 2013-2014 year. Looking at the totals for the year, terrible reporting notwithstanding. The Chapter completed the year with a positive growth of 77 new companions. Most Excellent Grand High Priest, it is my pleasure to report to you and the companions that the Grand Chapter is healthy and growing at end of this 2013-2014 year.

   They shall also be entitled to a free ticket to all Grand Communication functions appropriate to ladies. This includes, but is not limited to the banquet, lunches, breakfasts and any other planned activities to be held at the Hotel hosting the annual Convocation.
- 3) They shall also be entitled to a copy of the "Grand York Rite Bodies of Florida Directory" and also a "Souvenir Program Book".

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The above to be effective May 15, 2104

# Resolution to add Chapter 47: Youth Scholarship Award and Chapter 48: Grand Chapter of R.A.M. of Florida Youth Scholarship Award Investment Fund

New Language:

# CHAPTER FORTY-SEVEN - Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida Youth Scholarship Award

### 47.01: The style of the scholarship:

The style of this Scholarship shall be "Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida Youth Scholarship Award"

### 47.02: Establishment of Scholarship Committee:

The Most Excellent Grand High Priest upon his election to Office is to appoint seven Royal Arch Companions to serve as the oversight committee for this Scholarship Award. This Committee to be composed of Four (4) Most Excellent Grand High Priests and Three (3) Royal Arch Companions in good standing in the Grand Chapter Jurisdiction of Florida. The committee will develop a petition which all applicants must fill out and submit together with whatever supporting documentation the Committee may deem necessary.

(A) It shall be the duty of this committee to establish the criteria for the awarding of this Scholarship, determine the amount and when scholarships are available, examine applications for scholarship, and to submit to the MEGHP a list of those individuals and amounts of scholarship recommended by the committee. This criteria may be changed from time to time as the committee sees fit. However all applicants will be judged by the same set of criteria as established by the committee.

(B) This Committee will serve at the will and pleasure of the Most Excellent Grand High Priest.

### 47.03: Qualifications of Applicant:

- A) All applicants must be a current student due to graduate from high school within 12 months of dated application.
- B) A current student of an institute of higher learning or applying for admission to the institute of higher learning having already graduated from high school or obtained a GED.
- C) The applicant must be seeking higher education in an accredited institution of higher learning.
- D) The applicant must be accepted by this accredited institution of higher learning prior to scholarship being paid out. All monies awarded must be paid over to the institution of higher learning in the award winner's name.
- E) All Florida Youth who are past members of Jobs Daughters. Rainbow for Girls, DeMolay, related to a Companion Royal Arch Mason by blood or legal contract including but not limited to children, adopted as same, grand children, great grandchildren, nieces, nephews, etc., shall receive special consideration when determining the receipents of this scholarship award.
- F) Those who have been awarded or not awarded a scholarship may re-apply each year.

### 47.04 Initial funding of Grand Chapter Scholarship:

- A) This fund may be added to at any time at the discretion of the M.E.G.H.P. as he may determine. This can be done by transfer of funds deemed are available in the Grand Chapter Budget or other funds so identified by the M.E.G.H.P.
- B) The fund may be added to by way of Donations, Bequests and Fund Raisers for that purpose. C) This Fund may added to by and Legal activity which does not conflict with the Constitution

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or By-Laws of the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of RAM of FL. Or the Grand Lodge of Florida.

#### 47.05 Determining Amounts and When Scholarships can be awarded:

- A) No scholarships can be awarded unless there is at least \$30,000.00 in the Scholarship Fund Investment Account.
- B) No scholarship may be awarded that will reduce the fund to less than \$30,000.00.
- C) No more than 75 percent of total income on the Scholarship Investment Account carned the proceeding year can be used for scholarship awards in the current year. Earnings will be calculated for scholarships to be awarded on earnings of the Scholarship fund January 1 through December 31, of each year.
- D) Amounts of scholarships are to be determined by the "Committee". Scholarships presented must be no less than \$500.00 or more than \$5000.00 to any single individual. Any amount inbetween can also be awarded. All scholarships awarded are at the discretion of the Committee.

Chapter Forty-Eight: Grand Chapter of R.A.M. of Florida Youth Scholarship Award Investment Fund (hereinafter referred to as YSAF in this section of the Constitution)

# 48.01: Grand Chapter YSAF Investment Purpose and Policy, Objectives, Strategy, Goals and Procedures

The investment purpose and policy, objectives, strategy, goals and investment procedures shall be the same as Chapter 46 subsection 46.01 through 46.05 of the Constitution of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons or as the same may be revised.

**48.01.01** The collected funds referred to herein may be used for no other purpose other than Youth Scholarship.

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#### Resolution to add Article VI Elections, Section 1. Subsection d.

#### New Language:

d. All eligible balloting Companions are allowed no more than one vote in addition to any proxy from their Chapter.

#### **Resolution Passed**

#### Resolution to Amend Article XXI, Amendments, Section 2 Filing

#### Old Language

Each proposed amendment shall be filed with the Grand Secretary so it will reach his office no later than February first of each year. The Grand Secretary will cause said amendment to be duplicated, and a copy of same shall be mailed by the Grand Secretary to all Past Grand High Priests, all Line Officers of Grand Chapter, all District Deputies, and four copies to each Secretary of each Chartered Chapter, so that said amendment shall reach said Secretary by March 1st of each Year.


#### New Language:
