Companion's education and communication will dictate the future. We must get our York Rite information out to all Masonic Lodges and TOUCH the lives of prospective candidates. I believe our greatest Strength is you, the individual Companion, and I would like to thank you for your continued support of me personally and our York

AGAIN; thank you for an enjoyable year.

PROGRAM

The main focus this past year has been establishing a written repeatable membership process. We have completed 3 of 4 proposed process and implemented them. (1) We have developed a membership program to include a tri-fold, a CD (with all Masonic Bodies represented and all organizations for the ladies represented). We sent these to all newly raised Masons twist a year.

With 700 mailings, we are averaging a 10% response at a cost of \$2000 per year. Thanks to that committee R. Ex. Henry and Kate Adams. (2) We have developed a Tri-fold and produced a naturalized (No name or years on it) York Rite Lapel Pin. These are used within the local Blue Lodges as part of their monthly Masonic Education to promote York Rite. Thanks to that committee R. Ex. Robert (Robby) Robertson. (3) We are also, developing a state wide data base of the locations and specific members of YR members who are proficient in demonstrating the circumambulation and/or fervency and zeal. We will then schedule them to the various blue Lodges throughout the state. (4) Yes, there is another success story. The youth committee M.W. Michael Pardon Jr. and R. Ex. Ronald Newton developed a Youth Project Funding process. Ron designed and had manufactured a naturalized (no individual name or year on it) Youth Coin. We purchased 500 and have sold over 400 of them. The monies earned are deposited in a revolving Youth fund account from which the various youth groups may submit requests, in writing, for their needs and/or projects within the individual bethels etc. Ronald has already facilitated the building and replacement of the Rain Bow Girls convention altar. It was dedicated and used on June 29, 2016. Thanks to that Committee. Ron and Mike.

This past year Grand Architect of the Universe ceased the labor of and called home 239 Companions. Because of the contributions made by these companions our great fraternity is better off; may their departed souls rest in peace forever.

PER CAPITA:

The per capita (with a \$5.00 increase to \$15.00) projected to be collected for the 2017-18 budget year is anticipated to be \$50,175.00. The amount collected for the 2016-17 budget (this year) at \$10.00 is approximately \$14,406.00.

First and foremost, I want to extend my sincere thank-you to the Companions of this Grand Body for extending to me the honor and privilege of serving you during the past year. It has been truly a great experience for me and I am humbled by the dedicated service given to the Grand Office by very dedicated companions of this Grand Organization. A very special thanks is extended to the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Richard A. Wolfe, The Grand Chapter Officers, and the constituent Secretaries for their outstanding, unwavering support during this past year. Secretaries, you are doing an outstanding job of sending in your monthly reports and your constant efforts extended to the Grand Offices Office Manager in straightening out the membership rosters is greatly appreciated. Your rapid responses to the requests of the Grand Office has greatly improved the accuracy of the data base and has increased the efficiency of your Grand Office.

A very special thanks is extended to our Office Manager Kimberly Bailey. She joined the Grand Office team the very first week of June and through her tremendous effort she has reorganized the office to make it operate more efficiently. Because of the illness of my predecessor, there was a lot of catching up to do after the last convention. The first order of business was to get the directory published. Thanks to the rapid and exhausting efforts of Kim, the directory was able to go to print within the first month after the convention. Although it did contain errors, corrections were made on a monthly basis to update the directory and correct those errors. It was found that requests for certificates for the 25, 40, 50 year awards were way behind. During the first three months, the Office processed approximately 600 certificates for all three bodies. While doing all of this, she also found that the monthly reports were way behind. Through her efforts, the reports were entered into the data base and were brought up to date. Without going into detail, it was found that monthly reports were being entered into two different computers that were supposed to be linked together so they operated on the same data file. It was immediately found out that these computers weren't linked together so there were actually two different data files. This situation was quickly corrected but it required extensive amounts of time to correct.

Also, a very special thanks is extended to Companion Henry Adams and his wife Katie. Without their assistance and in-depth knowledge, the proceedings for 2015 would not have been completed. Their continued assistance extends further to the preparations for this Grand Convention. Without their constant assistance, the Grand Office would not have moved forward as fast as it did. Thank you so very much.

I would be remiss if I didn't acknowledge and thank another officer worker. Ericka Mathany was already working in the office when I came into office. Her expertise and experience working in the Grand York Rite Office of Georgia was invaluable to your Grand Office. Unfortunately, she left to attend college but her work during her short stay was invaluable to the initial organization of your office. She did assist in preparing for this Grand Convention. Thank you so very much.

The computer equipment in the Grand Office was about 5 or more years old and each computer was running a different operating systems making it difficult to network each computer together. After about a month, two of the three computers were showing signs of failing making it necessary to immediately replace these computers. Three new computers were purchased of the same make and model each running the same operating system. Also, it was necessary to have access to the office computers when I, or the staff, am not at the office. Two laptop computers were purchased to enable the Grand Secretary and Office Manager to have that access. (From the MEGHP -Thanks Ed)

Now all the office computers and laptops are networked together making data entry and backup of each computer more uniform and secure.

There were 5 different printers in the office each of the type more suited for home use than that of the office. The cost of the ink for each printer was getting out of hand. Two office MFP printers of the exact same make and model were purchased making printing and document handling flow with greater speed and accuracy.

Recommendations:

Work has already begun to update the monthly reporting system currently in use. I recommend that the technology committee that was formed this year remain intact for the following year. During the year recommendations from this committee as to stream lining the reporting system and the updating of the computer reporting system be forthcoming.

Again, Thank you for allowing me to serve you as your Grand Secretary this year.

PRELIMINARY REPORT OF THE GRAND TREASURER MAY 2015 – MARCH 2016

For the Fraternal year of 2015-16 the following report covers the first 10 months through March 2016. A final report covering the entire year will be issued in time to be published in the 2016 Proceedings.

This was the first year for Carl Gilmore as Grand Treasurer and thus some amount of learning the "ropes" was necessary. However, in doing so, it was determined that several new procedures would be of benefit. These include:

- A. In addition to submitting the normal monthly Balance Sheet, Profit and Loss Statement and Budget Expense Sheet for the Grand Chapter to the Grand High Priest, a Profit and Loss Statement for the <u>Grand Office</u> was included. This marks the <u>first time</u> such information has been regularly reported.
- B. In addition to the payment of Life and Perpetual dividends paid in February to the Chapters due them, <u>for the first time</u> ever a Statement was issued to the Chapters, showing Names and Amounts that made up the total dividend paid. It thereby provides a "feedback" loop, so that Secretary/Recorders may make the Grand Treasurer aware of any inaccuracy discovered and thus makes the Life/Perpetual Records more accurate.
- C. The records of the Life and Perpetual Membership program were kept on separate "Works" spread sheets. Thus some 150 separate spread sheets must be accessed to "turn the crank" on the program. All these spread sheets have been converted to the newer "Excel" spread sheets and work is ongoing to convert them to a single "Access" database system, where updating records and providing statements and other reports will be much more automatic.
- D. Checks are now printed on "computer" type checks, with the printing generated through the Bookkeeping Software program, thus ensuring greater accuracy with corresponding lower entry errors.

Richard Foreman, the immediate past Grand Treasurer, has been a great resource and help during the time of transition. His knowledge has been available to me frequently and his help is much appreciated.

The Investment Committee has been both active and informed monthly of the two Investment Account's activity and market impacts. There has been both group and individual communication regarding the investments. The Investment Committee will have its own report for the Craft, but I can say that the Committee has been attentive to achieving the goals of the two investment vehicles.

The Perpetual Fund was able to pay the 5% dividend to the Chapters this year without a reduction of Fund Value; i.e. the Fund received dividends from the investments amounting to more than the Payout to the Chapters. I'm pleased

to announce that the Perpetual Fund has in 2015 gained 43 new members for a total of 560 members and, even with a difficult year in the Market, the fund is valued at 24% more than the total member investment. (This percent gained is NOT a one year gain, rather represents the good stewardship of many years.)

I thank the Craft for this opportunity to serve as Grand Treasurer. Copies of the Balance Sheet, Profit and Loss Statements to date and Perpetual Membership Investment and Payout for this year are attached herewith.

THE GRAND HISTORIANS LECTURE 2015-2016

"Beginnings, a Grand Lodge Emerges"

It all began on an unknown date in 1716. The members of four Lodges, three from London and one from Westminster met at the Apple Tree Tavern in London and after having put the oldest mason in the chair formed a Grand Lodge Pro-Tempore in Due Form. They agreed to meet again on June 24th, 1717 at the Goose and Gridiron Ale-House on Saint John the Baptist Day and the first Grand Lodge was constituted. It is worthy of note that, although this Alc-House had several floors, the largest dining/meeting room was only 14 1/2 by 21 1/2 feet in area. This was the beginning of the Grand Lodge Era. Present day historians believe there were other Lodges existing in and around London but for some reason they did not wish to participate in the Grand Lodge experiment. For information on the early years of the Premier Grand Lodge you have to refer to a reference called "Andersons Reconstructed Minutes" that were published twenty-two years later by the Rev. Doctor James Anderson in 1738. This second edition of Andersons Constitutions along with the 1723 edition was the Holy Grail for Freemasons and is still used by many Grand Jurisdictions today including Florida. The Constitutions directed the Masters and Wardens of the Lodges in and about London and Westminster to

meet with the Grand Lodge four times a year. The Annual Communication and Feast was held on June 24th, Saint John the Baptist Day. The three Quarterly Communications were to be held on Michaelmas (September 29th), Christmas, and Lady-Day (March 25th).

Anderson, along with Dr. J. T. Desaguliers were members of the Lodge that met at the Rummer and Grapes Tavern in Westminster. Members from this Lodge appeared to be more prosperous than the Brothers from the Apple Tree Tavern, the Crown Ale-House, and the Goose and Gridiron Ale-House. In 1719, during his year as the third Grand Master, Desaguliers completed the Original 15 Lectures/Stories for the degrees that was edited by Dr. Anderson. (To purchase a copy of "AS IT WAS IN THE BEGINNING" which contains these 1719 lectures, please see M.I. Chuck Hollinger. The cost is \$10.00) John Theophilus Desaguliers was born in Rochelle, France, in 1683, the son of a Protestant minister. He was taken to England in his childhood, for his family had to flee from the slaughter of Protestants which followed the Revocation of the Edict of Nantes. He graduated at Oxford University, specializing in science, and was the first man ever to lecture on science in London, and one of the first physicists to work and teach in a laboratory. In his spare time he became interested in the science of gunnery and invented a sponging apparatus for the breech-loading 12-pounder. He was received as a Fellow of the Royal Society; was an intimate friend of Sir Isaac Newton; an eminent figure in the Church and in society. Dr. Desaguliers also served as Deputy Grand Master three times, and since 1721, when it became the custom to have a nobleman in the Grand East, the Deputy was what the Pro-Grand Master of England is today, this means that Desaguliers was in actuality head of the Grand Lodge for a total of four years. It was during those years that he became the architect of the Grand Lodge System, and merited Dr. Albert Gallatin Mackey's tribute in after years as "the Father of Modern Speculative Freemasonry." It has also been said "that, to him, perhaps, more than to any other man are we indebted for the existence of Freemasonry as a living institution." Desaguliers among other accomplishments made a thorough study of old Masonic practices; collected every available Masonic document; took the lead in having a new Book of Constitutions prepared; closed the door to participation in religious and political parties; brought a large number of prominent men in the Craft; initiated the Grand Lodge Benevolence Fund and the law requiring Lodge Charters; and personally assisted with the founding of the Grand Lodge of Scotland. To his further credit, it should be mentioned that he was one of the few that attended the funeral of Dr. Anderson in 1739. When Desaguliers came into Masonry the Grand Lodge consisted of four or five inconspicuous Lodges whose delegates could sit in a circle in a small room; by the time of his death in 1744 it had become a worldwide Fraternity with Grand Lodges on the Continent and in America.

In in process of verifying the facts in this talk using Coils Masonic Encyclopedia, I found something regarding the Altar that was unknown to me. Henry Wilson Coil states: The presence of an altar in a Masonic Lodge is

difficult to account for. Modern Freemasons regard that object as an ancient fixture and indispensable. Furthermore, it is difficult to estimate the time of, or the occasion for, its introduction into American Lodges. There were no altars in Lodges of the early seventeen hundreds, and it should especially be noted that William Preston, in his Lectures beginning in 1772 describes all of the furniture, ornaments, lights, and jewels of the Lodge, its shape, floor, and ceiling, but mentions no altar. Freemasons were the first to associate the Holy Bible with the altar just as they were the first to place the terrestrial and celestial globes on top of the two columns, Jachin (Jakin) and Boaz.

For some time I have been curious about the answers given in the opening of a Royal Arch Chapter by the Master of the Second Veil in mentioning the sons of Noah. Why are they used? Our Capitular Degrees do not mention Noah, the Ark of Safety/Refuge, or his sons in any manner or form.

The early Ritual being worked in some Lodges was not the Hiramic Legend as it didn't arrive on the scene until around 1730. The Graham manuscript of 1726 clearly documents that there was a legend based on Noah and his three sons, Shem, Ham, and Japheth. Also, Dr. James Anderson in his 1738 Constitutions referred to Masons as Noachidae or Sons of Noah. The Graham Manuscript gives a traditional history of which Noah was the central figure that historically occurred about 1,300 years before the building of King Solomon's Temple. With the death of Noah some secret knowledge was lost. His three sons went to their father's grave "to try if they could to find anything about him to lead them to the veritable secrets which this famous preacher had." But before they went they "had already agreed that if they did not find the very thing itself, the first thing they found was to be to them as a secret..." Companions, there we have the earliest reference to "substituted secrets." When they arrived at the grave they found "nothing but the dead body almost consumed away." Because of its condition their first efforts to raise it failed. But ultimately "they raised up the dead body, setting foot to foot, knee to knee, breast to breast, cheek to cheek, and hand to back." In this old Noah legend the manuscript gives several other details that are almost identical with elements in our current Hiramic Legend. Eventually the Craft settled on the Hiramic/Temple Legend that first appeared in Samuel Pritchard's Masonry Dissected which was published in 1730-four years after the date of the Graham MS. You can't help but feel that the writers of the Royal Arch opening ritual included the Shem, Ham, and Japheth reference to remind us of the intimate connection existing between Ancient Craft Masonry and the Royal Arch.

In closing, the change which came over Freemasonry in 1717 and the following years cannot be correctly described by any single word, nether revival, revolution, creation, reorganization, reincarnation, nor transmutation. It can properly be described only by stating what occurred. The practical art of building was spiritualized into a speculative society of morality, illustrated by

symbolism drawn from architecture and other sources; and the regulations and laws of the Mason's trade were made relevant to social, moral, and fraternal purposes. As Dr. Albert G. Mackey expressed it, "The ship was still there but the object of the voyage had been changed."

INSURANCE COMMITTEE REPORT 2015-2016

We were tasked by the Most Excellent Grand High Priest to secure property insurance for the Grand Chapter. This insurance has not been in place for over twenty years and the Grand High Priest collar and the Grand Line officer's collars and aprons alone are valued at over \$25,000.00. This doesn't include the jointly owned office property in the Grand York Rite office in the Tampa York Rite building.

Several agencies were contacted to secure quotes for a property insurance policy. Two of the agencies since being contacted have changed their personnel causing a major delay in obtaining quotes. The committee is now working with a third agency (the same agency that maintains the property insurance for the Tampa York Rite) to get a quote for this insurance. It is hoped by the Grand York Rite annual meetings in Lake Mary, we will have completed this task in getting a quote and making a recommendation to the Grand High Priest.

REPORT OF THE INVESTMENT COMMITTEE FOR THE GRAND CHAPTER of FLORIDA 2015 –2016

The active members Investment Committee participated in a telecom with the Edward Jones broker, David Jones to discuss the account status, asset allocation, reviewed the fourth quarter results and going forward strategy on November 11, 2015. Numerous Emails and phone calls between members of the committee and our Grand High Priest facilitated committee performance monitoring, and along with the Statements provided the by the Grand Treasurer, forming the basis for recommendations of the committee. A number of Executive Orders derived from the committee recommendations were executed by the Grand Treasurer at the direction of the Grand High Priest. Continuous monitoring of the investments in an attempt to contain losses and adjust positions to maximize yield has turned around the total returns in 2016. With total returns in the Life/Perpetual account at 4.53% and the Administrative account at 1.04%.

Considerable effort was expended to establish the current asset allocation (AA) as it was clearly not visible to the committee through the method of reporting provided it by Edward Jones. Aside from the current Grand Chapter bylaw para. 46.03, recommended asset allocation for an investment account, the Grand High Priest made a concerted effort to establish new guidelines for potential legislation to change the AA ratio for each of the two accounts. New members gaining knowledge on the workings of the committee and terminology associated with investing necessitated considerable communications to nail down where the committee was to deviate from the current AA guidelines and on what basis to establish new strategies. A model was provided committee members to assist in the process to propose a revised asset allocation, together with a set of standard risk assessment questions presented for evaluation and input. Legislation to effect this change could not be constructed this Capitular year as these questions were not answered by the committee. The understanding of a lesser risk factor is necessary on sacred funds and must be considered in order to provide a guaranteed return to its class of members. Current market conditions must be considered, as the ratio of fixed to equity positions demands an asset allocation that generates income at or preferably greater than the legislated rate of return (5%) to its members. The present two combined accounts asset allocation equals approximately 54% in equities, 44.3% fixed assets and 1.2% in cash. The asset allocation of each separate account cannot be determined from any of the financial data provided the committee to date.

A request that the committee be provided a copy of the P& L and balance sheet was denied by the Grand Treasurer, impeding essential funding requirement profiles to aid in the timing of investments and liquidation for expenditure needs. Large sums of cash have historically have been held in the accounts non-productive for up to a year, un-invested.



Additionally, it came to the attention of the committee, that the brokerage accounts have one signature on file – the Grand Treasurers. The fiduciary principle officers are not on record for signature, placing the Grand Chapter's funds at risk of immediate accessibility in the event of the absence of the Grand Treasurer. It is the recommendation of the committee that all future Grand High Priests ensure this single-point-of failure does not recur. No organization large or small excludes the fiduciaries of record on its financial accounts.

The Grand Chapter's investments were not productive this Capitular year primarily due to the market down turn during the September 2015 through February 2016 time frame. Our investments started the year April 1, 2015 with an Administrative account balance of \$328.1K, with \$50K added in April 2015and ending with \$358.8K March 31, 2016 and a total return of - 4.12% for 2015. Our Life/Perpetual account started with a balance of \$309.2K and ended at \$313.2K March 31, 2016, with a total return of -1.68% for 2015.

The negative return on the Life/Perpetual account requires immediate and continual attention to re-align investments with a fixed higher yield for the long term, eluding further corpus erosion. Chapter bylaw changes regarding this account will require tighter direction to mitigate future risk. A stream of income produced by fixed assets comprised of long-term bonds under a forty-percent asset allocation recommendation in our bylaws, is lacking in the present strategy.

We would like to thank the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, ME Richard Wolfe for allowing us to serve the Grand Chapter. It has been a privilege an honor to serve on his behalf.

The Jurisprudence Committee examined the Resolutions for conformity to Article XXI of the said Constitution. We found the Resolutions proposed, meet all requirements and are appropriate to come to the floor at this Session for your decision.

We commend the Grand High Priest for having faithfully performed his duties this Capitular year and applaud him on his many visitations. Each member of the Jurisprudence Committee expresses his personal gratitude for the privilege and honor of serving this Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons.

During the current year of 2015 the new companions, greeted totaled 143. The membership year extends from January 1 to December 31. We are starting off this year with 76 new companions.


