



GRAND CHAPTER OF ROYAL ARCH MASONS OF THE STATE OF FLORIDA GRAND SECRETARY'S REPORT 2017-2018

This year continued to be very busy for the Grand Office. The usual flood of requests for demits, certificates and Grand Representatives letters keep coming in at a steady pace. In additional to the usual business, I was undergoing treatment for cancer that kept me out of the office for the first three months of the year. The office staff continued the work of the office keeping me advised of all that was going on. Companion/Sir Knight John Miller and Kimberly Bailey, the office manager, were able to manage the work of the office in my absence without any interruption in business. Their assistance and work throughout the year is admirable and the Grand Office could not have been as efficient without their help. Thank you all.

The annual reports and Election of Officers reports by some units were, in some cases, more than three months late. Without the timely submission of these reports, it is impossible for the incoming presiding officers to make a budget and for the Grand Office to print a correct directory in time for the convention. The Grand Presiding Officers are addressing this problem.

The progress of converting the monthly reports from three written sheets to an on-line reporting format is proceeding at a slow pace. A server computer has been installed in the Grand Office and a "front end" program is being developed so all secretaries and recorders can log in from the web site to gain access to the data base. The new reporting program has been in use in the Grand Office this past year and is now the main database for our membership. There are several areas of the new program that are being worked on to make the database more usable and suitable for Florida use.

In February of this year the Grand Encampment held a seminar for all the Secretaries/Recorder in the jurisdiction on the Masonic Membership data base. In additional to this instruction, a demonstration of the new membership program being developed by the Grand Office was given. Approximately program being developed by the Grand Office was given. Feedback from these thirty-five Secretaries/Recorders attended this seminar. Feedback from these demonstrations indicted that the seminar was very informative and well demonstrations.

The Grand York Rite Web site is now under the control of the Grand Office. All submissions for the web site to the Grand Office can immediately placed on the site by the office staff. I would like to thank the technology committee for their work on this project. By having the web site controlled by the Grand Office, the reporting of membership by the unit secretary/recorders will be Office, the reporting of membership will be accessed directly made easier as access to the data base of membership will be accessed from the web site.

The cost of printing the various items that are required of the Grand Office to produce has greatly increased in the past few years. FINAL REPORT OF THE GRAND TREASURER June 2017 through May 2018

To The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida

For the Fraternal year of 2017-18 the following report covers the fiscal year. This was the third year for Carl Gilmore as Grand Treasurer and a smooth working relationship with the Grand Secretary has been maintained. There are however several items of interest to be reported:

A. The 5% Life/Perpetual Membership Dividend was paid to all participating Chapters in early January 2018.

B. The records of the Life and Perpetual Membership program records were converted last year were improved with more information on the statement sent to Secretaries with the Dividend Check.

C. Actual expenditures for the operation of the Grand Chapter were well within the approved Budget, such that the Administrative Endowment Fund did not have to be tapped, even though \$7,862 was allowed in the Budget. D. Similarly actual expenditures for the operation of the Grand Office were less than expected, with \$2,153.73 returned to the Grand Chapter. E. The Convention also made money with the support of the Souvenir Program, with \$2,331.23 returned to the Grand Chapter.

The Investment Committee has been both active and informed monthly of the two Investment Account's activity and market impacts. There has been both group and individual communication regarding the investments. The Investment Committee will have its own report for the Craft, but I can say that the Committee has been attentive to achieving the goals of the two investment vehicles.

The Perpetual Fund was able to pay the 5% dividend to the Chapters this year without a reduction of Fund Value; i.e. the Fund received dividends and growth from the investments amounting to more than the Dividend Payout to the Chapters, ending the fiscal year with a \$2,159.63 gain in spite of a \$13,323.89 payout. The Perpetual Fund has in 2017 gained 13 new members for a total of 576 members and, the fund is valued at 38% more than the total

member investment. This gain is NOT a one year gain, rather represents the good stewardship of many years.

A puzzling fact is that many of the Dividend Checks were slow to be cashed and as of the date of this writing, more than 6 months since the Dividend Checks were issued to the Chapters, three of those Chapter checks have yet to be cashed.

The Administrative Endowment Fund continues to grow, gaining \$29,940.31 or 7.3% during this fraternal year, in spite of the poor market conditions since February 2018.

I thank the Craft for this opportunity to serve as Grand Treasurer. Copies of the Balance Sheet, Profit and Loss Statements and Perpetual Membership Investment and Payout for this year are attached herewith.

FINANCIAL COMMITTEE REPORT 2017-2018

This committee would like to thank M.E. Ron Newton for the opportunity to serve the Craft. The committee has met via telecommunications, email and in person to discuss several topics, which they deemed within their preview and which concern the financial health and the positive growth of the Grand Chapter of R.A.M. of Florida. The Financial Committee will here forth be referred to as the Committee.

A discussion on the advantages and disadvantages of fee based accounts versus commission based accounts. Although the Committee could determine the cost advantages and disadvantages. It was almost impossible to determine the value the advisor brought to the fee based account. Since the Investment Committees have on occasion been less than diligent in the past and since the accounts are performing well, the Committee has deferred the overseeing of fee based opposed to the commission based to the current investment committee.

A discussion concerning the Perpetual account developed. The Committee was not completely happy with the current structure. We feel that a more concise historical audit and investigation of the current process, with the target of assuring we are operating under the best possible procedures for the benefit



of the craft, would be advantageous. We do highly recommend that the Investment Committee keep a vigil eye on the perpetual account and maintain it according with the investment policy and within asset allocation set forth in the Constitution. Recommend that a committee be assigned the task of Identifying viable option for managing this account, to include but not limited to a complete procedural audit of the current processes. This committee shall provide recommendations not later than the 2019 convocation. It is also recommended that as our Companion Treasurer must, as he is most current in running the processes, be a member of the team.

The Committee could see an advantage in the Memorial Perpetual Membership since it is structured differently than the Perpetual account. When the markets are doing well it could bring a larger value, not only to the constituent Chapters, but also to the Grand Chapter. Based on this structure this Committee recommends that legislation be presented at the next Grand Convocation to establish a Honorary Perpetual Membership, to be structured in the same manner as the Memorial Perpetual Membership, with the addition that an Honorary Perpetual Membership does not preclude a person from paying dues unless he already possesses a standard perpetual membership. We highly recommend that the constituent Chapters make use of these two Perpetual Memberships and that the Grand Chapter make it a point to convey this message to the Craft.

A discussion was held on the issue of Top Line Signer Awards. It was determined that although the original intent may have been positive, it was also vague. We also determined that the Award may be inappropriately used which in turn we believe establishes a perceived impression of quantity over quality. Taking our values to heart and believing that we should stay the course of quality over quantity, we unanimously recommend that Grand High Priest Ron Newton remove the Top Line Signer awards from the constitution by Proclamation, to be ratified by the Craft at the next Grand Convocation. In order to counteract any perceived loss of members, we recommend that the incoming Grand High Priest continue the membership program in conjunctions with the Grand Council and Grand Commandery. Also that he makes every effort to expand the program and make sure it is disseminated to the Craft for their use.

A discussion was held on whether we should expand a stipend to the Grand dais officers to attend the Triennial. Since it is the custom of this Grand Chapter not to extend stipends to the Craft to attend the Grand Convocation, it would be unfair for us to recommend an expansion of the current stipend system as set up in the Constitution.

We recommend that the Grand High Priest set up a committee in conjunction with the Grand Council and Grand Commandery to inventory the Grand Office to determine any needs that may be necessary to budget by the 3 Grand Bodies.

Finally, we discussed the replacement of Aprons and Cases for the Grand Line Officers and District Deputies. We determined this to be a maintenance issue and that 1 or 2 aprons and cases should be replaced on an annual basis, according to the amount of funds available and that a line item be placed in the budget accordingly. We also recommend the implementation of an inspection and signature sign out of all aprons and cases. Thereby assuring the condition of that apron and case. Hopefully this will encourage the care of said items and assure their return in the same condition as they were upon receipt.

THE GRAND HISTORIANS LECTURE 2017-2018

"The First Formal Lecture System"

I can't speak for everyone present this morning, but for me personally, the first Masonic Book that I acquired after my Master Mason Proficiency was the Florida Masonic Monitor. The current edition on page one has an Introduction, "Origin of Masonry and its Advantages." At its conclusion it indicates that the author was someone named Preston. Only his surname is used. Evidently, you should know who this person was just by the mention of his last name! A lot of time would pass before I would understand the reason for this.

The spread of Freemasonry in the United States was advanced by traveling Masonic Lecturers, sometimes appointed by Grand Lodges but often operating as independent entrepreneurs. They taught Craft ritual based on the Prestonian Lectures as rearranged and edited by Thomas Smith Webb of Massachusetts

in 1797, which is the basis of the ritual in nearly all American Grand Lodges. They also taught the Royal Arch and Knights Templar rituals, sold ritual monitors, regalia, and peddled other side degrees and orders.

Every Companion in this Tabernacle today has received and been exposed to the Webb-Preston work. Beginning with the Senior Deacons Anti-room Lecture, the first prayer you ever heard in the Lodge, and the Charge read at the conclusion of each of the three Symbolic Degrees.

Arriving on the Masonic scene about 1763 was a young man born in Edinburgh of middle class parents. He created a Masonic Lecture System that forever changed the fraternity. His name was Preston, William Preston. He set out to master the Ritual. Each word, gesture and inflection of it was given the same thoroughness with which he had also studied Latin. He read every book then available on the subject, visited countless Lodges to study their best ritualists, searched out old and retired experts who had known the Degrees when the Grand Lodge was in infancy, conferred with foreign Masons, carried on a huge correspondence, and finally organized a junta or small private college of Masonic experts which met once a week and were referred to as "the Prestonians." The climax came in 1772 when he delivered an oration at a "Grand Gala" in London, which was attended by the Grand Lodge officers and a large number of the Fraternity. Like Lord Byron in another connection, he awoke to find himself famous.

What Preston and the Prestonians accomplished over their years of hard, nation-wide work cannot be described in a single word; he found a way to restore portions of the Ritual lost by carelessness, which were essential to its symmetry and meaning. They corrected blunders; restored uniformity from Lodge to Lodge, found correct words to take the place of incorrect ones, made the Degrees as a whole, a balanced, consistent, and symmetric unity. Some portions in the Ritual had been devised to explain the other portions were "lectures," and he perfected them. He perfected a set of lectures of his own about the Degrees, delivered them many times with official sanction, and portions of these came in time to be incorporated in the Monitorial Work. His Illustrations of Masonry was first published in 1772 and it became from that date a handbook for ritualists; and still is today.

Preston first became a Mason in an Ancient Lodge but moved to one of the Moderns. In 1774, he was admitted as a member of the Lodge of Antiquity No. 01 and elected Master at the same meeting. This Lodge is the one that originally met at the Goose and Gridiron Ale House where the Mother Grand Lodge was formed in 1717. Preston served seven half-year terms of Mastership for the Lodge of Antiquity. Note that the terms of Lodge office were six months and ran from the Saint John's Anniversary in June to the Saint John's Anniversary in December.

In 1777, the Lodge of Antiquity became entangled with the Grand Lodge (Moderns) over a trivial incident. An abbreviated version of what happened is that several of the Lodge Members met at the MitreTavern on Saturday, December 27th to attend a service preached by the Lodge Chaplain to celebrate the Anniversary of Saint John the Evangelist. This was to be held across the street at St. Dunstan's Church. Upon arrival at the church, they changed into their Masonic Regalia in the vestry. At the conclusion of the



service, the Brethren returned to the Lodge for refreshment but a decision was made to not remove their regalia before walking across the street. This so called "public procession" was reported to Grand Lodge by certain older members of the Lodge that were dissatisfied with Preston's over enthusiastic approach to Freemasonry and were jealous of his knowledge and abilities.

Preston, in the course of the dispute, unnecessarily insisted upon the "Immemorial Rights" of the Lodge of Antiquity and its immunity from certain Grand Lodge Regulations.


As a result of the charges, Preston and nine members were expelled, whereupon, the Lodge withdrew from the Modern Grand Lodge and became the "Grand Lodge of England South of the River Trent" under the "Grand Lodge of All England at York."

The action of the Grand Lodge in expelling Preston and his supporters has been generally condemned as unnecessarily harsh and as being most unappreciative of his great services. Ten long years later, the breach was healed; he was restored to good standing, and resumed his labors. While doing research for this paper, I came across a 1976 Prestonian Lecture titled "Preston's England" which gives you an idea about some of the facets of life in London during his lifetime.

In the time of Preston, it was the privilege of "Gentlemen" masons to wear swords, but in practice, men of all classes, except perhaps the lowest, wore them. An unfortunate result of this habit was the prevalence of Duels, especially after a few drinks had made a gentleman's concern for his honor overrule his normal common sense. It is probably for this reason that swords were forbidden in most Modern Lodges while the Antients, drawn from the artisan or mechanic classes, had no need for this rule.

Popular spectator sports were: duck-hunting, badger-baiting and cockfighting. The latter was legal and got such a hold on Georgian Englishmen that much of the slang of the cock-pit has passed permanently into the language. "Pit against," "show a clean pair of heels", "cut out for," and "battle royal," when a number of cocks are pitted together, for example. The real fancy-man, if he could avoid the efforts of the local magistrate might attend and bet on a bare knuckled prize-fight; but he ran the risk of ending the day in a general free-for all between the supporters of the contestants and the Army. The most important of the public spectacles and one of the most popular because it was free, was the public execution. The crimes punishable by hanging increased throughout the century until they numbered some two hundred and included the most trivial offences. In London, in 1785, there were 97 hangings at Tyburn, all attended by large crowds who would pelt the prisoner with stones and rubbish. In comparison, the last public execution in the U.S. was in 1936, before a crowd of up to 20,000. A Time Magazine article about it stated that one of the reasons public executions were discontinued was due to the fact that the general public enjoyed them too much.

Preston continued with his Masonic teaching until his death in 1818. One of his bequests was an endowment of about \$1,500; the income from which was to be used to finance the delivery of an annual lecture to teach the Masonic



In closing, whenever you use a Florida Masonic Monitor or witness a Charge, Lecture, or Degree in the Symbolic Lodge; one way or the other, you are experiencing the Work of Preston, William Preston.

To the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida

The Committee on Jurisprudence for the Capitular year of 2017-2018, having carefully examined the report of Most Excellent Grand High Priest Ronald C. Newton, commend him for having executed his duties in the most professional manner becoming to the Office. We find all actions regarding rulings, dispensations and amendments to by-laws to be in accordance with the Constitution, Laws and Regulations of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida and within the prerogatives of his office.

This Committee examined 2 Resolutions, 38 Warrants, 4 Grand High Priest's Executive Orders, 5 Requests for Dispensation, and 12 Requests for By-Law Amendments. All Proclamations, Dispensations, By-Law amendments approved or disapproved, and Executive Orders were executed in a proper manner and within the prerogative of the Office of Grand High Priest.

There were two resolutions submitted, which would change or amend the Constitution, Laws and Regulations of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Florida. The Jurisprudence Committee has examined the Resolutions for conformity to Article XXI of the said Constitution. We found the Resolutions proposed, did not meet all of these requirements. One of the resolutions was not submitted within the required time and both resolutions failed to include an Effective Date as required by Article XXI of the Constitution. Since they both failed to qualify they will not be presented at this Session.

We commend the Grand Secretary and his Office Staff on their support and assistance of our endeavors to complete our work. We would recommend that the Grand Secretary collect the various Instruments and other actions of the Grand High Priest during his term of Office and forward the same by US Mail at least 15 days before the Grand Convocation, to the Chairman of the Jurisprudence Committee.

We commend the Grand High Priest for having faithfully performed his duties this Capitular year and applaud him on his many visitations. Each member of the Jurisprudence Committee expresses his personal gratitude for the privilege and honor of serving this Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons.


