Companions and Sir Knights,

Unless there 's some local prohibition, there's no law that says you can't meet more than once a month. Use that time for social activities, Some things that can be done include:

- A. FESTIVE BOARDS-- Traditional time of feasting, these Masonic events are common in most places in the world except the U.S., where the custom is slowly being revived. They include toasting, good meal, some short Masonic talks and fellowship.
- B. PAST PRESIDING OFFICERS' NIGHT- Whatever you call your past presiding officers, this night can honor those who have provided leadership over the years. It can also be a good way to bring out some of the older members who have become inactive over time.
- C. DEGREE NIGHTS- Even if you don't have any candidates, you still can have degree nights with a pro-temp candidate. This keeps the lessons of the degrees in front of your members, while keeping you ready for the days when you will have candidates. If you plan for candidates, you will get them.
- D. FAMILY'LADIES NIGHT- Be sure to include spouses and families in activities. Members, especially younger ones are looking for activities where they can involve the family.
- E.- AWARDS NIGHT- Honor those who have served. There are numerous awards that can be given out. Inquire of your Grand Body, and then utilize them. Present them in ways that bring honor to individuals that deserve to be recognized for outstanding service.
- F.- GOLF OUTINGS/PICNICS/CAMPOUTS- Summer and warm weather can offer opportunities for fellowship and fun. Use your imagination. Find out what kind of out-door activities your members enjoy, and build on them.
- G.- INSTALLATIONS ARE AN EVENT- The annual change of command should not be relegated to a regular meeting. If you can, open it to the public. Have at least the key officers wear tuxedos. Serve a dinner; make it an event to attend. Invite in visiting officers to install. Make it a special night.

#### EXCERPTS FROM THE GRAND CHAPTER OF FLORIDA

#### **Article III, Grand Officers and Members**

#### Section I, Grand Officers

- **a.** The Elected Officers of this Grand Chapter are: the Grand High Priest, whose title is "Most Excellent; the Grand King, the Grand Scribe, the Grand Treasurer, and the Grand Secretary. The title of each being "Right Excellent".
- **b.** The Appointed Officers of the Grand Chapter, appointed by the Most Excellent Grand High Priest are: the Grand Chaplain, the Grand Historian, the Grand Captain of the Host, the Grand Principal Sojourner, the Grand Royal Arch Captain, the three Masters of the Veils, and the Grand Sentinel whose titles are "Excellent".
- **c.** A District Deputy Grand High Priest from each Capitular District to be appointed by the Grand High Priest for one year, and whose title is "Right Excellent".
- d. The Honorary titles of Most Excellent and Right Excellent shall be retained for life.

#### Section II. Members by Right

The members of this Grand Chapter by inherent right are: all Past Grand High Priests, Past Grand Kings, Past Grand Scribes, Past Grand Treasurers and Past Grand Secretaries, and all past High Priest of constituent Chapters of this Grand jurisdiction who are members in good standing of constituent chapters under the jurisdiction of this Grand Chapter, and the High Priests, Kings, and Scribes of each Chartered Chapter working under the authority of this Grand Chapter (or their duly appointed proxies, who must be members of the Chapter which they represent).

Remember, equipment, train and send out the troops, and they will come back with results!
